YOUTH MARKET LIVESTOCK RULES

See Beef Breeding and Goat Show sections for additional eligibility & requirements for the “Open Show”

1. ELIGIBILITY:

All exhibitors must meet the following requirements as defined by the Board of Trustees:

The Exhibitor is required to belong to a 4H club or FFA club in St. Lucie County.

- a. Exhibitor must be a current member of St Lucie County 4-H, Westwood FFA, or Allapattah Flats FFA youth organizations. Exhibitors not in 4-H or FFA may participate in Beef Breeding or Goat Exhibits through the SLC Fair as long as they reside in St. Lucie County.
- b. Beef Breeding and Goat exhibitors must register online.
- c. Exhibitor must be present on Show Night to exhibit their market animal in the show arena to qualify to sell the market animal at the St. Lucie County Fair Market Animal Sale. In the event of a medical emergency, considerations may be made by the Livestock Committee and SLC Fair Association.
-  d. *Every exhibitor is required to submit a fully completed and current record book. All record books will be judged. Please visit www.StLucieCountyFair.org, to download & print a copy. Awards only given based on scoring of judged record books.
- e. In the event an Exhibitor's Market animal expires prior to or during the fair, he/she may still participate in Record Book, Herdsman and Farm Bureau Awards Competition ONLY. Exhibitors are not permitted to participate in any competitions if they do not complete their expired Market Animal Project's Record Book.
- f. Physical conditions of exhibitors which the Fair Board and Livestock Committee consider to be jeopardizing to the welfare of the exhibitor or exhibit may result in ineligibility.
- g. Each exhibitor may enter only one market animal. Market Animals must be the property of the exhibitor 7 days prior to initial weigh-in.
- h. Upon immediate notification to the Livestock Desk, if an animal dies within 14 days of initial weigh-in, Exhibitor has seven days from the date of loss to replace animal.
- i. Market animal exhibitors are only permitted to show the animal registered to the exhibitor for Showmanship & Grooming.

2. All youth market livestock entries are required to be registered online. To sign up for individual projects please go to www.StLucieCountyFair.org and click the “participate” tab then, Livestock Exhibitor Page, then “Online Entries Click Here”.

3. All youth market livestock exhibitors must fill out a correct W9 form with their online entries. This form MUST have the exhibitors LEGAL name, SS#, address, and signature (parents may sign for minors). All information collected will be through a secured system

4. One parent or guardian or advisor must be with the exhibitor at all initial and mandatory weigh-ins and upon entry to the Fair unless prior arrangements are made with Livestock Committee.

 5. *At the discretion of livestock, if an exhibitor is injured prior to or during the fair, the fair will require a medical release form from the exhibitor's doctor stating they are released to handle their own animal for show or sale.

6. *If any exhibitor requires special accommodations due to American Disabilities Act please contact one of the livestock chairpersons. Accommodation must be made ahead of time.

7. Vaccinations and Medications:

- a. Routine Veterinarian service shall be performed at owner's expense on and off the fairgrounds.
- b. Due to liability, The Livestock Committee will not be giving any vaccinations, however, the Committee does recommend animals to be vaccinated according to State Rules & Regulations.

- c. Tampering with any animals such as filling with foreign substances, etc. is prohibited. The use of tranquilizers on show animals or the possession of the same after arrival to the Fair will be construed as a form of tampering. The use of anabolic steroids is prohibited, and exhibit may be tested at any time. Tampering will result in the immediate disqualification of the animal. No chemicals are to be administered within 30 days of show dates unless administered by a veterinarian and accompanied by a letter from him/her.
 - d. Use of drugs not in compliance with manufacturer's label as to dosage, withdrawal times, other manufacturer's limitations and show regulations is prohibited. Animals are subject to examination at any time. Violators will be disqualified, removed and will forfeit all premiums and awards, including sale of the animal.
 - e. The Livestock Committee shall have the authority to request the Fair Veterinarian to draw blood from any animal tagged and entered the fair.
8. Market steer and swine projects: Champion, reserve, quad-county champion, reserve, and first in class winners. Drug testing will be done at the discretion of the livestock committee.
9. Market steers and swine are required by the state to have official identification. This should typically be placed in the animal before purchase and sale.
10. Each exhibitor will handle his/her livestock to protect him/her as well as protect the property of the Fair. The Fair will not be responsible for damages by wild and unruly animals. The Livestock Committee has the right to handle all animals anytime on the fair premises. Any animal that cannot be handled by the exhibitor will NOT be shown.
11. Exhibitors may have help off-loading steer or swine from the trailer at final weigh-in, once off the trailer the exhibitor will need to lead animal into the scale, tie and lead back to the trailer. Exhibitor will be required to handle their own animal walking to the stall/pen, get them tied and set up in the barn. Steer exhibitors will be required to walk animals from stall to the chute for routine ultrasound. Final check-in process will be complete after completion of the ultrasound.
12. Leaders will also be responsible for having buyer's information printed and posted on exhibitor's signs 1 day after the sale by the end of the day. *Following each sale, leaders will be given a copy of the sale invoice. Any changes made later in the week by the buyer as the fair office will be sent to the leader.
13. Exhibitors, their parents, family, friends, and anyone who accompanies them on the fairgrounds in support of the exhibitor, will always show good sportsmanship and courtesy to everyone. Including officials, judges, graders, veterinarians, building superintendents, Livestock Committee Members, and Fair management. Misconduct or unacceptable behaviors, by anyone mentioned within rule #4, prior, during or after the Fair may be grounds for removal of the exhibitor plus the exhibit from the Fair and/or suspension from future shows. This applies to all posts on any social media.
14. COACHING WILL NOT BE PERMITTED BY ANYONE FROM THE STANDS, RAILS, AISLES, OR ANYWHERE IN THE SHOW ARENA. 1st Warning will be verbal and 2nd violation will result in removal from arena for the duration of the fair.
15. For the sake of neatness and appearance, only signs approved by the Livestock Committee will be permitted in the exhibit barn. No club or individual sponsorship signs are allowed on Fair premises. Leaders will be responsible for exhibitors complying with the sign regulations approved in their barn

area.



16. All stalls and pens must be clear of unsightly debris and the premises cleaned up one half hour before opening each day and maintained in an attractive manner from opening until 9:00 p.m. each night. *Only trash is to be put in the trash cans. All shavings, sand, and manure will be disposed of in the dumpster behind each barn or as directed by the barn chairpersons.
17. All barns must be supervised according to Fair management requirements. All exhibitors are required to be with their exhibits during Fair hours, according to barn assignments. Each exhibitor with animals must keep an extra supply of feed in designated areas. Horse play will not be tolerated.
18. No animal will be allowed to leave before being approved by the Livestock Coordinator. Any exhibitor doing so will forfeit all premium money, awards of any kind, and ability to show at any future fairs.
19. The buyer(s) plaques must be delivered to each buyer by April 30, 2027. Proof of delivery must be shown prior to receiving the sale money. Failure to deliver buyer(s) plaque and/or proof of forged buyer signature are grounds for exclusion from future shows. (Buyer's plaque form page 50).
20. Buyers plaque form must be delivered the day of scheduled check pick up at fairgrounds.
21. FFA Advisors must deliver buyers plaque form to receive sale check.
22. All monies, whether sale, premium or add-ons will be released to the Exhibitor ONLY, NO EXCEPTIONS. The Exhibitor's signature will be required along with his/her Exhibitors pass or a form of Identification, verification of last 4 of exhibitors Social Security Number, and proof of delivery of buyer(s) plaque (Buyer(s) plaque form page 50).
23. *All checks must be deposited by the specified date given with checks. \$100 fee for each reissuance.
24. No award will be presented, or premiums paid for any animal in any class that, in the opinion of the judges, does not deserve the award. **ALL premiums & checks must be picked up by May 21, 2027. All unclaimed premiums will be forfeit.**
25. Age determination for Market Junior and Senior Show Awards shall be based on age as of **September 1st** of current Fair year. Awards shall be divided into these classes:
 - **Senior II**, ages 17-18, **Senior I**, ages 14-16 **Junior II** ages 10-13, **Junior I**, ages 8-10, (Beef & Swine Barn)
26. *All market animals entered in the Fair will be consigned to sale and slaughter by the contracted slaughterhouse. An assessment of 8% of the sale price of each animal shall be made to help defray the expense of the livestock shows.
27. No writing on Market Animals at any time. Tampering or defacing any animal at the St. Lucie County Fair will result in immediate expulsion from the fairgrounds and exhibitor will be fined *\$500 and will not be permitted to show the following year.
28. The Fair scales are to be used only in accordance with policy and **OPEN SCALE schedule** as established by the Livestock Committee. Please see "Open Scales" page for schedule & rules.
29. Neither the local interest in participating in the sponsorship of the show nor any of the personnel shall be responsible for any accidents or errors that might occur. However, every effort will be made to



