

EXPLORING FAITH WITH YOUR SPONSOR

Now is a good time to think about whom you would like as your sponsor and the sooner you ask them the better. The most important role of a Confirmation sponsor is to walk with you and guide you as you prepare to receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit in this Sacrament of Initiation. Your sponsor can be a great source of spiritual guidance. Sponsors are like spiritual coaches or mentors; they affirm your strengths and point out ways to help you grow in the practice of your faith. A sponsor participates in your preparation and presents you to the bishop during the sacrament of Confirmation.

Our hope is that you will schedule time with your sponsor to explore your Catholic faith together. We are asking that you meet at least 2 times- once before your Confirmation retreat and once after your retreat. Whether in person or through another way of communicating (phone, Zoom...), it is important that you meet to discuss your preparation, ask your questions, and pray together.

The packet provides guided questions for 2 sessions. Please take some time reflecting upon and answering the questions together. If you have something else you want to talk about, you are more than welcome to discuss any topic. The questions are a simply a way to start your discussions. You are encouraged to take notes on your discussion for later reflection. Please sign the bottom of "MEETING ONE" and turn it in by the Junior Retreat, or you can turn it in to the Faith Formation office any time after you have finished. The bottom of "MEETING TWO" should be turned into the FF office (perhaps after a Sunday Mass) soon after retreat, so you are able to talk about the retreat while it is still fresh in your mind. I know you all have very busy schedules, so it is a good idea to put meeting dates and times on your calendar now!

Opening Prayer

COME HOLY SPIRIT, LIVE IN US. Reflect on your own experience of the Holy Spirit. How do you imagine the Holy Spirit? When or how are you aware of the Holy Spirit? Prayer is the Lifting of our hearts and minds to God. It helps us come to know God and his will for us. God the Holy Spirit teaches us how to pray. Discuss prayer and what it means to you. Share the kinds and types of prayer you practice and enjoy. What steps have you taken to develop a relationship with God? The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties of the men of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. (Gaudium et Spes 1) What aspects of the Catholic Church are most attractive to you and invite you to belong? What are the moral issues and social justice issues you feel strongly about?

What are some things you can do to continue to grow in your faith? (Together, with your

sponsor, set some goals for you to work on this year.)
