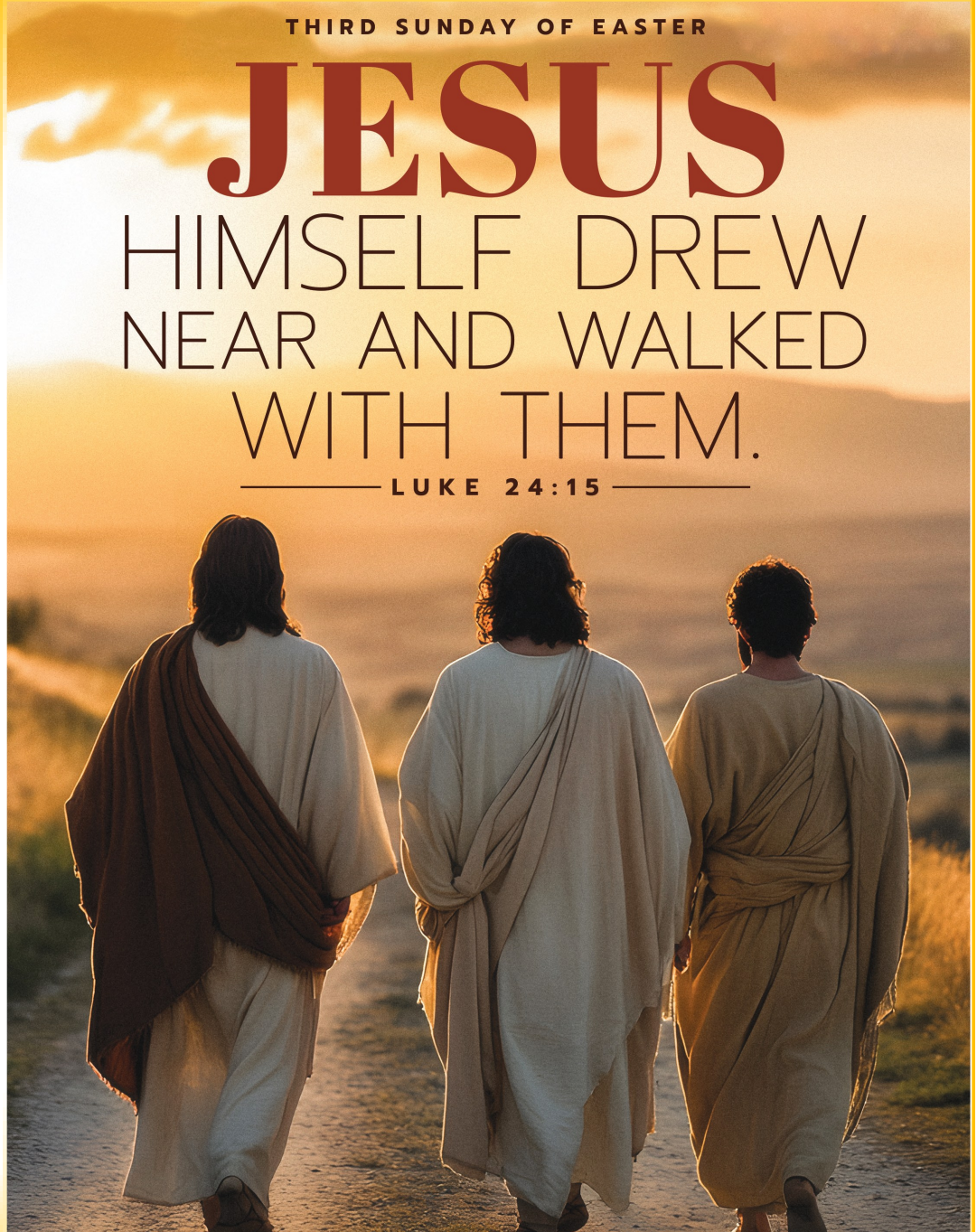

## Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,  
I would like to greet you with the words of the Risen Christ to his disciples in the Upper Room:  
**“Peace be with you!”**

These were the first words of Jesus on that Easter night—words not of judgment, but of mercy, reassurance, and new beginning. He came not to condemn their fear or their failures, but to restore them. As the Gospel reminds us, **“Do not be afraid”** and **“Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe.”**

I hope that your Easter season is coming along very well and remains filled with new life, renewed faith, and abundant grace.

After His resurrection, Jesus asked Peter three times, **“Do you love me?”** Why three times? Even Peter was hurt and distressed when Jesus asked the third time. Then it dawned on him—he had denied Jesus three times. Yet the Lord did not dwell on Peter’s past. Instead, He entrusted him with a mission:

**“Feed my lambs... Tend my sheep.”**

Love leads to mission. Mercy leads to responsibility.

After their Master died, the disciples were disoriented and in despair. So they returned to what they knew before—fishing. The dream seemed ended, the vision gone, the mission forgotten. But Jesus met them there, even in their emptiness. As the Gospel says, **“Cast the net on the right side... and you will find something.”**

And they did. Because without Him, we can do nothing—but with Him, everything changes. We also remember the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. They walked with Jesus, but **they did not recognize Him**. Their eyes were prevented from seeing. They were talking about Him, saddened by what had happened, yet unaware that He was right beside them. Isn’t this sometimes our experience too?

