

Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

As we approach the final week of our Advent preparation for the celebration of Christmas, I ask: Are you still with us on this journey? What have you experienced in these weeks of waiting and reflection? What challenges have you faced along the way?

These questions are vital. As I have shared before, the demands of life can easily weigh us down, and sometimes, as Christmas draws near, we may find ourselves stumbling towards the finish line, lacking the strength and spirit we need to fully embrace the season.

Over the past two Sundays, we have heard the voice of John the Baptist, calling us to repentance and to prepare the way for the Lord. His message, though clear, is difficult. John's appearance, as we know, was not exactly inviting. He came from the wilderness—filthy, dressed in tattered clothes—and his message often invited mockery or skepticism. People questioned, "Who is this man?" And yet, those who listened and followed were transformed, while those who did not go astray.

John's mission was unequivocal: he prepared the way for the Good News of Jesus Christ. In today's Gospel from Matthew, we hear the angel's message to Joseph, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son, and you are to name Him Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins."

The child born to Mary, Jesus, will fulfill the prophecy of Isaiah: "The virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and they shall call Him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us." This is the heart of Christmas—God coming to dwell with us, to save us from our sins, and to restore us to Himself.

To help us better understand the meaning of Christmas, let me share this story:

It was Christmas time in a middle-class community, and the parish priest received several gifts from his parishioners—each beautifully wrapped with ribbons and bows. One by one, they came, presenting their gifts. A son of a bakery owner handed the priest a package, and with a smile, the priest said, "Ah, I know what's inside—chocolate cakes!"

Next, a meat shop owner gave a gift. The priest sniffed the box and said, "I know what this is—my favorite homemade sausages!"

Then came a gift from the owner of a wine store. The priest, confident in his ability, took a sniff, but could not quite place the scent. He shook the box but did not hear the familiar clink of bottles. Finally, some fluid leaked out, and after tasting it, he exclaimed, "This doesn't taste like wine!"

Intrigued, he opened the box and was surprised to find a puppy inside.

Just as the priest could not predict the contents of that last gift, we cannot presume to understand the value of God's gift to us this Christmas without opening our hearts. Christmas is not a time for guessing the contents of our gifts, but for appreciating them. The true gift within every gift is not only the contents but the love and sacrifice of the giver.

This Christmas, let us celebrate the peace, joy, and love that God has poured into our lives. Christmas is not just a beautiful memory to revisit—it is the living reality of God's love made flesh in Jesus Christ. It is a love that should remain alive in our hearts throughout the year. As Psalm 24 reminds us, "Let the Lord enter!" Let us make room for Him this Christmas and every day.

Tithing vs. Stewardship

Question: What is the difference between tithing and stewardship?

Answer: Both tithing and stewardship are part of a spiritual way of life that calls us to use all of our resources for the service of the Gospel. Everything we are and everything we have comes from God. Offering back to God what He has given us is part of how we worship and give thanks to God.

Tithing is the practice of giving back 10 percent of what we earn. It comes from the Old English word for "ten." The first Scriptural example of tithing came from Abraham who gave a tenth of his possessions to the priest Melchizedek. He did so as an act of thanksgiving to God.

Stewardship as a way of life calls us to use well all that

we have and all that we are, placing all things in service of others and God. Stewardship helps us see the good we can accomplish by making God and our spiritual life the most important values in our life. Whatever we accumulate in this life stays here. We can't take it with us! Both tithing and stewardship help us remember that nothing is mine or even ours ... all belongs to God.

El primer ejemplo bíblico de diezmo vino de Abraham, quien dio la décima parte de sus posesiones al sacerdote Melquisedec. Lo hizo como un acto de acción de gracias a Dios.

La corresponsabilidad como forma de vida nos llama a usar bien todo lo que tenemos y todo lo que somos, poniendo todas las cosas al servicio de los demás y de Dios. La corresponsabilidad nos ayuda a ver el bien que podemos lograr al hacer de Dios y nuestra vida espiritual los valores más importantes en nuestra vida. Todo lo que acumulamos en esta vida se queda aquí. ¡No podemos llevárnoslo con nosotros! Tanto el diezmo como la corresponsabilidad nos ayudan a recordar que nada es mío ni siquiera nuestro... todo pertenece a Dios.


