We are so impressed with the amount of work put in by Miranda and Pippa. In their short four months with us, they have covered a great expanse of work:

- Hosting engaging events and workshops.
- Created an accessibility map with areas for development on the site to make the space accessible to everyone.
- Developed an online community through Facebook, padlet and a mailing list.
- Forming our Community Panel (this is the community group who will liaise with the NHS and guide the direction of the project) which 29 people have shown interest in.
- Designed memorable branding.
- Identifying key areas of interest from the community for the future of the site.

DesignHOPES symposium.

Design Hopes symposium held at Civic House Glasgow on the 22nd of April, brought together the different researchers from across the DesignHOPES projects to showcase their work. https://designhopes.org/

There were so many innovative, design-led research pieces which were all developed to help the NHS reach their environmental targets. It was great to see how our Mountainhall Greenspace Community project has inspired some of these design practitioners.

Including Laura MacLean with her Mosaic Landscape Game, some of you will have seen at the Community Nature Open day. And Konstantinos Petrakis at Strathclyde University, who has made an interactive map of the Mountainhall Greenspace.

• Neighboring greenspace project - Medi-Flax: Growing Linen for Health.

We would also like to introduce a separate, but neighboring NHS / DesignHopes project, in collaboration with <u>Elves</u>, a new, local gardening group partnered with DG mental health.

This is part of a bigger DesignHOPES trial exploring whether flax, a plant used to make linen, can be grown and processed locally to support more sustainable textiles in healthcare. Linen is a strong, natural alternative to cotton and synthetic fabrics, and this project is a first step toward rebuilding a local, soil-to-soil textile system in the UK. We're especially interested in whether homegrown flax could eventually be used to make items like scrubs.
