What is Culture?

Is the way of life of a people. It's the set of beliefs, shared values, behaviors, traditions and systems that shape how people live and interact.

Culture

- Values What people believe is important (family, freedom, faith, wealth).
- Beliefs The convictions people hold about life, God, morality, and truth.
- Norms The "unwritten rules" (how people dress, greet one another, or behave in public).
- Symbols & Language Words, music, art, fashion, and gestures that carry meaning.





Culture

Is the invisible atmosphere around us: we may not always notice it, but it influences everything.



Culture Culture is a living ecosystem.




Ecosystem

is a community of living things (like plants and animals) and non-living things (like air, water, and soil) in a specific area that interact and depend on each other to form a complex system



Culture is Everywhere

Your church has a faith culture, your leadership team shapes organizational culture, your neighborhood adds community culture, and pop culture provides a backdrop that influences everyone.





Understanding Culture

Before you challenge or change culture you must first understand the culture you are trying to challenge or change.



Understanding Culture Is essential because it helps us know the environment we're living, leading, and ministering in.

Personal Culture

Your own habit, upbringing, and mindset.



Family Culture Traditions and values in your household.



Church Culture

The spiritual DNA that makes your ministry unique.



Community/National Culture The larger environment you live in.



Kingdom Culture

The standard of Heaven that supersedes them all.



Ministry of Jesus

When we look at the ministry of Jesus, He didn't come to fit into culture, He came to shift it and set a Kingdom here and now.



Jesus

The ministry of Jesus shifted culture everywhere He went. He didn't just preach His life miracles and teachings completely changed the way people related to God, to one another, and to society.

Jesus's approach to Culture:

Jesus didn't come to adapt to culture; He came to transform culture.

Challenging Tradition(s)

Change/Transform

Jesus didn't just change the water into wine, but He transformed the water into wine!



Change

- A shift in behavior, appearance, or condition
- •External, temporary, or surfacelevel



Transform

"Metamorphoo"

- Like a caterpillar becoming a butterfly
- A complete, deep, inside out renewal.
- It starts in the heart and mind.



Tradition

Is the passing down beliefs, customs, values. Or practices from one generation to the next.



Tradition

- ✓ Tradition=Frozen Success
- ✓ Tradition is the foundation not the ceiling
