

## OUR LENTEN JOURNEY: 40 Days of Lent- Discovering the Quietness of the Desert

My dear friends in Christ,

The football season has come to an end, and now our hearts turn toward a more sacred season — our Lenten journey. This year, our theme is: **“40 Days of Lent: Discovering the Quietness of the Desert.”**

Throughout Lent, our liturgies — through music, prayer, Scripture, and symbol — will invite us to reflect on the many temptations we encounter in our own deserts. We know the desert as a dry, lonely, and uncomfortable place. So why did Jesus choose to go there? Perhaps because the desert is an ideal place of transformation — a sacred training ground where He could embrace and affirm His identity and mission.

Each of us has experienced the desert. It may be a place of loneliness, frustration, grief, disappointment, or even brokenness. In such moments, we may feel tempted by materialism, bitterness, resentment, or despair. The forces that draw us away from God can appear in subtle and persuasive ways. As the Gospel reminds us, we are often “among wild beasts.” The prince of darkness seeks to distract and discourage us, not wanting us to live fully as children of God.

Yet remember: temptations do not come because we are weak, but because we are capable of greatness. We are created for goodness. While we may sometimes compromise our dignity, we are always given the grace-filled freedom to choose God. That choice — made daily and intentionally — leads us toward transformation.

Lent is a sacred season of returning — a time of repentance, renewal, and realignment. It calls us to place our **“life in order”** and to center our hearts once again on what truly matters.

I warmly invite you to participate fully in the Lenten opportunities prepared for our parish community:

- **Wednesdays after the 9:00 a.m. Mass:** *Seeing Jesus Through the Eyes of the Gospel Writers* — exploring Christ through Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.
- **Fridays at 6:00 p.m.:** Bread and Supper Dinner, followed by experiences of hope, forgiveness, and reconciliation through the Stations of the Cross with Taizé music at 7pm.
- **Confessions:** Saturdays from 2:30–4:00 p.m.

Let us remember: Lent is not simply about what we give up. Rather, it is about what we take up — replacing comfort and distraction with prayer, reflection, faithfulness to the Gospel, and deeper communion with God. In the Jewish tradition, such practices are signs of holiness.

Together, let us journey with humble hearts through the quiet of the desert toward the radiant beauty of Easter. Beyond the wilderness awaits the dawn of new life.

May God bless you abundantly. Thank you for your faithful stewardship, generosity, and spirit of sharing.



### **WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED**

#### **Take Up Our Cross**

##### **Question:**

What does Jesus mean when he talks about taking up our cross?

##### **Answer:**

Our journey of faith begins in baptism. When we are faithful to it, we find God's plan for us, his way of allowing us to participate in his saving work, which in turn becomes for us our own salvation. Stated simply, we share in the mission of Jesus each day. We live our life with all of its ups, downs, joys, and sorrows in union with the mission of Jesus. Our work then is holy. It is joined to the cross, God's will for Jesus — the way in which he destroys sin and death and makes eternal life possible. His sacrifice accomplishes what we ourselves cannot do.

To take up the cross, then, means that we share in the mission of Jesus and so embrace the sufferings of the

cross. It is our daily life made holy, given a redemptive mission. It is our purpose and goal to unite our life to that of Christ. St. Paul says it best, "If we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection" (Rom 6:5).

##### **Respuesta:**


Nuestro camino de fe comienza en el bautismo. Cuando somos fieles a ello, encontramos el plan de Dios para nosotros, su manera de permitirnos participar en su obra salvífica, que a su vez se convierte para nosotros en nuestra propia salvación. En pocas palabras, compartimos la misión de Jesús cada día. Vivimos nuestra vida con todos sus altibajos, alegrías y tristezas en unión con la misión de Jesús. Nuestra obra, pues, es santa. Está unida a la cruz, la voluntad de Dios para Jesús, la forma en que destruye el pecado y la muerte y hace posible la vida eterna. Su sacrificio logra lo que nosotros mismos no podemos hacer.

Tomar la cruz, entonces, significa que compartimos la misión de Jesús y, por lo tanto, abrazamos los sufrimientos de la cruz. Es nuestra vida cotidiana santificada, dada una misión redentora. Es nuestro propósito y meta unir nuestra vida a la de Cristo. San Pablo lo dice mejor: "Si hemos llegado a unirnos a él por una muerte como la suya, también nos uniremos a él en la resurrección" (Rom 6:5).