There are moments when we feel lost, confused, or disappointed—when God seems distant or silent. Yet the truth of the Gospel is this: **He is walking with us even when we do not recognize Him**. It was only in the breaking of the bread that their eyes were opened. And they said to one another, **“Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way?”**

My dear friends, the Lord continues to reveal Himself—in His Word, in the Eucharist, and in the ordinary moments of our lives. The challenge is not that He is absent, but that we sometimes fail to see. Jesus knew the hearts of His disciples. He came not to scold or embarrass them, but to gently restore them. He stood among them and said again, **“Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”**

This is our call too: to move from fear to faith, from doubt to trust, from blindness to recognition, from receiving peace to sharing it.

My dear friends, like the disciples in the Upper Room, by the Sea, and on the road to Emmaus, we are all on a journey of recognizing the Risen Lord. May our eyes be opened, our hearts set on fire, and our lives renewed with purpose.

Enjoy the Easter season! May God bless you always. Be respectful, be kind—because this is how we love our neighbor and cherish the gift of life.

**“Lord, let your face shine on us.” (Psalm 4)**

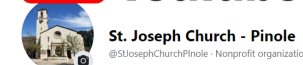

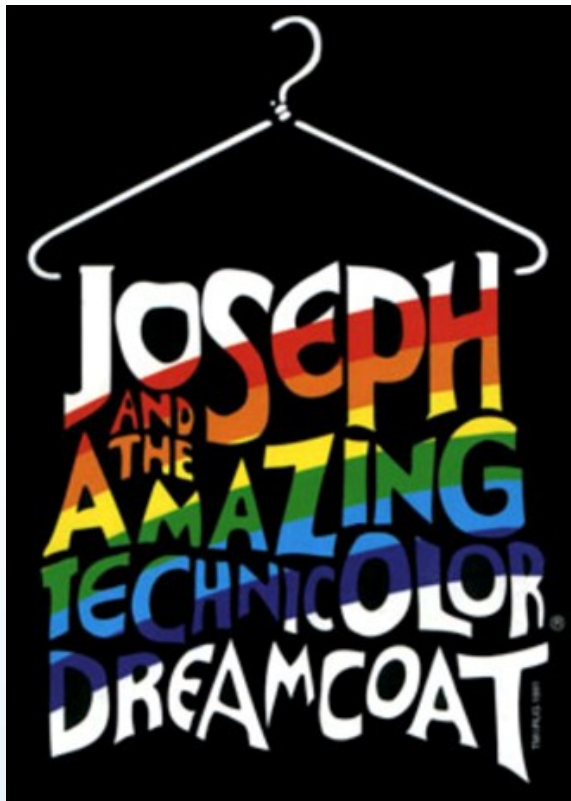

### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

#### End of the World

##### Question:

What do Catholics believe about the end of the world?

##### Answer:

We hear the phrase “the end of the world” casually today. Often in film or media, it means the end of civil society or the threat of human annihilation by natural disasters. For the Christian, our perspective is distinctly Christ-centered. Numerous times through the Gospel, Jesus notes that he will come again, even after he has ascended into heaven. The Church typically refers to this as the Second Coming of Jesus or the Latin “Parousia,” meaning “presence” or “arrival.”

We believe that Christ will come again, and at his Second Coming, temporal time will end. Human history will end, at least as we know it. However, it doesn't mean that creation will be destroyed. The book of Revelation speaks of a renewal, indeed a “*new heaven and a new earth*” (Rev 21:1). Christ will come again in glory. Our souls will be reunited with our bodies. While our lives were judged individually at our deaths, which we call the particular judgment, something new will happen here. Theologians call it the general judgment or the last judgment, in which our deeds and the effects — for good or ill — will be known to all. For the early Christians, this second coming was hoped for! They knew it was the completion of God's work of redemption for the human race. We, too, should pray with them, “Come Lord Jesus!”



### POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

#### Fin del Mundo

##### Pregunta:

¿Qué creen los católicos sobre el fin del mundo?

##### Respuesta:

Hoy escuchamos la frase “el fin del mundo” casualmente. A menudo en el cine o los medios de comunicación, significa el fin de la sociedad civil o la amenaza de aniquilación humana por desastres naturales. Para el cristiano, nuestra perspectiva está claramente centrada en Cristo. Numerosas veces a través del Evangelio, Jesús señala que vendrá de nuevo, incluso después de haber ascendido al cielo. La Iglesia generalmente se refiere a esto como la Segunda Venida de Jesús o el latín “Parousia”, que significa “presencia” o “llegada”. Creemos que Cristo vendrá de nuevo, y en su Segunda Venida, el tiempo temporal terminará. La historia humana terminará, al menos tal como la conocemos. Sin embargo, eso no significa que la creación será destruida. El libro del Apocalipsis habla de una renovación, más aún, de un «*cielo nuevo y una tierra nueva*» (Ap 21, 1). Cristo vendrá de nuevo en gloria. Nuestras almas se reunirán con nuestros cuerpos. Si bien nuestras vidas fueron juzgadas individualmente en nuestras muertes, lo que llamamos el juicio particular, algo nuevo sucederá aquí. Los teólogos lo llaman el juicio general o el juicio final, en el que nuestras acciones y los efectos, para bien o para mal, serán conocidos por todos. ¡Para los primeros cristianos, se esperaba esta segunda venida! Sabían que era la finalización de la obra de redención de Dios para la raza humana. Nosotros también debemos orar con ellos: “¡Ven Señor Jesús!”