provide for the safety and comfort of the guests and their animals.

30. Except as otherwise permitted by law, no dogs are allowed unless scheduled for a demonstration or competition. This also pertains to workshops, or group functions on the fairgrounds.

31. Golf carts, UTV's, and other motorized vehicles are prohibited unless properly permitted by Fair management. All vehicles must be registered at the fair office and rule sheet signed and sticker obtained. All offroad vehicles MUST have fair approval. Any unauthorized offroad vehicles will be asked to leave.

32. **No alcoholic beverages, mind-altering drugs or unlawful weapons of any kind are permitted on the premises. SMOKING IS NOT PERMITTED IN ANY BARN!**

33. Protests must be done in writing. See pages (45-46)

34.  ***Fines:** Any non-compliance of any rules may result in fines first offence \$50 second offense \$100 Third offence \$200. No warnings will be issued and must be paid prior to the exhibitors' next scheduled event (show, showmanship, or sale). Exhibitor will not be eligible to show in their next scheduled show or sale until fine is paid in full. (page 44)

35. Check with Barn Chairs for any barn rules that may apply to individual barns.

36.  ***Intent to House form** is mandatory for all market animal exhibitors to fill out. This is if the animal is housed on the exhibitors property or if it is housed on a property that is not the exhibitors. 24 hour advanced warning. (page 53-62).

37. Each Live Animal Exhibitor must have a valid Code of Ethics Certificate.

38. Graduating senior speeches: Must be typed on provided form (page 51). Follow directions on page.

39. 4H or FFA may not lend a spot to any other club unless approved by the Livestock Committee.

40. The fair issued exhibitor number must be visibly displayed on the back of the exhibitor, either pinned to the exhibitor's shirt or in a placed in a number harness.

DRESS CODE

The following code will be enforced during fair related activities unless noted otherwise:

1. Vulgar, illegal (including weapons, alcohol, drugs, and tobacco) and/or sexually oriented statements or suggestions on clothing, jewelry, buttons, or accessories are not permitted. Any dress or statement, which may cause a hostile, intimidating, degrading, offensive, harassing, or discriminatory environment, is prohibited.
2. Shorts and skirts will have hems and will be no shorter than the middle of the thigh. Shirts and tops will be no lower than the collarbone, must have sleeves, and must be long enough to be tucked in. Low cut tops, see-through clothing, tank tops, spaghetti straps, and shorts and skirts shorter than the middle of the thigh are examples of styles that are considered unacceptable for exhibitors.
3. See-through clothing is not permitted. Clothing that is ripped, torn, or has holes in it is not permitted. All undergarments are to be covered.
4. Oversized clothing, which compromises the safety of exhibitors, is not permitted.
5. Exhibitors must wear close toed shoes, no sandals, flip flops, “Crocs” or open heeled shoes permitted when in the livestock area which includes all barns, scales, and arenas. Beef breeding and Steer exhibitors MUST wear boots in the show arena and NO “Crocs”.
6. Please refrain from long flowing clothing in the show ring as it interferes with the Judge’s view.
7. Failure to comply with dress code will result in the exhibitor being asked to change.
8. Remember to wear your exhibitor number on your back when going to show arena.
9.  *If any exhibitor requires special accommodations for dress code please contact one of the livestock chairpersons. Accommodation must be made ahead of time.

LIVESTOCK PARKING RULES

Livestock Parking Passes:

1. THE LIVESTOCK PARKING AREA IS A PRIVILEGE! DO NOT ABUSE IT!
2. Livestock Parking Passes are for the use of the back parking lot area located on the **SOUTH END of the “CLUB CAMPERS/RV UNITS ONLY”!!!**
3. NO parking is permitted in areas around the barns, North of Club trailers, or around the scales at any time, except for designated Livestock Committee Members.
4. A Reserved Parking space for Club Leaders ONLY, is available on the **South side** of their club's trailer.
5. NO parking on edge of roadway or in the roadway just on the north side of a Club Camper/RV at any time.
6. No Parking in Buyers parking lot on the days of the Swine and Steer Sales.
(The 1st Sunday of the Fair & Wednesday) This is the small parking lot on the west side of Swine/Goat Barn.
7. No parking in swales, ditches, or roadways at anytime.
8. Vehicles that do not comply with parking rules will be towed at the owner's expense and Livestock Parking Passes will be revoked.
9. Please make sure if you park in a handicapped space, you have the proper tag or you will be towed at your expense.

Club Campers/RV's:

1. ONLY Registered MARKET ANIMAL 4-H Clubs, FFA, Fair Queen Committee, & Livestock Committee are permitted to have a camper/RV in the Livestock Parking area. Anyone NOT registered with said organizations, is NOT permitted to have a Camper/RV in the Livestock area/Parking lot.
2. Club Campers/RV's may begin to be brought to the Fair for setup on Friday, exactly one week prior to opening day of the fair, after 9am.
3. Club camper/RV sites are on a first come, first serve basis. Call the livestock desk or email Livestock@stluciecountyfair.org
4. Clubs may have **ONE** camper/RV site and 1 small storage trailer that is to be parked **directly** behind their camper/RV. **NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.** Spaces will be marked. Please do not infringe on any other spot.
5. Tents rented through the Fair Office must be made no later than **NOVEMBER 29th**. Email Livestock@stluciecountyfair.org to reserve.
6. Any outside tent rentals must provide a COI (Certificate of Liability Insurance).
7. Overnight camping is NOT permitted.
8. Exhibitors, Exhibitors Family/Friends are not permitted to keep Livestock trailers/storage trailers in Livestock Parking area at any time during the week of the Fair.
9. All campsites **MUST** be removed by no later than Tuesday, *(2 days following the end of the fair.)* Campers/RV's will be towed on Wednesday, 3 days after the Fair has ended.

