SARAH JONES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

As far back as 1987, a 'BASIC Scholarship Fund" was established to help graduating and graduated high school students. In 2005, the membership renamed the Fund in memory of Sarah Marie Jones. Sarah, a high school senior, was struck by a hit and run vehicle on Blanchard Cutoff Rd. and died of her injuries. This tragic loss of a dynamic student reminds us of our closeness as a community and the value of our talented youth. BASIC is committed to promoting the betterment of the Blanchard community and still administers the scholarship.

You're never too old to learn! Anyone, who wishes to go to a trade school, a community college, or a university, has multiple expenses related to their attending specified courses. Furthermore, those students <u>already</u> in secondary trades or studies may apply for scholarship money, at anytime, to put toward educational expenses currently incurred. In the case of multiple requests, preference will be given to first time applicants. High school seniors should have their application submitted by <u>April 15 prior to graduation</u>.

Students and current members of the Blanchard Community Center, operated by the Blanchard Area Seniors, Inc. (BASIC), have the opportunity to submit potential recipient names for the scholarship. **Need an application?** Applications are available at the Community Center, at a local high school or by requesting one by mail. (Send the request for an application to Box 127, Blanchard, ID 83804 or leave a note in the Letter Drop Box outside of the Center entrance) The applicants must come from the Blanchard Service Area which is referred to as Southwest Bonner County; priority will be given to Blanchard area students.

Funds are raised through individual donations and from the Sara Jones Scholarship Luncheon which occurs from noon until 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 9th this year. Watch for flyers and posters for more details. *The amount of scholarship dollars may vary based on funds available.*

COMMUNITY CENTER CONTINUES TO TOUCH LIVES

On January 27, a frosty day, the 2nd Harvest Food Distribution at the Community Center occurred from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. Many volunteers (bundled up with hats, boots, and gloves) arrived by 10:00 to unload supplies and set up the stations for the food giveaway. <u>Over 200 families</u> benefited from the drive-thru arrangement where volunteers loaded food supplies into vehicles for a minimal-touch distribution system! Overages of food were donated to the Blanchard Grange Food Bank and to The Cup of Grace of Spirit Lake. Thank you to all the Center volunteers for their untiring work and to the 2nd Harvest organization!
