Older adults are a growing and notably vulnerable population at risk. Patricia McGaffigan will share IHI work and perspective on

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	how prevention and care management practices guided by the Age-Friendly 4Ms Framework (What Matters Most, Mentation, Medication, Mobility) can be adapted to best align care for older adults that disease-specific approaches may miss at every point in their journey.
