Full Engagement and Community Commitment

- Scholars are expected to **fully participate in all program components**, both before and during the tour. We are a community. We count on scholars to:
- Attend scheduled sessions and activities.
- Listen attentively and respond promptly to instructions.
- Demonstrate maturity and readiness to be in the program.
- Contribute to a culture of excellence, safety, and mutual respect.

▲ **Note**: Failure to follow directions, especially during travel or in emergency situations—may result in removal from the program at the expense of the participant's parent or guardian.

Scholar Honor Code of Conduct - Highlights





Hotel Expectations & Conduct Guidelines

- To ensure a safe, respectful, and dignified stay for all scholars, the following hotel guidelines must be upheld without exception:
- Nightly Routine |Curfew & Room Safety
- The following day itinerary will be reviewed.
- Scholars must adhere to the nightly curfew. Once chaperones tape doors, no one may exit their room. No excuse is acceptable. Towels, ice, etc., should be secured before the curfew. Do not go to the front desk or ice machine alone.
- In case of emergency, scholars may contact Ms. G anytime via mobile numbers, room numbers, or GroupMe. Scholars will have all chaperone phone numbers.
- This curfew is a critical safety measure and will be strictly enforced.





Noom Visitation & Assignments

- No visitation in rooms of the opposite sex—this includes siblings. No exceptions.
- Scholars must sleep in their assigned rooms. Room changes <u>are not</u> permitted.
 This is a safety precaution. Chaperones will be checking rooms at night and in the morning.

Respect for Hotel Staff & Guests

- Keep noise levels low in rooms, elevators and hallways out of respect for other guests. Trust me when I say, the hotel will call Ms. G!
- Repeat. Do not go to the front desk alone.

Amenities & Access

 If you need to use hotel amenities such as laundry or fitness areas, a chaperone must be present. No exceptions.

Scholar Honor Code of Conduct - Highlights





Lobby Etiquette

- Wear shoes and appropriate clothing in the hotel lobby. No slippers or bonnets in public areas.
 Swimming Policy
- Swimming is not permitted during this tour.

Student Safety & Conduct Guidelines

• To ensure a safe, respectful, and enriching experience for all participants, the following expectations must be upheld throughout the tour:

Identification Badges

- All scholars must always wear their assigned identification badge.
- Badges help chaperones quickly identify students, especially in crowded or unfamiliar settings.
- They are required for meal access on campus and at restaurants.
- Scholars are responsible for keeping track of their badges.





Buddy System & Group Integrity

- Scholars must never venture off alone—no exceptions.
- The two-by-two rule is mandatory. You and your partner must notify a chaperone before separating from the group for any reason.
- Violation of this policy may result in expulsion from the tour to ensure group safety and accountability.

Situational Awareness & Emergency Protocols

- Scholars will receive Situational Awareness training at the start of the tour.
- Chaperones will review evacuation procedures and safety protocols.
- In any situation, students must follow the directions of chaperones and campus personnel without hesitation.





Bus Etiquette

- Your seat selection with your roommate becomes your assigned seat for the week.
- Keep a **personal bus bag** with essentials (shoes, medications, etc.). Bus storage is only accessible at hotel stops.
- You should bring a pillow and blanket for comfort.
- Clean your seat area before each stop. A \$10 fine will be assessed if your area is trashed.
- No beverages without lids.
- If the bus is left messy, eating privileges may be revoked.
- Please do not make "a deposit" that will permeate the atmosphere. Take advantage of rest breaks and ask if you must "take care of biz."





Campus Visit Etiquette

- Scholars should stay in their assigned groups. There will be plenty of time to talk with other scholars.
- Ask questions and take notes, this is your moment to shine.
- Speak confidently and clearly. Stand when asking questions in auditoriums.
- Research each campus beforehand to ask informed questions.
- Be attentive during presentations and tours. Avoid side conversations.
- Use mobile devices only for notetaking.
- Be courteous to college personnel and fellow visitors.
- Respect the campus you are visiting. Do not wear attire from another university.