 - (5) Authorized Representative. An employee of the state or federal government, or a licensed veterinarian accredited by the USDA, who is authorized to conduct animal disease control and eradication activities.
 - (6) Certified brucellosis-free state or area. As defined in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.
 - (7) Certified brucellosis-free herd. As defined in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.
 - (8) Classified brucellosis-Class A state or area. As defined in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.
 - (9) Department. As defined in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.
 - (10) Electronic Official Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (ECVI). An electronic certificate provided by USDA Veterinary Services Process Streamlining System or a third-party vendor approved by the United States Animal Health Association (USAHA) ECVI Data Standards Subcommittee and issued by licensed and accredited veterinarians in animal's state of origin.
 - (11) Exhibition. Any fair allowing the displaying or presenting livestock, including poultry, to the general public for an animal exhibit or animal show.
 - (12) Fair(s). Annual public fair as defined in F.S. 616.001, that exhibits domestic animals.
 - (13) Group. One or more Animals maintained on the same premises or in contact with one another.
 - (14) Isolation. Separation of individual Animals by a physical barrier in a manner that assures one Animal does not have access to the body, excrement, or discharges of another Animal; does not share a building with a common ventilation system; and is not within ten feet of another Animal.
 - (15) Market class. An exhibition class consisting of finished fed animals.
 - (16) Official certificate of veterinary inspection (OCVI). As defined in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.
 - (17) Official individual identification. As defined in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.
 - (18) Official test. A test conducted by a licensed and accredited veterinarian with method approved by Department rules for the specific disease and animal species.
 - (19) Owner. The owner of the animal or herd or the owner's authorized agent.
 - (20) Pseudorabies. A contagious, infectious herpesvirus, causing communicable disease of livestock and other animals also known as Aujeszky's disease or mad itch.

 - (22) Swine brucellosis. An infectious bacterial disease caused by *Brucella suis* (B. suis) biovars 1 or 3, most frequently affecting swine but able to cause disease in other animals and humans.
 - (23) Terminal swine show. An exhibition market class consisting of swine that are isolated and housed separately from all other animals and designated for slaughter only channels.

- (1) OCVI Required. Animals presented for exhibition purposes in Florida, unless specifically exempted, must be accompanied by an OCVI.
- (a) The OCVI must be complete including the breed, sex, and registration number and, if applicable, the official individual identification of each animal.
- (b) Results of a specific test requirement or herd accreditation, certification or validation number for each animal must be recorded on the OCVI with the date of the test or herd accreditation, certification or validation.
- (2) Expiration of Required OCVI.
- (a) For Florida-origin animals, an OCVI is valid for 90 days from the date of issue; or until the expiration date of any required tests, whichever is the earliest date.
- (b) For animals imported into Florida for exhibition purposes only, the OCVI is valid for 30 days.
- (3) Inspection. Prior to immediate acceptance at an exhibition, all animals presented for exhibition must be made available for inspection by an authorized representative for:
- (a) The required Official Individual Identification of the Animal; and
- (b) Clinical signs of disease including, but not limited to: caseous lymphadenitis, blisters/ulcers around the mouth, nostrils, coronary band, pinkeye, pox, scabies, lice, ringworm, atrophic rhinitis, or multiple warts that are clearly visible; and
- (c) Evidence of compliance with Animal tests and OCVI requirements, where required.
- (4) Animals Rejected for Exhibition.
- (a) Any Animal in noncompliance with Animal tests and OCVI requirements, or
- (b) Any Animal not meeting the Official Individual Identification requirements, or
- (c) Any animal which is suspected of having or showing clinical signs of dangerous transmissible, contagious or infectious disease on visual inspection, or any animal which is known to be exposed to such diseases must be:
1. Immediately withdrawn from exhibition and returned to the place of origin, or
 2. Examined at the owner's expense, by a Florida-licensed accredited veterinarian who certifies by a signed, written statement, that the animal is free of dangerous transmissible, contagious or infectious diseases and pests. The accredited veterinarian's examination must take place within 24 hours of the initial inspection by the authorized representative.

- (1) OCVI Required.
- (a) Florida-origin cattle or bison moved for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to exhibition.
- (b) Cattle or bison imported from other states for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 30 days prior to exhibition.
- (2) Official Identification Required. All cattle or bison entered for exhibition purposes, including market class animals, must have an official

individual identification. If the breed registry and brand or tattoo are used to complete the identification requirements, then the breed registry number and brand or tattoo must be listed on the OCVI accompanying the animal to exhibition.

(3) Testing Requirements.

(a) Tuberculosis.

1. Florida-origin cattle or bison may be entered for exhibition without a tuberculin test.
2. Dairy Cattle. Dairy cattle imported into Florida, may be entered for exhibition provided they have:
 - a. a negative caudal fold tuberculin skin test within 60 days prior to the date of the exhibition, or;
 - b. originate from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd in an accredited tuberculosis-free state or zone.
3. Beef Cattle. Beef cattle or bison imported into Florida may be entered for exhibition provided they have:
 - a. a negative caudal fold tuberculin skin test within 60 days prior to the date of the exhibition or;
 - b. originate from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd or state.

(b) Brucellosis.

1. Test Required. Cattle or bison, six (6) months of age or older, must have evidence of a negative brucellosis test within 30 days prior to the date of exhibition.
2. Exemption from Required Brucellosis Test.
 - a. Steers and spayed heifers; and
 - b. Cattle or bison originating from,
 - (I) a certified brucellosis-free herd. The OCVI must show the certified herd number and the date of the last herd certification test, or;
 - (II) a classified brucellosis-free state or area, or;
 - (III) Cattle or bison from non-quarantined herds originating from a classified brucellosis-Class A state or area provided that the cattle are under 18 months of age.

5C-4.003 Swine.

(1) OCVI Required.

- (a) Florida origin swine must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation for exhibition.
- (b) Swine imported for exhibition must comply with the importation requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.007, F.A.C. An OCVI is required for exhibition and must be dated within 30 days of entry.
- (2) Identification. All swine, entered for exhibition purposes, including market class swine in a terminal swine show, must have official individual identification.

(3) Tests or Certification Required for Swine.

(a) Swine Brucellosis.

1. Florida origin swine six (6) months of age or older must test negative on an official test for swine brucellosis within 90 days prior to exhibition, or;
2. Originate from a validated brucellosis-free herd, or;
3. Originate from a commercial production swine herd as defined in subsection 5C-21.002(11), F.A.C.

(b) Pseudorabies. Florida origin swine six (6) months of age or older must test negative on an official test for pseudorabies within 90 days prior to exhibition, or;

1. Originate from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd as defined in 9 CFR §85.1 (JAN 2024), which is incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-17888>, or ;
2. Originate from an approved commercial production swine herd as defined in Rule 5C-21.002, F.A.C.

(4) Exemptions.

(a) Market class swine for exhibition in a terminal swine show are exempt from the OCVI and testing requirements provided all animals in the terminal swine show are transported directly to a recognized slaughter establishment or approved livestock facility in designated slaughter channels, within 7 days of the show date. At the end of the terminal swine show, the swine owner(s) must ensure:

1. Swine are transported directly from the terminal swine show to the possession of a recognized slaughter establishment, within 7 days of the end of the show, or;
2. Swine are transported directly from the terminal swine show to the possession of an approved livestock facility in designated slaughter only channels, within 7 days of the show.

(b) Owners must maintain swine show records for a period of two (2) years. The records must include:

1. Official individual identification of each animal, and;
2. Individual or business name and contact phone number of the entity transporting the swine from the terminal swine show to the recognized slaughter or approved livestock facility, and;
3. The name, physical address and delivery date to the recognized slaughtering establishment, or approved livestock facility where the swine were

delivered.

(c) All swine referenced in subsection 5C-4.003(4)(a), F.A.C., must be held in isolation and only commingled with other swine in slaughter channels until slaughtered.

5C-4.004 Poultry, Domestic Fowl or Ratites.

(1) OCVI Requirements.

