My dear friends in Christ,

I hope you continue to enjoy these summer days! I think we can all agree that this has been a rather unusual summer—cool, windy, and certainly different from what we usually expect. Yet, every season is a reminder that God is present in all things!

This coming week, our school children will be returning to the classroom after their two-month summer break. We pray that they have enjoyed a wonderful time with their families, relatives, and friends, and that they return refreshed and ready for another year of learning and growth.

We are deeply grateful for our Catholic schools, which for generations have provided an environment where our children can grow in faith, wisdom, and knowledge. Thank you to all the parents who have chosen to entrust the education and faith formation of their children to our Catholic schools, especially here at St. Joseph Parish. Your commitment is a beautiful witness to the importance of forming young disciples of Christ.

As you heard last Sunday, our Oktoberfest is fast approaching! Our theme this year, "TOGETHER WE ARE STRONG," reminds us of the strength that comes when we work together as one family of faith. St. Paul beautifully expresses this truth: "For just as the body is one and has many members... so it is with Christ" (1 Corinthians 12:12). Every gift, every talent, and every helping hand contributes to the life of our parish community.

Last Sunday, Lina Sonico, Chair of the Oktoberfest Committee, shared with us the importance of becoming involved in this year's celebration, especially in the areas where volunteers are still needed. Your willingness to serve would be a great blessing to our parish community.

Life continues to present many challenges, especially with everything happening in our world today. Rising costs, uncertainty, and the burdens we carry can sometimes feel overwhelming. Yet the Gospel reminds us that even amid the storms of life, Jesus is always with us. When Peter began to sink, Jesus immediately reached out His hand and saved him (Matthew 14:22–33). As long as we keep our eyes fixed on Christ and place our trust in Him, we need not be afraid. "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1).

Thank you for your faithful witness, your generosity, and your love for our parish. Together, we may continue to build a community rooted in faith, united in hope, and strengthened by love.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

In the midst of life's greatest storms, Jesus comes to us, but we may not recognize him. We may test him. In doing so, he will test us — and likely, we will fail. But when we falter, his saving hand is there.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Jesus Is Light of the World

Question:

Why do we call Jesus “the light of the world”?

Answer:

In cultures around the world, light and darkness are chief symbols of good and evil, order and chaos, clarity and confusion, hope and despair. These symbols tap into something essential about the nature of things. God has given us the created world as a gift. His first work, as we see in Genesis 1, is to create *light*, giving meaning and insight to the abyss. It is in the light that the rest of creation comes to be. A gathering darkness emerges in Genesis 3. Adam and Eve hide, shrouding themselves from the sun's rays and the gaze of God. While God offers a promise of salvation and establishes

a covenant with His people, the sense of fog and dim understanding still remains. The Hebrew people repeatedly betray the promises they have made to God, and all around them the nations actively worship idols.

The promise of God is not in vain, however. In John 1, we see a depiction of Christ as primordial goodness, order, clarity, and hope. *“The true light, which enlightens everyone was coming into the world ... this life was the light of the human race”* (John 1: 9, 4). Think of the last sunrise you witnessed (if you could wake up for it!). As you watched the lavender brighten to rose edged with gold, did your heart swell? Did you recall the goodness of the world? Did you feel rekindled hope? Such is the role of Christ in the soul. Such is his coming Incarnate in our world.

POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Jesús es la Luz del Mundo

Pregunta:

¿Por qué llamamos a Jesús “la luz del mundo”?

Respuesta:

En culturas de todo el mundo, la luz y la oscuridad son símbolos principales del bien y el mal, orden y caos, claridad y confusión, esperanza y desesperación. Estos símbolos conectan con algo esencial sobre la naturaleza de las cosas. Dios nos ha dado el mundo creado como un regalo. Su primer trabajo, como vemos en Génesis 1, es crear *luz*, dando significado y visión al abismo. Es en la luz donde surge el resto de la creación. Una oscuridad creciente emerge en Génesis 3. Adán y Eva se esconden, protegiéndose de los rayos del sol y de la mirada de Dios. Aunque Dios ofrece una promesa de salvación y establece un pacto con su pueblo, la sensación de niebla y de entendimiento tenue siguen ahí. El pueblo hebreo traiciona repetidamente las promesas que ha hecho a Dios, y a su alrededor las naciones adoran activamente a los ídolos.

Sin embargo, la promesa de Dios no es en vano. En Juan 1, vemos una representación de Cristo como bondad primordial, orden, claridad y esperanza. *“La verdadera luz, que ilumina a todos venía al mundo ... esta vida fue la luz de la raza humana”* (Juan 1:9, 4). Piensa en el último amanecer que presenciaste (¿si pudiste despertarte para ello!). Mientras veías cómo la lavanda se iluminaba hasta convertirse en un borde dorado, ¿se te hinchó el corazón? ¿Recordabas la bondad del mundo? ¿Sentiste una esperanza renovada? Tal es el papel de Cristo en el alma. Así es su llegada encarnada en nuestro mundo.
