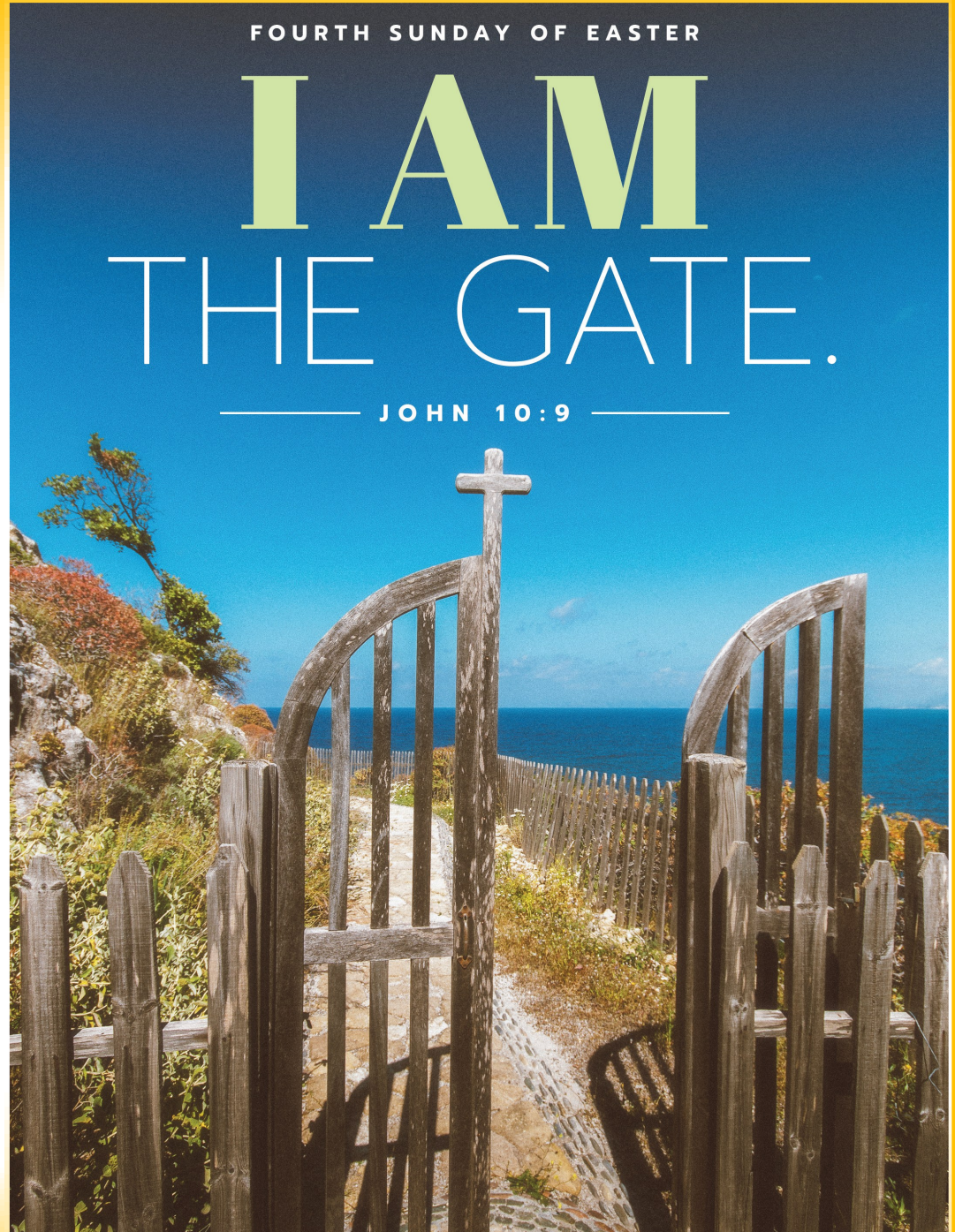

Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

We are now on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, and I hope the joy of the risen Jesus is still alive in your hearts. Easter is not just a day we passed—it is a season meant to shape how we live, how we treat one another, and how we see the world around us.

Thank you again for your generous support of our community. Your willingness to give—joyfully and humbly—is a true reflection of stewardship. In a world that often encourages us to hold tightly to what we have, you continue to open your hands and your heart. That spirit of generosity is a powerful witness of faith. When we give back to God in gratitude, we discover that we are blessed in ways far beyond what we offer.

I'm also grateful to share that our parish has exceeded our Bishop's Appeal goal by over 13%—and in just five months. This is a remarkable achievement, especially in times when many are facing uncertainty and financial pressure. Because of your commitment, anything above our goal will be returned to our parish, allowing us to continue strengthening our ministries and outreach. This is truly good news for all of us.

This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday. I humbly ask for your prayers—for me and for all who are called to shepherd God's people. Leading a community of faith today comes with real challenges. We live in a time marked by division, rapid change, and many competing voices. Pray that I may always listen for and follow the voice of the Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ, with faithfulness and courage.

The Gospel reminds us of something deeply relevant for our world today: when Jesus was insulted, he did not respond with insult; when he suffered, he did not threaten. Instead, he entrusted himself to God. In a culture where anger can spread quickly and words can wound deeply—especially online and in public discourse—this example calls us to a different way of living.

