- 1. Enter your exhibits at the Fair Office.
- 2. Online pre-registration is highly encouraged. Please find the link on our website under the "Open Class" tab.
- Check-in Registration will be held from Noon to 7:00 pm Tuesday July 29th.
   Projects entered Online will be checked in on registration day and entry tags will be printed.
- 4. ONLINE registration will close at NOON on Tuesday July 29th. If you choose not to enter your project online, a computer attendant will be available to register projects at the fair office on Tuesday. Expect to wait in line. You can also visit your local library to register online or print the guide and entry form. We ask that the entry form be filled out prior to registering with the computer attendant.
- 5. No late entries.
- 6. Judging of exhibits will start at 9:00 am on Wednesday, July 30<sup>st</sup>.
- 7. Projects and results will be available for viewing when the building opens at 4:00 pm Wednesday.
- 8. Premium checks will be ready for pick up on Saturday after 6:00 pm in the Fair Office. Any question send email to: <a href="mailto:chippewacountyfair@gmail.com">chippewacountyfair@gmail.com</a>

# **Rules & Regulations**

- 1. EXHIBITS MAY NOT BE REMOVED UNTIL 5PM ON SUNDAY, August 3rd.
- 2. The board will interpret these rules and decide all questions of fact in connection herewith. All questions in dispute or differences not covered by these rules shall be referred to the board, whose decision shall be final.
- 3. The management will take every precaution in its power for the protection of articles on exhibition, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur during their delivery, removal, and while on the grounds.
- 4. The fair board reserves the right to remove or deny any entry of any exhibit which may be deemed inappropriate. Articles can be shown only in one lot. One entry per person per lot, unless otherwise stated.
- 5. Articles must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner.
- 6. Where there is but a single exhibitor in any lot, one premium will be paid. When there are two exhibitors and two exhibits shown, two premiums will be awarded. Nothing can be entered as special if not listed in the premium list.
- 7. When articles are not deemed worthy, the judges will refuse to award a premium, whether there be competition or not in the class.
- 8. All articles will be displayed in a well guarded, clean, dry showcase. The judge may select high quality exhibits for special meritorious ribbons.
- 9. All crops must have been grown in 2024 2025.
- 10. Master gardeners can answer your questions regarding showmanship, vegetable trimming, etc.
- 11. **PHOTOGRAPHY RULE**: All submitted photos must be 5x7 or 8x10, framed or matted. 1 print per related subject and must be taken within the last year.

#### **Awards**

- 1. The superintendent of the department or some other person appointed shall assist the awarding committee as clerk and shall keep a record of awards made. The record, when completed, shall be signed by the awarding committee and returned to the secretary as the final complete evidence of the award made.
- 2. The awards of the entries shall be denoted by ribbons, tags, or cards as follows: First Premium-Blue; Second Premium-Red.
- 3. All awards shall be made by comparison of the individual merits of the entries.
- 4. Any interference by exhibitors to influence or dictate the decision of the judge will be sufficient cause for excluding the entry from competition and should be reported to the secretary through the superintendent of the division.
- 5. No appeal from the decision of the awarding committee will be allowed.
- 6. Premiums will not be awarded on articles of inferior merit, regardless of the number of competitors for a premium. The judge may award no premium, second or first as merit may warrant—stating reasons for such placing.
- 7. No person shall be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the grounds except from his or her place of business or exhibit. The tacking or posting of any advertisement other than within the space occupied by the exhibitor is strictly prohibited. The distribution of handbills, flyers, heralds, etc., will not be permitted. Anyone violating this rule will be liable to a fine and expulsion from the grounds as the board may elect.
- 8. If the receipts should prove insufficient to meet all demands, the fair board reserves the right to first pay all bona fide expenses of the fair and pay premiums pro rata with the balance on hand.
- 9. The Minnesota State Horticultural Society will provide a special ribbon to the award winning youth (under 16) horticulture exhibit. Please indicate youth when entering.

#### GARDEN VEGETABLE AND FRUITS GUIDE

Uniformity of size, shape color and maturity. Vegetables should be labeled giving variety name.

#### Properly Clean:

- Root and leafy crops, if needed, wash and very gently cool water.
- Tender-skinned vegetables such as peas, bean, summer squash, peppers tomatoes eggplant should just be wiped clean with a soft cloth if needed.
- Cucumbers and onion should never be washed. Brush with a soft brush if needed.

**Beets, carrots, parsnips, turnips and rutabagas:** Mature but not overgrown, pithy or coarse in texture. Tops trimmed off 1 ¼ inches above the crown. Side roots trimmed off but not the taproot. Clean by brushing, not scrubbing.

**Broccoli**- heads should be dark or purplish green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Stems cut about 5 inches from the top of the head..

**Cabbage-** stems cut about ½ inch below the head. Remove blemished or broken leaves. Leave 2-3 wrapper leaves.

**Cauliflower-** heads should be white, compact and free of small leaves and rich texture. Stems cut to 4 to 6 inches. Outer leaved trimmed to 1-2 inches above the white head. Use soft bristle brush to remove dirt from head.

**Celery-** Remove roots of stalk and trim butt to form a pyramid. Trim diseased and broken leaves to the outside until color is uniform.

**Cucumbers-** Pickling: select fruits 3-5 inches long. Slicers: select fruits that are straight, dark green and 6-10 inches long. Specimens should be the same stage of maturity and uniforn in size, shape and color. Leave stems attached, use a soft brush to clean.

**Eggplant-** uniform in color and free from bronzing or greening. One half inch of stem should be left on. **Kale, Spinach and Chard:** Display in a jar of water.

**Kohlrabi-** root removed just below the ball. Remove all but the center 4-6 leaves. Select specimens that are medium size and not hard and woody. Skin should be easily punctured by thumb nail. They should be clean but not washed.

Lettuce- dig, leaving roots and exhibit in a glass container with leaves above the water.

**Melon-** select fruit that separated easily from the vine, should be mature but not over ripe. Remove Stem. **Onions-** have specimens mature and thoroughly cured. The neck should be small. So not peel to give a slick appearance. Only outer scales that are beoken or discolored should be reomed. Sall basal roots should be left intact but trimmed to a uniform length of ½ inch. Wipe or brush but do not wash. Cut tops to 1 to 1 ½ inches long.

Peas- select bright green well filled with seeds, the best eating stage. Do not wash as the bloom should be preserved.

**Peppers-** stem should be lest ½ of 1 inch long. Select uniform fruits.

Radishes- tap root cut ½ inch and tops cut ½ inch

**Rhubarb-** select stalks that are straight, uniform, and unblemished. Stalks should be pulled from the plant, not cut. Cut of blade leaf 2 inches above the stalk.

**Snap Beans-** harvest before con strictions appear between the seeds, when seeds are half grown. Pods should be wiped clean but not washed. Leave stems attached, trimmed to a uniform length.
