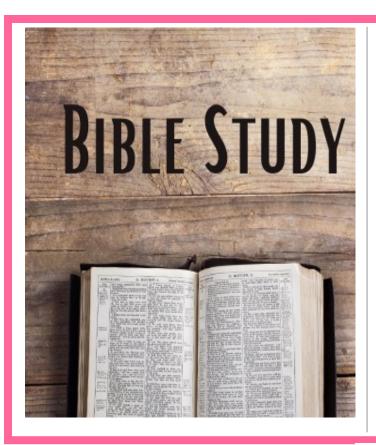

Only bingo boards provided by Euclid Senior Programs are permitted for play.

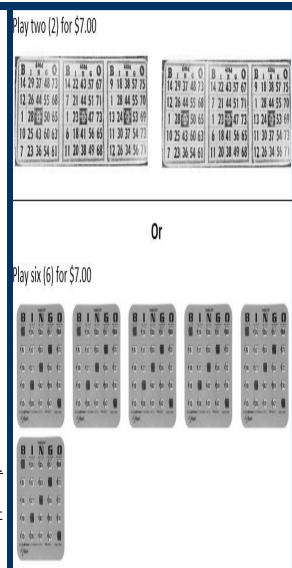
All boards must be returned to the bingo cart and stored away at the conclusion of the bingo session.

- Bingo must be claimed by yelling "Bingo." You can only bingo on the last number called. No exceptions.

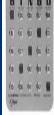

- Please call to cancel if you will not be home for meal delivery. We will attempt to make sure you are safe by calling you, your emergency contact, and Euclid Police for a welfare check, if necessary.
- Euclid Senior Programs Drivers are not permitted to do other personal activities like taking out the trash, making phone calls, etc.

A Few Safety Tips to Stay Safe and Healthy During the Winter Months and Holidays

- **Lights and decorations:** Inspect all lights for damage before use and never overload outlets.

 Use outdoor-safe lights outdoors and unplug all lights when you leave the house or go to bed.

 Ensure artificial trees are flame-resistant and real trees are kept away from heat sources.
- **Candles:** Keep candles at least 12 inches from flammable materials and on a stable, non-flammable surface. Use battery-operated flameless candles as a safer alternative.
- **Fireplaces and heaters:** Never leave fireplaces or space heaters unattended. Make sure your fireplace is cleaned and the flue is open before use. Do not burn wrapping paper in the fireplace.
- Smoke alarms: Check that your smoke alarms are working and replace the batteries as needed.
- Check the weather: Be extra cautious in Northeast Ohio, where conditions can change quickly. Check the forecast before you leave and be aware of dark, icy, or rainy conditions.
- **Drive sober:** Avoid driving under the influence of alcohol, as there is an increased awareness of OVI offenses during the holidays.
- **Be aware in parking lots:** Pay attention to pedestrians and other vehicles, and wear non-skid footwear on icy sidewalks and in parking lots.
- **Be aware of your surroundings:** Be careful in crowded places and keep an eye on small children.
- Report suspicious activity: Contact law enforcement to report anything suspicious.
- **Health precautions:** Consider wearing a mask indoors in crowded areas to protect against COVID-19 and other seasonal illnesses like the flu.
- **Emergency calls:** Use 911 for emergencies only. For non-emergencies, contact the local police non-emergency number.
