We view Year I as an extension of Early Years, and believe that there is great value in learning through play.

Independent Learning is timetabled every day.

Continuous Provision= resources and areas that are always open and available during Independent Learning

Enhanced Provision= areas and resources set up by the teacher to build on subject learning and interests.

You might notice that our outdoor area is an extension of our classroom, with resources set up outside. We politely ask you to discourage children from playing with these in the morning whilst you are waiting to come in.

Any unwanted or outgrown dressing up pieces.





Phonics Screening Check





Phonics Screening Check

The Year I phonics screening check is a statutory assessment that all schools must administer.

It consists of 40 words that assess phonics skills and knowledge learned throughout Reception and Year I. There is a combination of 20 real words and 20 'pseudo-words' (nonsense words/'alien' words).

The children are used to formal and informal assessments in the core subjects so please be reassured your child will be at ease.

Reading

The children will receive one phonics book and choose one book for pleasure each week.

If they complete the book with you, please do read it again and explore the vocabulary and discuss the story.

Reading should be recorded in their Recording Record.

Regular reading will happen at school in addition to our every day — Phonics, Whole Class Reading (comprehension) and Class Novel.

Homework

- Reading is expected to be done daily. This can be reading or sharing a book with an adult and include discussion with an adult.
- Your child will be given a list of spellings to practise at home each week.
- An optional activity from the homework grid can also be completed and is linked to other curriculum subjects per term.







Uniform expectations


