TIPS FOR TEEN JOB INTERVIEWS

Our rural area poses a number of challenges for young people to access and pursue particular career and vocational interests. Sometimes, we need to apply for a job that will eventually help build our resume of talent even though it is not our career choice. Each interview and job enhances our learning. So, with all the "Now Hiring" signs, how do you approach getting a job as a teen?


- 1) Be prepared: know the company that is hiring. Research their website. Be on time!
- 2) Silence your phone: make sure you listen carefully and thoughtfully to the interviewer.
- 3) Be polite: it is essential to have good manners and be dressed appropriately. Avoid slouching and avoid using slang or swear words.
- 4) Know your schedule: flexibility is an asset, because the more time you are available, the easier it is for the employer to set a work schedule. Also know how you are going to get to and from work if you don't drive.
- 5) Take notes: interview questions are valuable tools. We learn to tailor our responses to fit our personal circumstances.
- 6) Take a few minutes to thank the person who interviewed you. If you have an email address, send an email thank-you note, otherwise send a paper note thanking the interviewer for taking the time to meet with you.

THE BY-LAWS' PURPOSES

Article II: PURPOSES At the monthly member meetings, please submit ideas that support our purposes. The purposes of this Corporation [BASIC] are:

SECTION 1: To promote the interests of the citizens of the community in the Blanchard service area and vicinity in harmony with national interests regardless of race, creed, color, gender, disability or social standing.

SECTION 2: To promote fact-finding, research issues, and disseminate information generated thereby.

SECTION 3: To encourage greater opportunities for all, in community service, civic affairs, and involvement of all in active society.

SECTION 4: To promote educational opportunities, creativity, art, culture, and history preservation for all.

SECTION 5: To act as a clearing medium for the exchange of ideas, information, and experience within the community.

SECTION 6: To operate a Community Center for the use of all community members for the benefit of the Blanchard service area.
