



Program Access & Tour Eligibility

Our College Career & Navigation Sessions (CCNS) and Teen Socratic Circles (TSC) are open to all high school scholars (grades 9–12) at no cost, thanks to the generous support of our funders and investors.

Tour Participation:

Participation in the college tour is **optional**, but scholars must meet the following criteria to be eligible:

Apply with deposit while seats are available (Tour capacity: 40 scholars)

Attend at least 2 CCNS sessions

Participate in at least 1 TSC session

Be on time and actively engaged

Installment 1 – By September 15, 2025 - \$215.00

Final – Mandatory by November 1 - \$215.00

Cost includes chartered motor coach transportation, double occupancy hotel accommodations and 3 meals daily (except travel day), snacks and 1:10 chaperone ratio.

Total program value is approximately \$1900 per student.

WHY A DEPOSIT?

Your deposit helps cover snacks, driver gratuity and other incidentals—ensuring a smooth, affirming experience for every scholar.



Q How do I receive program updates to stay informed?

A We earnestly strive to be intentional about taking sure we keep you In The Know. Questions? Reach Out and monitor your email and text messages. We are planning to primary send any communications on Wednesday's. Do we have your correct email address?

Q How will I know the tour application and payments have been received?

A. You will receive an auto-response. Please save it for reference.

Q How are roommates matched?

A Scholars have the option to select their own or we will help match them. Same sex rooms only. Selections are final.

Q How much extra money do they need?

A Our response is based on your family budget. Scholars like to visit college bookstore gear, toiletries, *more* snacks, etc.

Q Is there a luggage limit?

A No. However, everyone is responsible for toting their own luggage once bags are unloaded.

Q What other forms are required?

A Permission and medical forms, and Student Pledge.

Q: What is the Student Pledge?

A: As a professional organization, we uphold a clear set of standards reflected in our Code of Conduct and Dress Code. This fall, following several summer violations, we will enforce strict adherence to these expectations. All scholars and parents are required to sign the Student Pledge, affirming their understanding of our standards and the consequences for non-compliance. The pledge reinforces our commitment to excellence, accountability, safety, and legacy-building.

Forms will be made available by September 15 and must be received no later than October 31.

Q. Are there assigned seats on the bus?

A During boarding, scholars select their seat for duration of trip.



Q Is there a curfew?

A Yes. The curfew will be clearly listed on each scholar's schedule and is expected to be followed without exception. We reserve the right to adjust curfew times as needed to ensure safety, accountability, and alignment with program activities. Scholars are expected to honor these boundaries as part of our commitment to professionalism and respect for the group experience.

Q Are snacks, blankets and a toiletry/medicine bag permitted?

A Absolutely! Note, that once the bus has been "locked and loaded" below, accessing any of these items isn't permitted.

Q Will parents and scholars have access to chaperones mobile number?

A. Absolutely! Your caring staff is always accessible. Chaperones will also have each of their group's mobile numbers.

Q Why are students asked to arrive to sessions early?

A We have an attendance check-in that positions us to start and end sessions on time. We value your time and

"To be on time is late. To be early is on time." This is one of several principles we teach and model.

This principle reflects our commitment to excellence, respect, and readiness. Scholars are expected to arrive early to all scheduled activities, demonstrating leadership, accountability, and pride in their participation. Timeliness is not just about punctuality—it's about honoring the opportunity and the people who made it possible.

Q Is there a refund policy?

A Yes, %50 if requested in writing (email) by 10/15/2025.



Q Are virtual options available for students who resides out of the area?

A We are working on it. Unfortunately, we do not have expertise or capacity to readily offer this option. We are open to suggestions.

Q Can parents volunteer to chaperone?

A This isn't an ideal option. On the tour, the scholar is on the tour. We are working will be exploring an option for families to travel. It is certainly more cost efficient than driving or flying multiple places.

Q Are their volunteer opportunities?

We are looking for qualified chaperones, meeting space volunteers to assist with the sessions, organize/secure donations for snacks for sessions and tour. If it's YOU or someone you know, please email Ms. G. at agaddis@gaddis4kids.org.

Q: What is "2 x 2"?

A: "2 x 2" is our non-negotiable safety protocol: no scholar should ever wander off alone or without chaperone awareness. This is a critical precaution, especially while traveling. While some scholars may be used to more flexibility at home, college tours and group travel are different. A tour bus, can attract a range of risks. Staying in pairs and keeping staff informed ensures everyone's safety and peace of mind.

Q. My scholar attended CCNS and TSC in the spring. Are they required to begin again?

A. No, once we verify attendance. They do need to attend the Pre-Boarding Brief, and we are encouraging everyone to attend the special session on September 18. There is also a slight price increase to satisfy. If this is YOU, please email Ms. G at agaddis@gaddis4kids.org.



Q Will there be a closing program to celebrate scholars who participated in both Cohorts 1 & 2?

A Yes, we are planning for December where we will also acknowledge the class of 2025 graduates and award scholarships to selected graduates as they return to school in January 2026.
