We are pleased to inform you that the Tunkhannock Area school District Intermediate Center and Primary Center will be participating again in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) in the 26-27 school year. This program is available to schools and districts that are participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

All enrolled students in the Primary Center and Intermediate Center are eligible to receive a nutritional breakfast and lunch each school day at **no charge** to your household.

Milk will cost .60 if your child needs a milk and does not get the meal.

No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without paying a fee or submitting an application.
