

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is truly good to be home after a short break following a very busy and blessed Christmas season!

I am especially excited to share that Tony Melendez—the gifted musician who sang for Pope Saint John Paul II during his pastoral visit to the United States more than 30 years ago—will be coming to our community to lead our Parish Lenten Mission. What a tremendous gift for our parish! I am deeply grateful to Olga Villeda, Chair of the Pastoral Council, Myrtle Dawana, and all the members of the Pastoral Council, for helping to make this possible. I invite you to share this excitement and to bring your friends and loved ones to these days of prayer, reflection, and renewal, especially during a time when so many are living with fear and uncertainty.

In these days, as we witness pain, unrest, and deep wounds in our communities and throughout the world—particularly here in Minneapolis—the Word of God speaks to us with both honesty and hope.

The prophet urges us: “Seek the LORD, all you humble of the earth... seek justice, seek humility.” This is not a passive invitation. It calls us to turn our hearts toward God precisely when fear, anger, and confusion press in on us. Scripture never denies the reality of suffering; it names it honestly and then shows us a path forward.

God promises to preserve a remnant—a humble and lowly people—who take refuge not in power, violence, or deceit, but in the name of the Lord. These are people who strive to do no wrong, tell no lies, and live in a way that allows others to rest without fear. This is the quiet strength of holiness in a wounded world.

In the Gospel, Jesus looks upon the crowds and proclaims a kingdom that seems upside down by worldly standards. He blesses the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, the merciful, the peacemakers, and those who hunger and thirst for righteousness. He does not glorify cruelty or domination. Instead, He assures us that God draws closest to those who grieve, those who long for justice, and those who work for peace—even at great personal cost.

Today, many are mourning lives lost, trust broken, communities divided. Jesus tells us plainly: they will be comforted. Many hunger and thirst for righteousness—for fairness, dignity, and healing. Jesus promises they will be satisfied. And to those who choose the difficult and courageous work of mercy and peacemaking, He gives a powerful name: children of God.

As a parish, we are called to respond not with indifference or despair, but with humility, humanity, prayer, and courageous love. Let us examine our hearts, listen deeply to the suffering of others, reject falsehood and hatred, and recommit ourselves to justice rooted in mercy. May we be a people who seek refuge in the Lord—and who help make that refuge visible to others.

May the Holy Spirit guide our words, our actions, and our witness in these challenging times. And may Christ, the Prince of Peace, make us instruments of His healing in a world that longs for hope.



Blessed are the poor, the meek, the persecuted. These are radical words in a world that insists the opposite: blessed are the wealthy. Blessed are the forceful. Blessed are the comfortable. Do we have what it takes to be radical?

### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

#### **Vocation or Calling**

##### **Question:**

Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?

##### **Answer:**

A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often

occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.



### **¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA**

#### **Vocación o Llamado**

##### **Pregunta:**

¿Puede explicar a qué nos referimos con una vocación o llamado? He escuchado este término utilizado en muchos contextos diferentes y no estoy seguro de lo que significa. ¿Se aplica a la vida religiosa?

##### **Respuesta:**

Una vocación o llamado se refiere a una experiencia espiritual mediante la cual una persona siente dentro de sí misma la cercanía de Dios y lo que está pidiendo en su vida. Es una comprensión de cuál podría ser la parte de uno en el plan de Dios. La vocación se presenta de muchas maneras. Algunas son tan dramáticas como la de San Pablo, cuando fue derribado de su caballo, quedó ciego y escuchó la voz de Dios. Otras son menos dramáticas, a menudo ocurren a lo largo del tiempo a través de pequeños eventos e intereses personales. Otras suceden con prisa, acompañadas de una gran comprensión espiritual o conversión. A menudo pensamos que esto se aplica a la vocación religiosa, pero, de hecho, cada cristiano tiene una vocación, un llamado a servir a los demás en y a través de la iglesia. Ya sea casado o soltero, religioso o laico, todos estamos llamados a vivir nuestro compromiso bautismal de predicar y enseñar el mensaje del Evangelio. Cada uno de nosotros tiene un papel que desempeñar en el plan de Dios, y nos convertimos en colaboradores de Dios en la obra de la redención. Con un poco de confianza, un espíritu dispuesto y la gracia de Dios, podemos y responderemos a su llamado único.


