Key vocabulary:

Hijab- Many Muslim women wear a hijab. The word means "veil". It symbolises modesty and respect for Allah their God.

Curtsy- A woman's or girl's formal greeting made by bending the knees with one foot in front of the other.

Bullying- The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or online.

Siblings- Brothers and sisters.

Whisper- To speak very softly using your breath rather than throat.

Proud- When you are proud, you are feeling pride, or satisfaction with yourself. This can happen when you have achieved something you have been working on..

Islam:

Followers of Islam are called Muslims. Islam is a monotheistic religion that believes there is only one God and that God is Allah. It is the world's second-largest religion and their holy book is the Qur'an which Muslims believe is the direct word of Allah.

Followers of Muslim beliefs place a focus on their lives being led entirely devoted to Allah. They maintain their beliefs that nothing is allowed without Allah's permission. Those who practise Muslim beliefs, believe that humans have free will, however they deliberately choose Allah's way.
