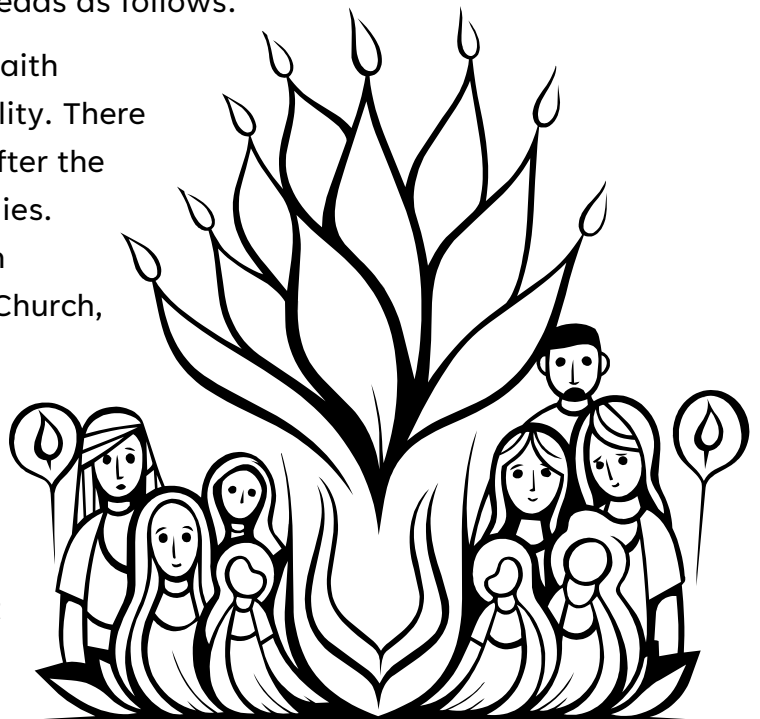
**Pentecost Celebration:** We have a wonderful opportunity to celebrate Pentecost with members of other churches in St Palladius Church at 3pm this Sunday, 24<sup>th</sup> May. This will take the form of a shared liturgy, celebrating the outpouring of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Please come along and help welcome those who will join us from other churches.

**Deanery Pastoral Council** will next meet in the church hall at St John's, Stevenston on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> June, beginning with exposition at 6pm and the meeting itself starting at 6.30pm. It is important however that we begin from a place of prayer, so please come for at least part of the prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. At this meeting we will begin to look at Bishop Frank's second pastoral letter where he asks us to consider how our Diocese will need to change over the next few years, in particular we will discuss the following two questions: Where and in what ways do you see the church fulfilling its mission? And what are your hopes and vision for our church in the future?

**Conversation in the Spirit:** Thanks to those who came along last weekend to take part in a reflection on future structures of the church in Scotland, a summary of that conversation has been shared with the Bishops' conference of Scotland and is available on the notice board, the final paragraph of which is a summary and reads as follows:

“The parish community demonstrates lively faith expressed through service, care, and hospitality. There is a growing desire to rebuild participation after the pandemic, especially among youth and families. While apprehensive about potential diocesan mergers, parishioners express loyalty to the Church, affection for their bishop, and readiness to collaborate and adapt if change becomes necessary—provided local identity and pastoral closeness are preserved.”