Student Honor Code of Conduct - Highlights





Non-Negotiables

The following behaviors are prohibited and grounds for immediate removal:

- Uncooperativeness. It requires too much energy from staff and interrupts other scholars.
- Theft, taunting, teasing, name-calling, fighting, weapons
- Harassment of any kind, including sexual, racial, religious, or orientation-based
- Obscene language, profanity, or derogatory terms
- Drugs, vaping, tobacco, alcohol, and unregistered non-prescription medications

Sexual Engagement Policy

- Sexual engagement of any kind is prohibited during the Jump Start College Experience.
- This includes physical intimacy, suggestive behavior, or any conduct that violates personal boundaries or community standards.
- Students are expected to **honor one another's dignity**, respect personal space, and refrain from any behavior that could compromise the integrity of the program.

Why WVGF Embraces a Dress Code

At the Willie and Vivian Gaddis Foundation, we believe modest dress promotes safety, dignity, and unity—especially in educational and community settings. This standard reflects our commitment to helping youth show up well, honor their legacy, and engage with purpose.

Focus Area - Reduces Distractions & Conflicts

Key Benefit - Encourages a respectful environment and minimizes peer pressure tied to fashion trends

Focus Area - Enhances Physical Safety

Key Benefit - Ensures comfort and mobility during walking tours, outdoor activities, and campus events

Focus Area - Prevents unwanted attention

Key Benefit - Helps youth avoid unwanted scrutiny in public spaces allowing focus on learning and connection

ATTIRE GUIDELINES: General Expectations

- **Tops**: T-shirts, polos, or casual button-down shirts Avoid overly graphic or offensive prints.
- Bottoms: Jeans, khakis, casual pants, knee-length skirts, shorts, or capris
- **Shoes**: Comfortable sneakers or casual flats Expect lots of walking—choose wisely!
- Layers: Light jacket or sweater for changing weather
- Accessories: Minimal jewelry and a backpack for essentials
- Weather Awareness: Consider the forecast and campus culture when choosing your outfit

What to Avoid

- Revealing Clothing: Jumpsuits/catsuits, crop tops, short shorts, see-through fabrics
- Footwear: Flip-flops, fuzzy slippers, or sandals not suited for walking
- Athletic Wear: Sweatpants, gym shorts, or overly casual attire
- **Inappropriate Messaging**: Clothing or accessories that promote drugs, alcohol, tobacco, profanity, gang signs, or negative social statements
- Sagging: Not permitted—undergarments must remain covered at all times
- Headwear Indoors: Hats, do-rags, curlers, bonnets, and bandannas should be removed inside buildings
- **Tops to Avoid**: See-through blouses, tank tops, tube tops, sleeveless muscle shirts, spaghetti straps, halter tops, or bare midriffs
- Bottoms to Avoid: Leggings or yoga pants worn as pants; dresses with slits above the knee (finger-tip rule applies)

Travel Packing List

 To ensure a smooth and comfortable experience, please pack the following essentials:

Clothing & Comfort

- Comfortable walking shoes (plus an extra pair, just in case!)
- Clothes for the full duration of the trip, including undergarments
- Sweater or jacket for cooler weather
- Blanket and/or pillow for the bus

Daily Essentials

- A watch or cell phone to keep track of time
- Toiletries: deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, and other personal items
- Medications (if needed—please pack securely and label clearly)

Weather Readiness

Umbrella or raincoat for unexpected weather

Hoodie Expectations for Scholars

- We welcome hoodies as part of our scholars' everyday style. To ensure our spaces remain respectful, affirming, and mission-aligned, we ask that all hoodie choices reflect the following:
- Clean and Presentable: Hoodies should be free of stains, tears, or excessive wear.
- **Respectful Messaging**: No offensive language, imagery, or symbols. We celebrate self-expression rooted in dignity and pride.
- **Hoods Down Indoors**: For safety and connection, scholars should keep hoods down during indoor programming unless otherwise approved.
- Program-Ready Style: Oversized or layered hoodies should not interfere with participation, visibility, or engagement.
- Legacy-Inspired Looks: Scholars are encouraged to wear hoodies that uplift culture, community, and personal identity.
