## **10 Basic Leadership Expectations**

- 1. All leaders should have a growing personal relationship with Jesus Christ and should be a good example for others to follow.
  - a. Leaders should have developed in their life a discipline of regular prayer, Bible study, and worship.
  - b. Leaders should be maturing and developing in their personal walk with Jesus.
  - c. Leaders should strive to be Christlike in everything they do.
- 2. All leaders should faithfully attend regular church services whenever possible.
  - a. Leaders should be on time and faithful.
  - b. Leaders should be good examples to the church membership by making church a top priority of their weekly lives.
- 3. Leaders are expected to be members of Tuxedo Church.
  - a. Membership demonstrates a leader is committed to the vision and purpose of TC.
- 4. Leaders are expected to attend the monthly prayer meeting typically held the last Sunday night of each month.
- 5. All leaders should attend the yearly leadership meeting, quarterly leadership meetings, and any other leadership meetings that may arise during the year.
- 6. All leaders are expected to be good stewards according to the word of God, by paying tithes and giving offerings.
- 7. All leaders should be faithful, on time, and prepared for the work and service they do in the church.
- 8. Leaders are expected to be in submission to the authority that God has established within the church. Leadership is a blessing, not an entitlement.
- 9. Leaders are expected to be a positive witness for Christ and Tuxedo Church in the community.
- 10. Leaders should conduct themselves in a Christlike manner at all times.
  - a. Leaders should have positive and Christlike attitudes.
  - b. Leaders should have positive and Christlike actions.
  - c. Leaders should not: gossip, backbite, or run down others in the church.
  - d. Leaders should not stir strife or division within the church.
  - e. Leaders should put others before themselves.
  - f. Leaders should be willing to serve and bless others.
  - g. Leaders should be humble.
