

Additional Dual Enrollment Opportunities

(for rising juniors and seniors)

*The following are enrichment opportunities that will not be reflected on a student's TAHS transcript and will not count toward graduation credit.

The options below have separate registration forms for each institution. Cost per credit is determined by the university and is subject to change from year to year. Students need to be mindful of drop/add policies and timelines at each institution so not to incur charges for courses that are not completed. Please discuss these DE opportunities with your school counselor as each registration needs counselor approval; a student is a good DE candidate at the below institutions if he/she has historically shown academic success in honors and/or AP courses at TAHS and can work well independently.

Commonwealth University/online - Through their Early College program, juniors and seniors (and exceptionally strong rising juniors) may take Commonwealth University (Mansfield, Bloomsburg, Lock Haven campuses) asynchronous, online courses during the fall, spring and summer terms. The cost is \$380 per course, and students may choose academically appropriate courses (be mindful of pre-requisites). Go to www.commonwealthu.edu/admissions/early-college.

Lackawanna College, on-line & on LC campus - Students may take 100 level courses (and some 200 level courses) on campus at Lackawanna College or through LC online for the cost of \$100 a credit during the fall, spring or summer semesters. To register for winter and spring classes, please apply now and they'll be processed after November 10. The intersession (winter) begins on January 5, 2026, and the spring semester begins on January 26, 2026.

University of Scranton/on campus - Through their High School Scholars program and Business High School Scholars Program, UofS offers DE courses for juniors and seniors. Students must first make an application through the University of Scranton's High School Scholars program <http://admissions.scranton.edu/apply/hs-scholars>. The application requires a counselor's recommendation. The minimum high school GPA requirement is 3.3 (87%-89%).

Most courses offered are 3 credits and are \$175 a credit. For students seeking advanced coursework, there may be an opportunity to take a placement test and place into a higher-level course. There is funding for students in financial need. Please see Mrs. Elias in the TAHS school counseling office to see if you qualify.

Penn West/online only - pennwest.edu/dual-enrollment. Through their High School Early Admit Program, Penn West offers dual enrollment opportunities across many disciplines and during the fall, spring and summer terms. All courses are already approved for juniors and seniors in high school and are exclusively online (full list at Penn West's website). Please note:

- *\$100/credit; students are only allowed to take one course per term.*
- *Summer, Fall and Spring semesters only (no winter) – flyer attached*
 - *3.0 GPA requirement*
 - *May 1 application deadline for summer & fall applications*
 - *December 1 application deadline for spring applications*
- *Choose any campus (the app does not offer “online” – the campus will not matter)*
 - *Use this fee waiver code: **CRPENNWEST***
