“MOBILIZATION”



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Mobilize

Means to assemble, prepare, and organize resources (such as people, funds, or equipment) for a specific purpose or action.

The Necessity

Mobilization is the key to everything. Without mobilization everything will grind to a halt.

Mobilization

Is the engine that unleashes the
combustion of movement.

Discipology

Is a Christian framework and ministry approach defined as the "art and science of making disciples"

Teaching

Before Jesus built a ministry, He built a team.

Before He performed miracles publicly, He developed people privately.

Kingdom growth always begins with mobilization.

Principle

God never calls people merely to occupy space. He calls them to fulfill purpose.

Ask Yourself:

- Have I answered God's call?
- Am I available?
- Am I teachable?

Priority

- It wasn't healing.
- It wasn't miracles.
- It was relationship.
- Before ministry comes intimacy.

Principle

You cannot become like
someone you never spend
time with!

The Purpose of Discipleship

- Jesus developed disciples before deploying disciples.
- He invested three years into twelve men.

Why?

- Character before charisma.
- Integrity before influence.
- Development before deployment.

Understanding Mobilization

- The intentional process of preparing people for Kingdom assignment.
- Mobilization is more than recruiting.
- Mobilization develops capacity.
- Mobilization creates ownership.
- Mobilization releases purpose.

Why Churches Fail to Mobilize:

Many churches have:

- Crowds
- Congregations
- Consumers

But very few disciples.

A healthy church doesn't simply attract people,
it develops people.

The Three Rhythms

1. Time
2. Teaching
3. Tactics

Three Stage Framework

1. Time: Forming Disciples

(Year1) Development

2. Teaching: Training Disciples

(Year2) Demonstration

3. Tactics: Sending Disciples

(Year 3) Deployment



Year 1

- Development
- Identity
- Character
- Relationship

Year 2

- Demonstration
 - Watching Jesus
 - Learning ministry
 - Serving alongside Him
- "Learn from Me."

Year 3

- Deployment
- Preach
- Heal
- Lead
- Multiply

"Go for Me."

Time

- Relationships create trust.
- Trust creates influence.
- Influence creates transformation.

Teaching

- Teaching changes minds.
- Truth transforms lives.
- Healthy doctrine produces healthy disciples.

Tactics

People must know:

- What to do.
- How to do it.
- Why they do it.

Disciple

Is a devoted follower, student, or learner who not only embraces the teachings of a master or leader but actively adopts and spreads those principles.

Key Characteristics

- **Active Learning:** Unlike a passive fan, a disciple is committed to a lifelong process of study, personal transformation, and practical application.
- **Imitation:** Disciples pattern their lives, behaviors, and values after their teacher.
- **Advocacy:** They help to preserve and disseminate the doctrine or philosophy of their rights.

Characteristics of Discipleship

- Learns
- Lives
- Loves
- Leads
- Multiplies

The Difference Between Members and Disciples

- A member attends.
- A disciple follows.
- A member consumes.
- A disciple contributes.
- A member receives.
- A disciple reproduces.

Multiplication

- Healthy disciples produce disciples.
- Healthy leaders develop leaders.
- Healthy churches multiply churches.
- Mobilization always precedes multiplication.
