BACK TO BASICs

BASIC is a non-profit 501c (3) (Tax ID 82-0418029) organization that is not government nor tax funded, meaning we do the work and earn the money ourselves. All our activities are run by volunteers; we have no paid staff. BASIC has served our community since 1986 and has run the Blanchard Community Center since 2005.

While we have the word, "Seniors" in our name, we are open to all ages at the Community Center. We are not a Senior Center but a Community Center offering activities to all ages and performing outreach for the cares and concerns of all residents and neighbors in Southwest Bonner County. Our <u>first monthly Food Pantry</u> (March 18) will occur every third Friday of the month from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. Our winter play and musical, "Beauty and the Beast" was superbly performed by over 43 young people and their adult mentors. The Summer Arts, Crafts & Learning Program for Kids is already in the preparation stage.

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GOT PAINT? GOT PAINTERS?

It's time to give our building a bit of attention. At the January 11th and the Feb. 8th Member Meetings, it was discussed that the entry, kitchen, bathrooms, and main hall were in need of paint. In order to preserve the building and its attractiveness, it was suggested that we make a plan to achieve this goal before or during the Fall. It was noted that the building is already rented for functions, activities, and weddings this year and consideration should be given to neutral colors, décor, as well as sanitation and COVID protocols.

Members shared experiences about the high cost of paint and the cost of professional painters' bids. Through this discussion, suggestions mentioned were:

- the feasibility of obtaining corporate paint donations, reduced or donated labor by professionals,
- obtaining a grant, as well as, receiving donations from members,
- the hope that a volunteer "paint experienced" work party may be an option.
