# **SPRING: THE SEASON OF TRADITIONS**

Spring became official on March 20, 2023 also known as the Vernal Equinox! We still may feel as winter's captive but we can feel the promise of a new season with each passing day; we are becoming increasingly aware of the world waking from its winter slumber. It is time for plants to start springing from the ground.

Before the 14th century, spring was called Lent in Old English. In pre-Christian Europe, Anglo-Saxons worshipped Eostre, the moon goddess of spring and fertility. She was always portrayed as standing among spring flowers and holding an egg in her hand. Eggs have been associated with spring rituals for millennia. It's believed that eggs represented fertility and birth in certain pagan traditions that pre-date Christianity. Ancient Egyptians, Persians, Romans, Gauls, and Chinese all embraced the egg as a symbol of the universe, and today, eggs are as much a part of Easter, and springtime, as Easter bonnets and fancy flowers. Christians appropriated and adapted many pagan traditions and symbols for their own celebration of resurrection.

In the Hebrew Bible, Passover is a festival that commemorates the liberation of the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt. It was and continues to be the most important Jewish seasonal festival, celebrated on the <u>first full moon</u> after the vernal equinox. Similar to Passover, Easter falls on the <u>first Sunday</u> after the first full moon after the equinox.

Easter foods are also steeped in symbolism. An Easter dinner of lamb also has historical roots, since a lamb was often used as a sacrificial animal in Jewish traditions, and lamb is frequently served during Passover. The phrase "lamb of God" is sometimes used to refer to Jesus and the sacrificial nature of his death. Many American Easter dinners now feature ham instead, because of the timing of the holiday. Perhaps because, years ago, hams cured over the winter months and would have been ready to serve in the early spring.