(a) An OCVI is required for poultry, domestic fowl or ratites imported into Florida as specified per Rule 5C-3.012, F.A.C. An OCVI for entry into exhibition is required and must be dated within 30 days of entry or the animals must be inspected as provided in subsection 5C-4.0017(3), F.A.C.

(b) Florida origin poultry, domestic fowl or ratites presented for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated within 90 days prior to exhibition or must be inspected as provided in subsection 5C-4.0017(3), F.A.C.

(2) Test or Certification Required. All poultry or domestic fowl entered for exhibition must originate from Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks or hatcheries, as provided in 9 CFR §145 (Jan. 2018) and §147 (Jan. 2018), or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. 9 CFR §145 (Jan. 2018) and §147 (JAN 2018) are hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10045>.

5C-4.005 Goats or Sheep.

(1) OCVI Required.

(a) Florida-origin goats or sheep presented for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to exhibition, except lamb or kids less than three months of age and accompanied by their dam.

(b) Goats or sheep imported into Florida for exhibition must requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.005, F.A.C. An OCVI is required for entry into and Exhibition and must be dated within 30 days prior to entry.

(2) Identification. All goats or sheep entered for exhibition purposes must have official individual identification, except lambs or kids under three months of age accompanied by their dam that has official individual identification.

(3) Tests or Certification Required.

(a) All dairy goats imported into the state for exhibition purposes for no more than 30 days are exempted from the import testing requirements in subsection 5C-3.005(4), F.A.C., provided:

1. The animals originate from:

a. Accredited tuberculosis-free states or herds, and

b. Certified brucellosis-free herds or classified brucellosis-Class A states or areas.

2. The animals return to the state of origin within 30 days of entry into Florida, and

3. The animals' milk is not used for human or pet consumption in Florida.

(b) Dairy goats that remain in Florida for more than 30 days must meet the brucellosis and tuberculosis import testing requirements in the subsection 5C-3.005(4), F.A.C.

(c) There are no tuberculosis or brucellosis test requirements for meat type goats, pygmy goats, or Florida-origin dairy goats.

(2) Test or Certification Required. All Equine presented for exhibition must be accompanied by evidence of a negative official test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA), conducted within 12 months prior to exhibition. The negative EIA test must be reported on:

(a) Equine Infectious Anemia Laboratory Test, VS Form 10-11 (2020), as incorporated in subsection 5C-18.001(10), F.A.C.

(b) Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09160 Rev. 08/18, as incorporated in subsection 5C-4.0016(3), F.A.C.

(c) EIA reporting form approved by the USDA and another state's animal health official, including electronic EIA laboratory test. An electronic EIA laboratory test may be presented on an electronic device if:

1. The electronic reporting form is in the original format and has not been altered, and
2. Is of size and image quality to provide a clear, legible document; and
3. The device properly displays all document information.

(3) Exemption to Test Requirement. A foal under six (6) months of age is not required to have a negative EIA test if it is accompanied by its dam which has met the EIA test requirement.

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS & EXPOSITIONS) CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall always deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada. The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1) All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2) Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3) Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4) Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or person responsible for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations, and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such

substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5) Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6) The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7) **Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.**

8) No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9) The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10) The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expos* and any special notices to members.

11) The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

2. Each Exhibitor may enter only one market animal. Market animals must be the property of the Exhibitor 7 days prior to initial weigh-in.
3. Upon immediate notification to the Livestock Desk, if an animal dies within 14 days of initial weigh-in, exhibitor has seven days from date of loss to replace animal. *Market animal exhibitors are only permitted to show the animal registered to the exhibitor for showmanship/grooming.
3. The Exhibitor and a parent/guardian or advisor must sign in with the Livestock Desk at initial weigh-in, on the final weigh-in, and upon entry to the fair. Exceptions may be considered by the Livestock Committee if necessary.
4. Initial weigh-in is on Saturday, **September 12, 2026 from 7-9am**. Weigh-in will take place on the certified scales at the fairgrounds. *All steers will be ear tagged and DNA will be collected on each market steer via the tissue sampling unit. Tags will be provided by the Livestock Committee and will be placed in the steer's ear at the initial weigh-in. Removal of SLC fair ear tags will result in disqualification.

8. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1000 lbs. at final weigh-in on Sunday, February 28, 2027 to show/sell AND have gained a minimum of 1.75 lbs. per day from initial weigh-in date. Steers must be 24 months old or younger to show.

9. Steers must have milk teeth. *Milk teeth may be checked upon entry to the fair at the discretion of the livestock committee.



****Standard for checking milk teeth****

In accordance with the 24 month old rule: Erupting central incisors are acceptable (18-24 months), any missing first lateral incisors (erupt 24-30 months) will at minimum trigger a teaching moment for that parent and exhibitor, because that steer is probably a minimum of 23-24 months of age and just on the cusp of being disqualified. If there are 2nd or 3rd lateral incisors missing then that steer will be disqualified.

10. All show boxes and equipment shall be kept clear of all walkways and shall be located as directed by the barn chairperson. Show boxes shall be limited in size to a maximum of 30" depth by 48" length. Show boxes larger than stated size will be addressed on an individual basis as room in the barn allows. Each exhibitor may enter no more than one steer and may have one of the following, one show box, or one stand up grooming box and *one grooming chute. Additional fans may be used at the discretion of the Livestock Committee if room allows. Individual generators may be used but will need to be kept on the East or South sides of the barn outside while running. No running generators will be allowed on the West side of the barn between the steer barn and show arena.
11. Balloons are prohibited in the steer barn.
12. Each exhibitor must be able to handle their steer by themselves safely in the ring or the animal will be disqualified. This will be enforced by the Livestock Committee. Exhibitor may have help off-loading steer from the trailer at final weigh-in, once off the trailer the exhibitor will need to lead animal into the scale, tie and lead back to the trailer. *Steer exhibitors will be required to walk animals from the trailer to the chute for routine ultrasound. Exhibitor will be required to handle their own animal walking to the stall, get them tied and set up in the barn. Final check-in process will be complete after completion of the ultrasound.
13. All exhibitors must attend a mandatory workday with their clubs. If they do not attend the workday, they must attend the one Livestock Committee schedules.
14. Each steer must be tied securely during the fair with a halter, lead, and neck rope.
15. At any time prior to fair opening, parents or designated people may feed and clean the bedding area of the exhibits. Whoever has been designated to feed the animal MUST sign the feed sheet in the

barn for both AM & PM to avoid a fine being assessed to the exhibitor. *It is the exhibitor's responsibility to always have the area clean including; stall area, walkway between steers and chutes, wash racks, and chutes with all feed and grooming supplies. There will only be 1 warning given on the cleanliness of your animal and area, fines will apply if a second warning is necessary.

16. From date of entry to the Fair until the end of the last scheduled show, parents & non-exhibitors are prohibited from assisting exhibitors with any of the following:

- Washing
- Blowing
- Grooming of any sort

THE ONLY EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE WOULD BE IN THE EVENT OF THE EXHIBIT/EXHIBITORS WELL BEING IS IN JEOPARDY. HOWEVER, THE LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE SHALL BE NOTIFIED FIRST.

