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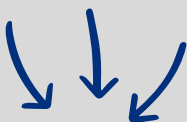
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Message from Mr Finney

This hands-on learning helps build a strong foundation for their future maths skills.

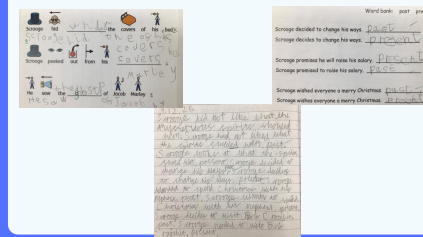
HEDGEHOGS

In English they wrote their own balanced argument.

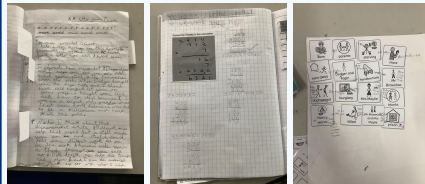


BADGERS
