My dear friends in Christ,

I hope you are enjoying these beautiful summer days!

Though summer often brings a sense of calm, you might think there would not be much happening in our parish community during this season. But not for us. It has been a particularly busy summer. We have celebrated so many important events, from funerals to First Communions and baptisms. This past weekend, we had the privilege of gathering for our Deanery Jubilee Year of Hope Mass with Bishop Michael Barber, joined by priests and faithful from our deanery parishes. And today, we were blessed to welcome Bishop James Thoppi from the Diocese of Kohima, India.

As we continue to live out our faith, it is important to remember that our understanding of it is key to truly celebrating and practicing it. The more deeply we understand our faith, the more meaningful it becomes in our lives.

Today, I would like to share a bit more about the two main types of prayer in our tradition: **Liturgical** and **Devotional**.

Liturgical Prayer

Liturgical prayer is the public worship of the Church. The word “liturgy” itself means “public work” or “service on behalf of the whole people.” Unlike personal or private prayer, liturgical prayer is the collective prayer of the assembly, gathered as God’s people. In Christian tradition, liturgy is our participation in the “work of God”—specifically, the public worship of God by His Church.

The core of liturgical prayer includes the Mass, the sacraments, and the Divine Office (or Liturgy of the Hours). The Eucharistic celebration, especially the Divine Sacrifice of the Eucharist, is the primary act of worship for Catholics. It is in this act that the “work of our redemption is accomplished.” Through liturgy, we offer God praise and thanksgiving.

The Church calls us to “full participation” in this sacred work. As the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* reminds us: “Those who have faith in Christ, when present at this mystery of faith, should not be there as strangers or silent spectators. On the contrary, through an adequate understanding of the rites and prayers, they should take part in the sacred action, conscious of what they are doing.”

Every person’s participation in the Eucharist is vital; we are not bystanders or secondary participants in the liturgical celebration. Each of us has an important role in the worship of the Church.

Devotional Prayers

Devotional prayers, while not part of the official liturgy, are deeply connected to it. They can be personal or communal practices that enhance our relationship with God. There are two types of devotional prayers:

1. **Those that extend the sacraments**, such as the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.
2. **Those that can be done privately or in groups**, such as praying the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, or Novenas.

Though devotional prayers are not part of the liturgy itself, they still hold an important place in our spiritual lives. While liturgical prayer, especially the Eucharist, takes precedence because it is the celebration of the Body of Christ, devotional prayers have the power to strengthen the entire Church. Even in private devotion, the graces we receive flow outward, enriching the Body of Christ.

In Conclusion

Both liturgical and devotional prayers are essential elements of our faith life. Liturgical prayer is the communal expression of worship, but devotional prayer offers a deeply personal connection to God, strengthening our individual spiritual journeys. Together, they form a beautiful balance that nourishes both our community and our personal faith.

May God bless each one of you, and may you find peace in the prayer that connects us all.

REGISTRATIONS & Start Dates for Grades 7 to 12:

**** 2025-2026** Registrations are OPEN and will CLOSE when classes begin - For families with returning, continuing or new students rising to grades 7 to high school, our Registration Packets are now available at the Parish Center during office hours and in PDF format, online at <https://campsite.bio/ymsjcpinole>. **** CLASS for 7th and 8th graders** - This class is for rising 7th & 8th graders who have never had spiritual formation, who are continuing with their next grade for spiritual formation, or coming for their first year for sacrament preparation. This class begins in September 2025, meets on Wednesdays and ends in May 2026. The MANDATORY first meeting for students and parents in THIS CLASS is September 24, in the church. Specific information is in our Registration Packets.

**** YOUTH FIRST COMMUNION (2nd year, 7th**

grade and older) - This is the second year class for rising 7th to 12th graders who completed their first year in spiritual formation (2024-2025) and would like to prepare for first communion. This class begins in September 2025, meets on Wednesdays and ends in May 2026. Students who complete the requirements for the second year may receive First Communion in the spring of 2026.

**** YOUTH MINISTRY (1st yr, 9th to 12th grade) -**

The St. Joseph Parish Confirmation Program is a two year preparation process. The earliest that a teenager can begin the two year preparation process is 9th grade. His/her first year is called Youth Ministry. This class begins in September 2025, meets on Mondays and ends in May 2026. Students who complete the requirements for the first year are invited in May 2026 to enroll for the second year for the Confirmation class. Students who complete the requirements for the second year may receive Confirmation in the spring of 2027. The MANDATORY first meeting for students and parents in THIS CLASS is September 15, in the church. Specific information is in our Registration Packets.

**** CONFIRMATION (2nd yr, 10th to 12th grade) -**

The appointments for 2024-2025 Youth Ministry families to register for their second year are closing. Please prepare everything that needs to be turned in at your appointment. This is the second year class for teens rising to 10th to 12th grade who completed their first year in Youth Ministry. This class begins in September 2025 and meets on Sundays. Students who complete the requirements for the second year may receive Confirmation in the spring of 2026. The MANDATORY first meeting for students and parents in THIS CLASS is September 14, in the parish school gym.

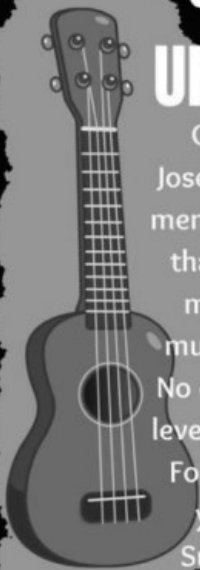

Watching Mass on TV

Question:

Does watching Mass on TV fulfill my Sunday obligation?

Answer:

In the age of instant communication, email, voice mail and teleconferencing, many people wonder if these media of communication can be used for sacraments.

Many priests, I am sure, have had people ask about going to confession on the phone. While it may seem like a convenient way to do things, there are many reasons why we don't.



Watching the Mass on television can be a good thing, especially for those who are shut-in. But it really doesn't fulfill our obligation. The obligation to attend Mass is more than just simply listening to the Mass or following the prayers and the readings. Gathering together as a community of faith is important. Sacraments are community events where we encounter God and one another. When we gather together, we are most visibly the Church, the Body of Christ. Besides, television is a one-way medium. It allows us to watch without really being able to give a response. In faith, our response is as important as anything that we hear. We need to take an active part in the religious expression of our community.

Los sacramentos son eventos comunitarios en los que nos encontramos con Dios y con los demás. Cuando nos reunimos, somos más visiblemente la Iglesia, el Cuerpo de Cristo. Además, la televisión es un medio unidireccional. Nos permite mirar sin poder realmente dar una respuesta. En la fe, nuestra respuesta es tan importante como cualquier cosa que escuchemos. Necesitamos tomar parte activa en la expresión religiosa de nuestra comunidad.

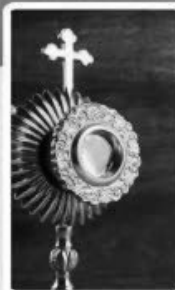

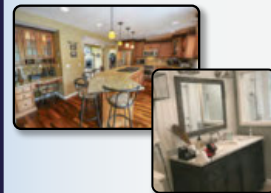
