Spiritual Tools:

- Identifying
- ✓ Discernment

Identify

Means to recognize, label, or acknowledge something that is visible, factual, or evident. It primarily operates through observation or awareness using your mind, experiences, and spiritual maturity to notice when something is off or needs to be change.

Discermment

To spiritually perceive, judge, or distinguish between what's of God and what's not.

Insight that comes from the Holy Spirit not human observation.

Discermment

Discernment is sensing what's beneath the surface... understanding motive, timing, and divine purpose.

Shifting 101

Shifters understand you can't shift a culture you do not comprehend! Spend quality time understanding culture is vital before changing ANYTHING

Five Things To Know About Culture:

- 1. Culture is learned
- 2. Culture is shared
- 3. Culture is symbolic
- 4. Culture is intergraded
- 5. Culture is dynamic



1. Culture is Learned

Culture is not inherited, it's learned.



Understanding

People are not born with beliefs, values or traditions.



We Are Taught Through:

- 1. Repetition
- 2. Reinforcement
- 3. Relationships



2. Culture is Shared

We share or pass down what we believe or, what has been given to those we come in contact with.



3. Culture is Symbolic

Culture is more than a method, it has meaning.



4. Culture is Intergraded

This means it has various components like beliefs, social norms, technology, and economics. All of these influence one another.



5. Culture is Dynamic

Cultures are not static but are constantly changing and adapting over time due to ongoing evolution.



Identifying Shifts Require:

- Context
- Conversion
- Conviction



1.Context

The background information or circumstance that surrounds an event.

Importance of Context

Context is extremely important because, without context, information is often misinterpreted, leading to poor communication and decisions.

Context is the link between the sender and receiver, bridging gaps and ensuring the messages are being conveyed properly.

2. Conversion

The exchanging of information or views.

3. Conviction

A strong firm belief that is held with certainty.
