

My dear friends in Christ,

During this National Catholic Schools Week, I would like to take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude to our dedicated principal, faculty, and staff for their tireless commitment, generosity, and love for our students. Your work is a living testimony to the Gospel, and it does not go unnoticed.

As many of you know, I am currently in the Philippines, taking a brief period of rest after a very demanding November and December. This time has allowed me to reconnect with my family and return to my roots. Today, after presiding at Sunday Mass in my home parish, I chose to visit a quiet place in my birthplace—a place where I could seek peace and comfort for what St. Augustine once called his “restless heart.”

We are living in a time of deep division. Boundaries have been erected between people, and respect for one another often seems to have been discarded.

As a society, we have lost much of our sense of beauty, wonder, reverence, and civility. Dialogue has been replaced by hostility; courtesy by vulgarity; understanding by violence.

What I have witnessed in recent days has been both disturbing and painful. Many of our leaders have engaged in destructive and fatalistic behavior, and these events continue to affect our emotions, distort our values, and divert us from the path of peace and happiness.

Clearly, our lives demand serious reassessment. Our hearts need conversion. Our society needs conversion. Our world needs God.

One of the greatest thinkers and most influential figures in our Catholic tradition is St. Augustine. Yet before his conversion, his life was marked by turmoil and dissatisfaction. His personal journey was stormy, and his own mother, St. Monica, prayed fervently for his conversion. God heard her prayers.

One day, Augustine sat quietly and reflected on his life. Overwhelmed, he broke into tears and cried out to God. In that moment, he released the darkness that bound him and opened his heart to the beauty of God’s light and love. He “put on the Lord Jesus Christ” and was clothed with new life and a renewed spirit.

This profound conversion of heart is precisely the kind of conversion we need today. Where are we now?

The late Pope Benedict XVI once reminded us that *“Nations that were once rich in vocations are now losing their identity under the destructive influence of a certain modern culture. There are those who have decided that God is dead.”* In many ways, we have lost our capacity to give, to forgive, and to recognize the divine.

Our society has become so secularized that some have even claimed that “religion is expensive.” Such statements reflect a culture that has lost its sense of what truly matters. Yet societal conversion can only occur through personal conversion of the heart. Our world must once again be seen as the *City of God*. Our lives must reflect the Gospel, and the Word of God must find a home in human hearts. God is alive. He is present. He dwells within us.

Many of us, at one time or another, have distanced ourselves from a life lived with God. Sometimes, even when our last name is “Christian,” our lives fail to reflect it. We place fences around our hearts that isolate us from authentic discipleship. As a result, we become restless, dissatisfied, and empty. I cannot imagine a meaningful life without a relationship with God and with Jesus Christ. Pope St. John Paul II once reminded us of priests that without an authentic relationship with Christ, life loses its meaning. This truth applies to everyone.

We must resist the temptations of secularism, materialism, irrationality, and hatred—forces that erode our dignity and sense of purpose. These destructive tendencies must be discarded once and for all. Otherwise, as Pope Benedict warned, we risk becoming a people who are “alone, confused, and divided.”

To experience the beauty of God’s presence, we must examine our hearts honestly and identify what darkens and damages our relationship with God and with one another. There are much pain, conflict, and darkness weighing heavily upon human hearts today. Yet we must never allow ourselves to remain trapped in weakness or despair. Instead, we must continue to trust in the living presence of God—who is not dead, but alive and active in our hearts.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Wealth

Question:

If one's gift or talent is making money, and one uses that money for honorable purposes, is it considered a spiritual gift? What does our faith teach us about wealth and stewardship?

Answer:

Jesus said it best: to whom much is given, much is expected. All gifts come from God, and our abilities are given to us to be used for the benefit of ourselves and of others and at the service of the Gospel. In an article entitled "The Many Faces of Stewardship," Catherine Doherty wrote about stewardship in the "nitty-gritty everydayness of my life," and about the currency or

"money" of spiritual stewardship: love, understanding, and unselfishness.

For a gift to have a spiritual benefit, our intention and involvement would be part of the consideration. If I give money to a charity, but do so in order to gain a tax advantage, it could hardly be a virtuous thing on my part. But if I give because I want to help and, in fact, am even willing to get involved, I have committed myself in a deeper, more meaningful way. Regardless of our money-making talents, in the end, true stewardship comes down to how well we practice the virtues of faith, hope, and love within our life and with those in our community and church. Ultimately, the most important element in stewardship is not intangible — it's you!

Pregunta:

Respuesta:

Jesús lo dijo mejor: a quien mucho se le da, mucho se le espera. Todos los dones vienen de Dios, y nuestras capacidades nos son dadas para ser utilizadas en beneficio de nosotros mismos y de los demás y al servicio del Evangelio. En un artículo titulado "Las Muchas Caras de la Corresponsabilidad", Catherine Doherty escribió sobre la corresponsabilidad en el "meollo de la cotidianidad de mi vida" y sobre la moneda o el "dinero" de la corresponsabilidad espiritual: amor, comprensión y desinterés.

Para que un regalo tenga un beneficio espiritual, nuestra intención e implicación serían parte de la consideración. Si doy dinero a una organización benéfica, pero lo hago con el fin de obtener una ventaja fiscal, difícilmente podría ser algo virtuoso de mi parte. Pero si doy porque quiero ayudar y, de hecho, incluso estoy dispuesto a involucrarme, me he comprometido de una manera más profunda y significativa. Independientemente de nuestros talentos para hacer dinero, al final, la verdadera corresponsabilidad se reduce a lo bien que practicamos las virtudes de la fe, la esperanza y el amor dentro de nuestra vida y con aquellos en nuestra comunidad e iglesia. En última instancia, el elemento más importante de la corresponsabilidad no es intangible, ¡eres tú!


