2026 IMPACT REPORT

Trails & Conservation

- ✓ Imported approximately **35 yards** of rip rap rock to prevent erosion.
- ✓ Planted and monitored **317** native species to support biodiversity.
- ✓ Ensured public safety and accessibility on **3.5 miles of recreational public access easements**.
- ✓ Monitored **132 acres of open space** in the Coastal Zone.
- ✓ Installed preventative measures for coastal bluff erosion including **40 recycled oyster wattles** which repurposed **1,375 pounds of oyster shells**.
- ✓ Treated approximately **12,100 sq. ft. of native habitat** by removing **1,025 lbs.** of invasive Algerian Sea Lavender plants.
- ✓ Removed **3 pounds of discarded fishing line** from Hubbs Coastal Trail.
- ✓ **Removed 1,494 pounds of trash and invasive species** during Lagoon Kahuna Clean Up.
- ✓ **45 native plants** were prorogated in our greenhouse and given away to the public.
- ✓ **212 lbs. of trash** removed from the lagoon through weekly trail checks.
- ✓ **Collected 181 lbs.** of unsold **organic** produce from Jimbo's to use for our animal feed.
- ✓ Volunteers and fellows utilized iNaturalist to tag and map **498 invasive species**.



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Education

- ✓ Served **10,129 students** through the Academy for Environmental Stewardship school field trips.
- ✓ Attended **57** outreach opportunities with educational lessons on general information about the Foundation, or Animal Ambassador visits totaling **1,725 people**.
- ✓ Partnered with hotel properties to provide outreach experiences for more than **1,834** resort guests.
- ✓ Provided **30 unique groups** with concentrated raptor experiences.

Discovery Campus

- ✓ Our daily Discover & Learn Series served over **3,385 guests**.
- ✓ Expanded daily public hours to **9:00 AM–5:00 PM**.
- ✓ Hosted **6,139 volunteers** across all programs and opportunities.
- ✓ **33,550** people walked through our Discovery Campus doors as guests to engage in environmental educational activities.
