JPMA Cares launched a robust <u>Safe Sleep Campaign</u>, in partnership with <u>Cribs for Kids</u> and <u>Safe Kids Worldwide</u>, because more than 3,700 babies in the U.S. die each year from sleep-related deaths, and underserved communities are impacted disproportionately. The campaign aimed to deliver easy-to-understand, consistent advice about safe sleep to parents and caregivers across geographies, ethnicities, religions, and cultures.

JPMA Cares successfully leveraged baby safety ambassadors nationwide to amplify existing efforts, products, and education needed for specific programs, and contributed on a micro level to those in need, making a real, tangible impact on the lives of babies and young children, consistent with the spirit and culture of the industry.

Through our expanded microgrant program, JPMA Cares awarded microgrants to 11 organizations nationwide, championing safe sleep for babies and young children in an effort to help break down barriers to successful outcomes and ensure fundamental needs are met.

All For Moms Foundation

An overarching goal is to reduce the infant/child mortality rate in targeted areas by identifying health system interventions for improvement, including prenatal care, social support services, education, home visitation, and community-based outreach after periodic review and analysis of abstracted regional infant and child deaths.

Injury Prevention - Thanks to product donations, safety activities were held in 123 cities in 40 states throughout the week leading up to and including National Injury Prevention Day.

Safe Sleep Campaign - The Newborn Channel aired the Safe Sleep video in 432 hospital maternity wards nationwide, appearing 2,880 times each month in October, November, and December, generating 1,342,686 total impressions each month.

Giving Tuesday - Thanks to the generous donations of three former JPMA staff executives, together with individual contributions, JPMA Cares raised \$67,590.

National Heatstroke Prevention Awareness - JPMA Cares joined forces with other like-minded stakeholders in an effort to raise awareness about preventing hot car tragedies and share proven strategies and tips for parents and caregivers.



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