17. Steers shall be dehorned. Scurs shall be filed smooth. Animals with regrowth of a length deemed unsafe by show management shall be rejected.
18. The Livestock Committee reserves the right for a weigh-back of 5% with any positive or negative weight change from the final weigh-in weight on market steers leading to disqualification. The second weight must be within 5% of the first weight.
19. **Force filling steers with any substance, water included, is prohibited. This includes the use of pumps, drenches, tubes, hoses, etc. All steers must be shown in their natural conformation and structure without alteration by modification except for the grooming and treatment of the hair and trimming of the hooves. No graphite, hair, cotton twine, etc. may be applied.**
20. Use of drugs not in compliance with manufacturer's label as to dosage, withdrawal times, other manufacturer's limitations and show regulations is prohibited. Animals are subject to examination at any time. Violators will be disqualified, removed and will forfeit all premiums and awards, including sale of the animal. Market steer projects: Champion, reserve, quad-county champion, reserve, and first in class winners. Drug testing may be done at the discretion of the Livestock Committee.
21. *Steer barn meeting will be held in the back of the barn with exhibitors and a parent following entry of all steers in the barn.
22. *Every exhibitor is required to submit a fully completed and current record book. All record books will be judged Complete record books are due on Sunday, **February 28, 2027**, to the barn secretary no later than 11:00 am.
23. No stock trailers left parked at the fairgrounds. After exhibitor barn meeting and record books are turned in, all trailers need to be taken home before the fair opens for the day.
24. **NEW** *All exhibitors will be given a back tag number to be worn during ALL show and sale nights. Only 1 back tag will be given, please keep for all show nights. Can be pinned on the back of the exhibitor's shirt or exhibitors can wear a number harness.
25. At the discretion of livestock, if an exhibitor is injured prior to or during the fair, the fair will require a

medical release form from the exhibitor's doctor stating they are released to handle their own animal for show or sale.

 - b. Cow/calf requires two registered exhibitors. Each handler is required to register as an exhibitor with the animal they are handling for the cow/calf pair. No Entry Fee for handler.
 - c. Each exhibitor is only allowed two beef breeding exhibits. Exhibits must be in separate weight classes. If exhibitor was to be 1st in class with both exhibits, only another registered exhibitor can handle one animal for final drive. Registration will be first come first served until slots are filled.
 - d. Each exhibitor must be able to handle their animal by themselves in the ring or the animal will be at risk of disqualification. This will be enforced by the Livestock Committee. Exhibitors may have help off-loading animal from the trailer at weigh-in, once off the trailer the exhibitor will need to lead animal into the scale, tie, and lead them back to the trailer. Exhibitor will be required to handle their own animal walking to the stall, get them tied, and set up in the barn. 23. Beef Breeding exhibits: heifers, cows, & bulls may be shown **up to 36 months old as of December 30, 2026**. All Beef Breeding Animals will be placed in appropriate classes for show. The main breakdown for exhibit classes is as follows:
 - **All Heifer, Cow, & Bull** exhibits will be classed by weight
 - **ALL CLASSES WILL BE COMPUTER GENERATED** by ShoWorks and the Livestock Committee.
24. All bulls must have a nose ring or tong during the show or anytime the animal is not tied up in the barn. All bulls must be manageable and final entry determined by Livestock Committee.
25. All steer barn rules apply for feeding and care of beef breeding livestock.
26. Steer Grooming and Showmanship Award Rules will apply for all shows.
27. Balloons are prohibited in Beef Breeding Barn.
28. Beef breeding animals will begin to load out at 9:00 pm on Saturday, **February 27, 2027**, once the barn closes.
29. Clean entire area when loading out, take all supplies unless you have a steer coming into the barn and clean out all shavings from your area.
30. ***Non-compliance will result in a fine, 1st offense \$50.00, 2nd offense \$100.00, 3rd offense \$200.00. NO WARNING ISSUED.** All fines will be paid in full before the exhibitors next scheduled event (show, Showmanship, or exhibitor awards). Exhibitor will not be eligible to show in their next scheduled show or sale until fine is paid in full. Fine will be turned into the barn chair/livestock committee with completed form on **(page 44)**

1. Must be a current member of St. Lucie County 4-H or FFA to exhibit in the Small Animal Barn.
2. **Each Live Animal Exhibitor ages 8-18 years must have a valid Code of Ethics Certificate.**
3. Exhibitors must have been responsible for care and feeding of their small animal exhibits by **November 02, 2026**, and are responsible for the animal throughout the fair to be eligible to participate.
- NEW 4. *Wednesday, **September 09, 2026**, at 6:30 pm, at the fairground building “”. Mandatory meeting for **4H club leaders ONLY**
5. Exhibitors must complete entry form electronically on the ShoWorks by **November 02, 2026**. This is the absolute deadline, no exceptions! Entry Fees (previously called cage fees) are due at the time of online registration. \$5.00 entry fee per animal. *Maximum of 6 animals per exhibitor.
6. Exhibitors must complete a Showmanship entry as well with the information of the ONE animal being shown. IF you have a \$0 charge it's because you only registered for showmanship. Must have both.

Exhibitor must upload the following document with ONLINE registration:

- **Headshot Photo of Exhibitor (No glasses or hats) No photos of the animals needed!**

7. Each exhibitor is required to have a sponsor for the small animal barn. All sponsorship forms and sponsorship money are due to the leaders before **November 02, 2026**, as all sponsorships are due in the **Fair Office** by **November 02, 2026**, before 5:00 pm. Thank you letters or cards should be written to all sponsors and turned in with sponsorship, addressed and stamped.
8. Animals must be clean and in good health. Animals may be excused from the fair by the Livestock Committee or fair Veterinarian. No animal, excluding animals not required to be checked by the state, will be accepted without the state officer's test complete.
9. All animals must have a check-in physical exam by the fair veterinarian or Dept. of Ag and must be parasite free.
10. **Small Animal entries being replaced before fair MUST contact livestock@stluciecountyfair.org.**
- NEW 11. Rabbits, cavies, and reptiles will be accepted for entry on Thursday, **February 25, 2027**, from 4:00-5:30 pm. *The 4-H/FFA Layer Poultry Project birds will check-in at this time. All other poultry will check in the following week. **Please print your ShoWorks confirmation receipt with QR code to scan at check-in.**
12. Rabbit & cavy pick-up will be Tuesday, **March 02, 2027**, at 9:00 pm as soon as the small animal barn closes to the public.
13. Reptile exhibits need to bring a cage and all supplies necessary.
14. All poultry (except the Layer Project) will be accepted on Wednesday, **March 03, 2027**, from 12:00-2:00 pm.
Please print your ShoWorks confirmation receipt with QR code to scan at check-in.
15. All poultry is required to have a blood test done by the state inspector within 30 days of entering the small animal barn for show. This is a SLC Fair requirement. Date for testing- TBA.
16. Poultry & Reptile pick-up will be Sunday, **March 07, 2027**, at 7:00 pm as soon as the small animal barn is closed to the public.