As Easter people, we are called to walk away from the darkness we see around us: hatred, division, isolation, and indifference. These realities are present not only in the world but sometimes in our own hearts. Instead, we are invited to walk in the light—choosing love over hostility, understanding over judgment, humility over pride, and hope over despair. Our faith is meant to be visible in how we live each day.

My grandfather once shared this wisdom: "Live a good and honorable life so that when you look back, you will be able to enjoy it a second time." That advice feels especially meaningful today. Life moves quickly, and it can be easy to get caught up in worry, comparison, or negativity.

So, live each day with intention. Let go of gossip and resentment. In your families, seek peace—focus on the present rather than reopening past wounds. Choose kindness in your words and patience in your actions. And remember our shared responsibility to care for creation, being good stewards of the earth entrusted to us.

I would also like to warmly congratulate our First Communion children who will be receiving Christ for the first time this weekend and next. This is a beautiful and important moment in their lives and in the life of our parish. Thank you to the Faith Formation Team: Christine Saurez, our catechists, volunteers, and parents who have lovingly guided them on this journey of faith.

Finally, enjoy the gift of life. Be joyful. And if you find yourself with more than you need, look for ways to help others while you are still here to do so. That is where true treasure is found, and it is where the deepest satisfaction of the heart begins.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

“The sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice,” Jesus says. Do we know the voice of Jesus when he speaks to us? Have we spent time in conversation with him? This week, listen for the voice of Jesus in your life, and follow where it leads.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Exaltation of the Cross

Question:

What is the history behind the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross?

Answer:

Emperor Constantine's mother, Helena, is credited with having discovered the true cross around 330. She traveled to the Holy Land and uncovered the places associated with Jesus' life. Legend has it that Helena un-

covered three crosses but was not able to detect the true cross until each of them was laid on a leper. Only one of them cured the leper, proving it to be the true cross. A great church was built at the site, and soon various portions of the cross were sent to other churches as relics to be venerated.

The day after the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, September 14, 335, the actual cross was displayed for veneration. Egeria, a women traveler to Jerusalem around the year 386, kept a diary that has survived. She tells of the unique veneration of the wood of the cross that took place on Good Friday, something maintained ritually to this very day.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross focuses on the gift of love that Jesus manifested by his total gift of self, offered for all. The cross, the ultimate form of capital punishment in its day, has become for us the ultimate symbol of love and triumph over evil and death.

POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Exaltación de la Cruz

Pregunta:

¿Cuál es la historia detrás de la fiesta de la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz?

Respuesta:

A la madre del emperador Constantino, Helena, se le atribuye haber descubierto la verdadera cruz alrededor del año 330. Viajó a Tierra Santa y descubrió los lugares asociados con la vida de Jesús. Cuenta la leyenda que Helena descubrió tres cruces, pero no pudo detectar la verdadera cruz hasta que cada una de ellas fue colocada sobre un leproso. Solo una de ellas curó al leproso, demostrando que era la verdadera cruz. Se construyó una gran iglesia en el sitio, y pronto varias partes de la cruz fueron enviadas a otras iglesias como reliquias para ser veneradas.

El día después de la dedicación de la Iglesia del Santo Sepulcro, el 14 de septiembre de 335, se exhibió la cruz real para su veneración. Egeria, una viajera a Jerusalén alrededor del año 386, llevó un diario que ha sobrevivido. Cuenta la singular veneración del madero de la cruz que tuvo lugar el Viernes Santo, algo que se mantiene ritualmente hasta el día de hoy.

La Exaltación de la Santa Cruz se centra en el don del amor que Jesús manifestó por su entrega total de sí mismo, ofrecido por todos. La cruz, la forma máxima de pena capital en su día, se ha convertido para nosotros en el símbolo supremo del amor y el triunfo sobre el mal y la muerte.

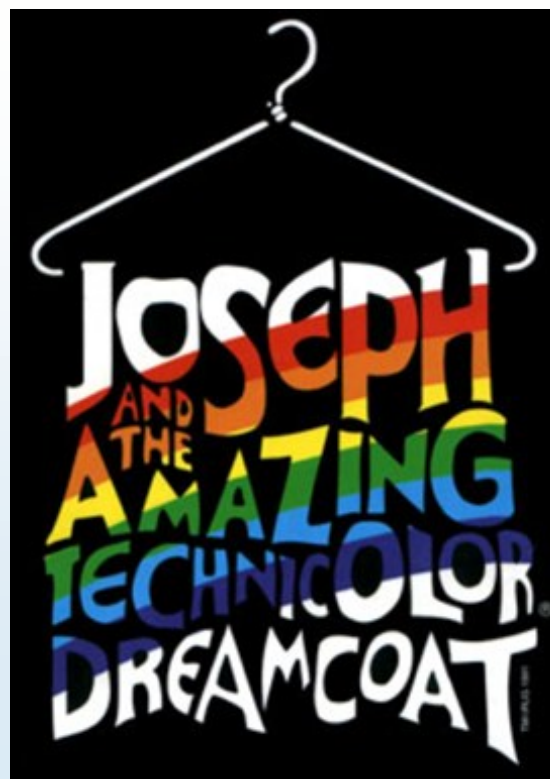
