America's Founding Documents: <u>The Declaration of Independence, The Constitution, and</u> <u>The Bill of Rights</u>, have secured our rights and fortified the founding and philosophy of the United States of America.

The Declaration of Independence: the main purpose of the Declaration was to announce the colonies as separate from England. It outlines the principles that were the foundation for declaring independence. Some favorite and famous words associated with this document are:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed,..."

- The Bill of Rights defines citizens' and states' rights in relation to the Government and makes up the first 10 Amendments of the Constitution. It spells out Americans' rights in relation to their government and guarantees civil rights and liberties to the individual—like freedom of speech, press, and religion. It sets rules for due process of law and reserves all powers not delegated to the Federal Government to the people or the States. And it specifies that "the enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people." (Source: National Archives)
- The Constitution defines the framework of the federal government starting with Article 11. Its Preamble reads:

"We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America." During the present inflationary situation with gas, food, and shelter, folks may have to make difficult choices when prioritizing expenditures. While resources and supply-chain issues still prevail, the Blanchard Community Center is attempting to provide free grocery products on the third Friday of the month. (July 15, - Aug. 19, - Sept.16, - Oct. 21, - Nov.18, - Dec.16) The criteria requested involves proof of being a Blanchard resident. Priority is given to the disabled, seniors, and those who may be on welfare. There is no shame in seeking help; providing help to those who seek it gives a blessing and an opportunity to serve!

The Blanchard Grange is also providing a similar service on the second and fourth Friday of each month.

"New-2-U" MARKETPLACE

On June 25th, the first annual "New-2-U" marketplace was held in the parking lot of the Blanchard Community Center.