17. Exhibitors are responsible for the daily care of animals checked into the fair. *This includes feeding, watering, and cleaning the cage. Exhibitors and parents should only care for their own animals. In the event of an emergency, you should contact your leader and/or barn chair. DO NOT touch or move animals that do not belong to you.
18. Only 6 exhibits per exhibitor can be shown and judged. This is subject to change.
19. No medications are to be given, unless it is done under the direction of a veterinarian.
20. If any illness appears during the time at the fair, animals will only be removed from the barn with the permission of a veterinarian and/or Livestock Committee member, no re-entry.
21. Early removal of an exhibit without the direction of barn chair or veterinarian will forfeit premium monies and/or awards.
22. No does with a litter will be accepted and no rabbits under 12 weeks old will be accepted.
23. No chicks under the age of 12 weeks old will be accepted.
24. Eggs should not be removed from any cage that is not your own.
25. Reptile entries *(display only) need to be approved through your leader and barn chairs before registration and may be limited.
26. No hamsters, goats, sheep, pigs or any other small livestock animals may be shown in the small animal barn.
27. No wildlife, family pets, skunks, or possums are permitted on the fairgrounds by any exhibitor.
28. The small animal barn can be loud and stressful for animals, especially during show days. For this reason, please consider the surroundings your animal may be exposed to before registering your animal to exhibit for the public at the fair.
29. The Livestock Committee nor the St. Lucie County Fair Association, Inc. is responsible for any losses.
30. All 4-H and FFA exhibitors must complete a record book for each category. More than one exhibit in the small category may be in the same record book. *Ex: Showing 2 rabbits; same record book, showing 1 rabbit and 1 reptile; need a record book for each. Cloverbuds only need to complete one record book. Complete record books and cage signs will be due to your leader(s) by the deadline they have determined for the club. Final deadline is Monday, **February 08, 2027**. Late record books will not be accepted, and exhibitor will not be allowed to show in the small animal barn.
31. Exhibitors are responsible for making their own cage signs for each exhibit/cage. Cage signs should be made from foam poster board ONLY, DO NOT use regular poster board, it will not hold up outside in the barn. All cage signs should be cut into an 11 by 14 sized piece (full board cut into four pieces). For reptile exhibitors: please write the dimensions of cage/enclosure on the back of the cage sign.
32. Exhibitors are permitted to have a business card in the corner of the cage sign if they have an animal for sale, but no animal is to be sold during the fair or on the fairgrounds property. Sales must take place after the fair, and off the fairgrounds property. **NO breeding of any animals in the barn during fair.
33. Parent/Guardian must accompany child/exhibitor in the small animal barn at all times.
34. Exhibitor must have control of animals while out of the cage. Smaller children are allowed help from an adult or older exhibitors.
35. During showmanship there will be two designated areas for participants. One for participants waiting to show and a second for participants that have shown until their age division is finished. All phones need to be left with parents. Parents and other exhibitors will not be allowed to talk to the participants during showmanship judging. *Cheating or the suspicion of cheating will be taken seriously, and the exhibitor will be asked to leave and will be disqualified from showmanship judging.
36. The Small Animal Rabbit, Cavy, and Reptile show will be held on Saturday, **February 27, 2027**, from 8:00 am until finished. Judging order and breaks will be determined by the judges.
37. The Small Animal Poultry Show will be held as a closed show on Thursday, **March 04, 2027**, from 9:00am until finished. The barn will be closed from 8:30am until the completion of judging.

38. The Small Animal Poultry Showmanship will be held on Saturday, **March 06, 2027**, from 8:00 am until finished.
39. Small Animal Barn Awards will be held on Sunday, **March 07, 2027**, at 3:00 pm.
40. All or any state rules, regulations, and recommendations may change at any point during the year.
41. Any entry being replaced before fair MUST contact livestock@stluciecountyfair.org.

1. All Small Animal Barn Rules apply to reptile exhibitors and exhibits being shown in Building C.
2. **Each Live Animal Exhibitor ages 8-18 years must have a valid Code of Ethics Certificate.**
3. Reptile exhibits are reserved for exhibitors that have previously shown reptiles. New reptile exhibits will only be allowed to register if space allows.
4. *During online registration, put the dimensions of the cage/enclosure in the description.
5. Exhibitors must complete entry form electronically on ShoWorks by **November 02, 2026**. This is the absolute deadline, no exceptions! Entry fees (previously called cage fees) are due at the time of online registration. \$5.00 entry fee per animal. *For an exhibitor showing ONLY a reptile exhibit the sponsorship fee will be waived. The reptile display section in building C will be sponsored.
Exhibitor must upload the following document with ONLINE registration:
Headshot Photo of Exhibitor (No glasses or hats) No photos of animals needed!
6. During online registration, put the dimensions of the cage/enclosure in the description.
 Reptiles will be accepted for entry on Thursday, **February 25, 2027**, from 4:00-5:30pm. They do not need to be checked in by the Department of Agriculture. They will be checked in, in Building C. Parents can pull to the back of Building C to unload cages and supplies.
Please print your ShoWorks confirmation receipt with QR code to scan at check-in.
7. **Any reptile entry being replaced before fair MUST contact livestock@stluciecountyfair.org. Any entry being replaced AT CHECK-IN must fill out the Entry Replacement Form.**
8. Reptile pick-up will be Sunday, **March 07, 2027**, at 7:00pm, as soon as the small animal barn is closed to the public.
9. Tables will be provided for tanks and cages to sit on.
10. All supplies necessary for daily care will need to be brought to the fair at check-in. Food, water, heat lamps, power strips, extension cords, etc.
11. All 4-h and FFA exhibitors must complete a record book for each category. More than one exhibit in the small category may be in the same record book. Complete record books and cage signs will be due to your leader(s) by the deadline they have determined for the club. Final deadline is **Monday, February 08, 2027**. Late record books will not be accepted, and exhibitor will not be allowed to show in the Small Animal Barn.

SLCFA HORSE BARN & SHOW RULES

Horse Show: 9:00 AM – Sunday, **February 28, 2027** - Judged and Speed Events
(Outside and Covered Arenas will be used simultaneously)

1. Online Registration **deadline is December 14, 2026.**

Exhibitor must upload the following document with ONLINE registration:

- **Headshot Photo of Exhibitor (No glasses or hats)**

2. **Each Live Animal Exhibitor ages 8-18 years must have a valid Code of Ethics Certificate.**

- **Exhibitor will register for ALL classes they want to participate in. Exhibitor will select "Exhibitor fee" labeled as "HORSE EVENT ENTRY FEE" before completing registration.**

3. A mandatory Horse Exhibitor meeting will be held Wednesday, **January 06, 2027**, 7:00pm at the fairgrounds building. Each Exhibitor must attend this meeting. Failure to attend this meeting will cause disqualification from the horse show and horse barn. Showbills are to be turned in at the meeting.
4. Record books will be turned in by club leaders to barn leader on date Friday, **February 05, 2027** in a three ring binder. Record books are to include a current negative color Coggins test. Two (2) legible color copies are required: one included as a page in record book and the second one loose in front of record book for barn leader, a signed vet release form, and a current report card. Record books are not to be photocopied once initial printout. If you have trouble printing them correctly, contact the Fair office or barn leader.
5. Each Stall Exhibitor is required to be present for 6:00 PM feeding. Each Stall Exhibitor is required to leave a supply of feed, marked with Horse and Exhibitor Name, for the designated person to feed all horses in the AM. Horses are to be given fresh water at barn closing.
6. Halter and lead ropes are to be left on stall door all the time – no tack left in the stall.
7. Only owners, club members, Livestock Committee members, and veterinarians are permitted in the stalls. Exhibitors should discourage parents, family, and friends from loitering around the stalls.
8. One adult per exhibitor must be present in barn during fair hours and to oversee the exercising of horses.
9. Stall assignments will be designated upon entry into the fair.
10. *To show at the fair, you must be a St. Lucie County 4-H or FFA member. See youth livestock rules page 9, rule #1.
11. Each exhibitor putting a horse in the barn can display an exhibitor board with required information: name of exhibitor and club; name, age, and breed of horse. Other information and pictures may be added.
12. There will be a \$20.00 stall fee due from each stall exhibitor for shavings. If additional shavings are needed, exhibitor will provided.

13. State 4-H Horse Show Rules will be enforced. Age as of September 01, 2026, Junior 8-13 and Senior 14-18. Boots and fastened safety helmet must be always worn when exhibitor is mounted on a horse. Proper attire and tack are required for each event (See 4-H State Rule Book for Hunt Seat, Saddle Seat, Speed Events, and Western requirements). Exhibitors not wearing proper attire will be disqualified.

