

The conceptual thought of organizing an effort to seek and establish another chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated began on January 22, 2004. A small group of strong, enthusiastic Omega men collective saw a greater need for Omega's presence in the Central Arkansas area.

This group of brothers, spearheaded by elder statesmen Bro. Charles D. Thompson and Bro. Bruce Horton, began meeting regularly to discuss this endeavor. The brothers who participated in this initial concept were Reggie Davis, John Roberts, James O. Williams, Kevin Bell, and Edward Sherrill. The brothers decided that the idea of applying for the charter was a worthwhile effort.

The brothers incorporated the help of Bro. Don Davis, District Representative, to guide them through the charter application process. It was decided that the chapter would be established in Allport, Arkansas. This geographical location was selected to place the chapter in position to bring about an Omega presence to serve the Allport community as well as the communities of North Little Rock and North Pulaski County.



# HISTORY


Omicron Lambda Lambda is one of the largest growing chapters in the state of Arkansas. This chapter has proven to be one of the top leaders in the areas of community service and scholarship.

Each year that it has existed, the brothers have offered food baskets to community residents in need during the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons. 


# NAACP Lifetime Membership



## Award Application

**Large Graduate Chapter of the Year** - The Large Graduate Chapter of the Year should be a Graduate Chapter that has made significant contributions on the District and the International level of the Fraternity as well as to its community. Graduate Chapters with financial membership of 50 members or more will be in the Large Graduate Chapter category. Additionally, the Chapter must be in good standing at the District and International levels during the immediate year prior to the award and the year of the award. The exception would be only for Large Graduate Chapters that were not chartered in the prior year.

The scoring criteria for the award is listed below:

**Special Notes: (Each Section must contain the following or point deductions will take place).**

- Ω The summary shall follow the outline and each section should be arranged as follows:
  1. *Agenda, Program or Flyer that outlines or announces the event*
  2. *Photos (labeled to include description of the event and date) and news articles that support the activity*
  3. *Written report that documents the results of the activity*
  4. *Pictures and photos in the summary should coincide with the dates of the period covered*
  5. *Chapters must still provide mandatory items even though the committee will verify with IHQ*

All submissions must follow the International Large Graduate Chapter of The Year Evaluation Criteria listed on the page below without deviation and in criteria order. Forms must not be altered / changed or deductions will take place. For example, the yearbook starts with:

- a) Introduction and Presentation
  - b) Table of Contents
  - c) Proper Labeling
- (The yearbook must follow that order without deviation).

The next section will include:

- a) Achievement Week
  - b) Scholarship
  - c) Conclave / Leadership conference delegates
  - d) Memorial Service
  - e) Social Action
  - f) Talent Hunt
  - g) Reclamation / Retention
  - h) College Endowment Fund
  - i) NAACP Life Member
  - j) International Health Initiatives
  - k) Other Local Community Based Activities.
- (The yearbook must follow that order without deviation)

The last section is Chapter Awards and Other Recognition. (This should be your last section along with a signature page at the end).
