Sacred Arts Festival 16-22 August

Now in its seventh year, the Edinburgh Festival of the Sacred Arts is an integral part of the Fringe. Drawing on the rich Christian inheritance in music, visual art, architecture, drama, poetry and film, it brings churches, artists, performers and musicians together, enabling them to make a significant contribution to the cultural life of the City at Festival time. The 2026 Festival of the Sacred Arts will run from Sunday August 16th to Saturday August 22nd. An opening service in St Giles Cathedral is followed by a week of recitals, competition finals, poetry readings, drama and film screening, and an art exhibition - 'Bordering on the Sacred' - to which artists from all over Scotland have contributed. 'Exploring Sacred Space' is a series of guided tours, organised in conjunction with the National Churches Trust, which offers the opportunity to explore some of Edinburgh's less well-known architectural glories. The week ends with the beautiful evening service of Orthodox Vespers.