Horses must be started inside the arena unless enclosed boxed area is available adjacent to the arena. The exit gate of the arena will not be opened until the horse is stopped and under control. Horse must be under the control of the rider upon entrance and exit of the arena or stopping area and promptness in entering the arena is expected. No horse or rider will be assisted once inside the arena. Failure to comply will result in disqualification. In support of the 4-H horse philosophy and to ensure maximum acceptance of responsibilities through learning experiences, any 4-H Exhibitor registered at the current show is allowed to be riding the horse while on the show grounds. Lunging (in a halter with no other tack or equipment on the animal) by someone other than the exhibitor is permitted. Failure to comply may result in disqualification of the contestant.

The Beginner Division is for exhibitors in their first two years of showing. Any exhibitor entering any Beginner Class may not enter any other riding class at the judged or speed events. The exhibitor may not be cantering in any other show series.

The Livestock Committee reserves the right to deny entry of any horse to fair activities if the horse's appearance or nature is not that of a healthy horse, for example: having open wounds, limping, being under conditioned. Exhibitors of horses that develop colic symptoms and other such problems will be asked to remove their horse immediately.

The exhibitor and parents are to be courteous to the Livestock Committee, judges, and fellow contestants always. Parents are responsible for their children and horse(s) during the fair. Horse play and careless riding will not be tolerated. Those involved will be dealt with accordingly as deemed necessary by the Livestock Committee.

SLCFA YOUTH GOAT SHOW

1. Registration **Online Only** through the St Lucie County Fair's website is **mandatory**. www.StLucieCountyFair.org
2. All registrations must be complete by **December 14, 2026**. Late entries will NOT be accepted.
3. *Exhibitors participating in Showmanship must complete a separate Showmanship entry using the information for (1) goat that will be exhibited in the Showmanship competition. Only the goat registered by the exhibitor may be used for Showmanship.
4. **All goat entries must be registered by December 14, 2026, with the following documents uploaded: www.stluciecountyfair.org**
 - Headshot Photo of Exhibitor (No glasses or hats)
5. *The entry fee is \$40.00 per goat entry. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of four (4) goats, with goat entered in a different age division/class. Each paid entry includes one (1) bag of shavings.
6. **Official SLCFA goat record books are required for all exhibitors and will be judged. Each exhibitor must submit one (1) official SLCFA Goat Record book by Monday, **February 08, 2027**, at the Fair Office by 5pm. The record book shall include all goats exhibited by the exhibitor during the current fair year, with a maximum of four (4) goats documented in one record book. Record books must be complete and include all required sections, documentation, and signatures. Failure to submit a completed record book by the deadline will result in "No Book – No Show."
7. Mandatory goat meeting, Monday, **January 11, 2027**, at 6:30pm at the Fairgrounds. Exhibitors that intend on showing a goat for the current fair year must attend this meeting.
8. *Each exhibitor is required to obtain a minimum but not limited to of \$40 in barn sponsorships. All sponsorship forms and monies will be required at the time of the mandatory **January 11th meeting. NO exceptions.**
9. This is an "Open Show for exhibitors who reside in St. Lucie County."

Eligibility requirements:

- Exhibitor must be 5 years old as of September 1st of current Fair Year.
 - If exhibitor is not 8 years old as of September 1st of current fair year, meaning exhibitor does not qualify for a 4-H club, but will be 5 years old as of the online entry date of the current fair year, the exhibitor must show in the SLCF open show, given the exhibitor meets the above requirements. All Exhibitors over the age of 8 and a member of 4-H or FFA may enter their goat in the exhibit as a member of their club as long as they reside in St. Lucie County.
 - **Each Live Animal Exhibitor ages 8-18 years must have a valid Code of Ethics Certificate.**
 - Exhibitors are only permitted to show the animal registered to the exhibitor for Showmanship & Grooming.
10. All exhibitors must have record books signed by the Goat Barn chairperson, Club leader or Livestock Committee representative.
 11. Upon entry to the fair, all Wethers will be taken to the scales to be weighed for class placement purposes. ALL goats will be checked in FIRST, then scales will be open for weighing.
 12. Minor clipping (head, tail, hooves, etc.) will be permitted in designated areas during designated times. Body clipping is to be completed before entering the fair. NO full body clipping will be permitted during the fair.
 13. On the day of the show the goat barn will be closed to the public at 2pm. ONLY registered SLCF

exhibitors, club leaders, parents/legal guardians of exhibitors or their immediate family will be allowed to coach and be present while the exhibitor grooms their project. The exhibitor must be PRESENT and be the ACTIVE groomer of the project. Grooming the project without the exhibitor actively present as the primary groomer can result in disqualification. The only exception to this rule would be in the event the exhibitor or exhibit's well-being is in jeopardy. However, the barn chairperson shall be notified first.

14. Upon entry to the Fair on Thursday, **March 04, 2027**, all animals must have an Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation. Tattoo, Scrapie Tags, and other methods of identification must correspond with the OCVI. No carbon copies of Health Certificates and tattoos must be a week old.

15. *Goat Milking Contest **Thursday at 4:00pm**, (location TBA). Participation is free; however, all contestants must register through ShoWorks. Additional contest information and official flyer will be posted on the SLCFA Livestock Exhibitors Page and the SLCFA Livestock Facebook Page. A minimum of six (6) registered contestants is required to hold the Goat Milking Contest. If fewer than six (6) entries are received, the contest will be canceled.

16. All pens will have a clean base with one bag of shavings upon entry to the fair. Additional use of bedding is at the exhibitor's expense. All pens must always be kept clean, and manure disposed of properly.

17. All aisles must remain clear during Fair hours (extension cords, grooming boxes, fans, chairs, etc.)

18. Once a goat has been assigned to a pen the goat is to remain in that pen. No goats are to be removed from a pen during the hours of the barn being open. No goats are to be moved without approval of the Barn Chair.

19. The exhibitor is responsible for all care management and feeding of his/her own animals. Animals must always have fresh water. Animals may be fed according to their normal feeding schedules.

20. THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NO FOOD OR DRINKS IN THE GOAT BARN!

21. Exhibitors must be present in the barn while it is open to interact with the public. The public may have questions regarding your animal.

22. Goats will remain in the barn until Saturday, **March 06, 2027**, and may leave after 9pm. Stalls must be completely cleaned before departure by **11:00am** Sunday, **March 07, 2027**.

23. *Each exhibitor is responsible for thoroughly cleaning their assigned pens and storage areas before leaving the fairgrounds. Pens must be inspected and approved by the Goat Barn Chair prior to departure. Failure to have the assigned pen and storage area cleaned and approved will result in a \$50.00 cleaning fine assessed to the exhibitor. Failure to clean assigned areas may also result in the forfeiture of future exhibition privileges at the St. Lucie County Fair. Exhibitor and clubs are responsible for providing their own wheelbarrows, brooms, shovels, and other cleaning equipment.

24. NO companion goats are allowed unless approved by the Livestock Committee. Any approved companion animal MUST have a valid health certificate and will be marked by tag ID with chalk. NO bucks as companion goats. One parent or guardian of each exhibitor must be in the barn while it is open.

SLCFA SHOWMANSHIP RULES

Market Steer - Market Swine - Beef Breeding - Goat

The number of places awarded may be limited by show management in accordance with the number of entries. Showmanship contests shall be conducted in conjunction with all youth livestock shows listed which have a minimum of four entries.

In general, the contest will be judged on the following:

1. The ability of the contestant to lead, set up, and handle his/her own animal. The judge may ask you to show another contestant's animal.
2. The appearance of the contestant.
3. The contestant's attention to the judge and ring stewards.
4. The contestant's knowledge of proper handling procedures in the show ring as demonstrated by his/her actions and possible questions by the judge.
5. Other areas may be evaluated as deemed necessary by the judge to determine winners.

SLCFA GROOMING RULES

Market Steer

Market Swine

Beef Breeding

- a. From date of entry to the Fair until the end of the last scheduled show, current exhibitors may receive and/or give help to current fellow steer exhibitors. This includes:
-Washing -Blowing -Grooming of any sort

- b. Parents & non-exhibitors are prohibited from assisting exhibitors with any of the following:
-Washing -Blowing -Grooming of any sort

Force filling of steers with any substance, water included, is prohibited. This includes the use of pumps, drenches, tubes, hoses. ETC. All steers must be shown in their natural conformation and structure without alteration by modification, except for the grooming and treatment of the hair and trimming of the hooves. No graphite, hair, cotton, twine, etc. May be applied.

- c. Show Night: Tuesday, **March 02, 2027 @7:00pm**

Verbal assistance from the Official FFA Advisor(s) and registered 4-H Club Leaders ONLY is permitted. The barn will be closed to EVERYONE except for Exhibitors, FFA Advisor, 4-H Leaders, Livestock Committee & Designated Persons per Livestock Committee approval at 5:00pm.

- d. Showmanship & Grooming Night: Thursday, **March 04, 2027 @6:30pm**

Exhibitors may begin grooming their steers no earlier than 1:00pm...except for wash and dry. At 1:00pm the barn will be closed to EVERYONE except for Exhibitors, Livestock Committee & Designated Persons. Current steer exhibitors may receive/or give help to fellow steer exhibitors.

2. Beef Breeding Barn:

- a. From date of entry to the Fair until the end of the last scheduled show, current exhibitors may receive and/or give help to current fellow steer exhibitors. This includes:
-Washing -Blowing -Grooming of any sort

Show, Showmanship & Grooming Beef Breeding Night: Friday, February 26, 2027@6:30pm
Exhibitors may begin grooming their beef breeding exhibit no earlier than 1:00pm. EXCEPT WASH AND DRY. The barn will be closed to EVERYONE except for Exhibitors, FFA Advisor, 4-H Leaders, Livestock Committee & Designated Persons per Livestock Committee approval at 5:00pm.

3. Swine Barn:

Showmanship/Grooming – Monday, **March 01, 2027 @ 6:00pm** - Exhibitors are required to be in their pens by 5:45 pm.

The barn will be closed to the public. Only current swine exhibitors and leaders will be permitted in the barn the entire day.

- a. Current exhibitors may receive and/or give help to fellow current swine exhibitors.
b. Verbal assistance from the official FFA Advisor and registered 4-H club leaders is permitted.

4. Initial full body grooming must be done prior to entering the fair, touch-up clipping ONLY will be allowed.
5. Professional fitters will not be allowed to groom animals or advise exhibitors in any barn once the animal is entered into the Fair.

Violation of these Grooming Rules will result in disqualification of the Exhibitor & animal.

SLCFA HERDSMAN AWARD

Herdsmen Awards are awarded to exhibitors with the purpose of encouraging exhibitors to present more attractive displays. Show management reserves the right to withhold any or all Herdsman Awards if they are not merited. All livestock exhibitors are eligible to compete for these awards. Exhibits will be judged daily by the Livestock Committee on the following basis:

1. Orderliness and cleanliness of service areas, stalls, pens, animals, and public walkways.
2. Promptness in preparation of exhibit and exhibit areas by opening time and maintained until 9:00 p.m. daily.
3. Appearance of exhibitor.
4. Cooperation with show officials.
5. Availability to furnish information about their exhibits.
6. General conduct of the exhibitor.
7. Exhibitors shall discourage loitering by parents and acquaintances during fair hours.
8. There will be a First and Second Place in each barn.
9. A Special Award may be given for outstanding performance in areas of conduct, personal appearance, and assistance and cooperation with other exhibitors and show officials.

OTHER SLCFA LIVESTOCK AWARDS

St. Lucie County Fair Quad County Bred Steer Competition

To compete for this award, steers must have been bred & born in St. Lucie, Indian River, Martin, or Okeechobee County.

Cattlemen's Best Effort Award

Two female exhibitors are selected who have demonstrated special efforts in the Market Steer Show and/or Beef Breeding Show. Exhibitors are judged on attitude, appearance, helpfulness, and knowledge of the Beef industry. Competition begins when animals enter. Award is decided by a committee of the St. Lucie County Cattlemen.

St. Lucie County Farm Bureau Outstanding Exhibitor Award

The St. Lucie County Farm Bureau is looking for the “Ideal FFA/4-H/Open Show Exhibitor”. One exhibitor from each barn (Beef, Swine, Horse, Goat, and Small Animal) will be selected based on Participation (barn time, interaction with public, time with animal, helping others, grooming/showmanship); Attitude (sportsmanship during shows and in the barn); Knowledge (about their animal such as breed, feeding program, breeder); Record Book (ribbon score and number score); and Exhibitor (appearance, appropriate clothes, and courteous to others). Winners will be recognized at the Exhibitor Awards and presented a belt buckle.

Market Steer and Swine Weight Gain Award

All market entries weighed in at the initial weigh-in are eligible. Animals with the highest average daily gain (ADG) will be selected.

5. Exhibitors shall submit one complete record book for each entry. Books will be judged separately by age and barn.
6. Cloverbud receives a participation certificate.
7. ***No exhibitor will be allowed to participate until a fully completed record book is submitted for each project. In the event that an exhibitor receives a record book back for being incomplete when reviewed during entry to the fair, they must complete the record book and make arrangements to submit to the barn chair by fair opening the following day or they will not be permitted to participate with their animal in the show.**
8. If an exhibitor's animal expires prior to entry to the fair, the exhibitor may still participate in the record book contest, providing a record book is submitted on the expired animal.
9. Record books where it is apparent that the work was done by a parent or someone other than the exhibitor will be reviewed by the Livestock Committee. The Livestock Committee will determine if record book and/or animal will be accepted and/or judged. Award will be given only to first and second place winners.
10. All beef breeding and goat record books must be completed and submitted by February 08, 2027, by 5:00 PM to the fair office. ALL BEEF BREEDING & GOAT RECORD BOOKS will be judged.

SLCFA PROTEST PROCEDURES

1. All protests must be done in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash or certified check which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such a protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to Livestock Coordinator within 24 hours after the occasion for such protest.
 - A. Protest form lines 1 through 6 must be completed and submitted to Livestock Coordinator.
 - B. Order of Action:
 1. Livestock Chair (Steer, Swine, etc.)
 2. Livestock Coordinator
 3. Final action St. Lucie County Fair Board of Trustees.

Action

All rules and regulations that have been properly protested and proven true could be subject to one or more of the following penalties:

1. Loss of premium monies
2. Loss of awards
3. Disqualification of animal(s) and or exhibitor from current and future shows.

Disqualifications: Any exhibitor that has been disqualified from any livestock show or has premium withheld or withdrawn from the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, investigation, and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaints or appeal that a judge overlooked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s) or shows any disrespect to them or show officials, the existing show may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude him/her from further competition; exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him may be moved up at The option of the Livestock Chairman to fill the vacated position.
