Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

I pray that you all had a joyful and truly blessed New Year's Day celebration. On Christmas Day, we rejoiced in the mystery of God's love made visible as we celebrated the birth of Jesus—His coming into the world, His birthday among us.

Today, on the Solemnity of the Epiphany, our celebration widens and deepens. We rejoice not only that Christ has come, but that He has come **for all**.

The word *Epiphany* comes from the Greek meaning *manifestation* or *revelation*. It reminds us that in Jesus, God reveals His saving love to every nation, every people, every heart. The journey of the Magi from the East, guided by the star, brings this truth to life. Their encounter with the Holy Child, held by Mary and protected by Joseph, was not meant for them alone—it was meant for the whole world. Jesus is not the Savior of a few; He is the Savior of all.

In today's Gospel, we hear that the Magi brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These were precious offerings, but even more meaningful was the gift of their hearts—their faith, their trust, and their willingness to seek the truth no matter how far the journey.

Each time we gather for the Eucharist, we too encounter Christ in a new Bethlehem. Here, the Lord gives Himself to us—His love, His mercy, His very life. And as we come before Him, an important question is placed before our hearts: **What gift are we bringing to Him?** On Christmas, God gave us the greatest gift of all—His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. On the Feast of the Epiphany, we are invited and challenged to respond. What do we offer in return? Our faith? Our time? Our forgiveness? Our desire to change and grow closer to Him?

The Gospel tells us that after encountering Christ, the Magi returned to their homeland by another way. This detail is rich with meaning. Their meeting with the Savior transformed them. They could not go back the same way they came. They had been changed, inspired, and sent forth with a new purpose.

My friends, when we encounter Christ in the Eucharist, does it transform us? Does it inspire us to go out and proclaim, by our words and our lives, that the Savior has been born? Our world today is filled with darkness—loneliness, fear, division, despair, and uncertainty. Many people wake up each day burdened by these realities, wondering when it will all end.

Our world is in need of saving. Our world is in need of hope. People are searching for a star to follow—something, or someone, who will lead them to light and life. **We are called to be that star.** Through acts of forgiveness, compassion, joy, and love, we can lead others to the Savior of the world.

As we conclude this Christmas season, I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all who helped make our celebrations so beautiful—through your service, your generosity, your talents, and your faith. May the light of Christ, revealed at Epiphany, continue to shine through each one of us.

The Three Wise Men

Question:

Magi, Three Kings, Three Wise Men...who were they?

Answer:

We sing songs, give gifts, and move three mysterious men into our manger scenes. There's a rich heritage in the Catholic Church of celebrating the magi, but their origins are steeped in mystery. The original Greek calls these men *magoi*. The word is translated elsewhere in Scripture to mean "magician," but a similar word was used in ancient history to describe an entirely different set of people altogether. In what is now modern-day Iran, the ruling empire had a wealthy priestly caste known as the Magi. At the time of Christ, the Magi formed one of the ruling councils of the Parthian Empire. These priests interpreted dreams and read the stars to anticipate major events that could affect the fortunes of the empire.

We're not exactly sure where the magi of the Gospels traveled from. Matthew simply says "the east." History

tells us that the ancient regions of Persia, Assyria, and Babylon all had a magi priesthood at the time of Christ. Whichever region they hailed from, they likely traveled over one thousand miles over the course of several months to arrive at the Holy Family. Unfortunately for the classic song, there is no concrete evidence these men were themselves kings, though they did bear gifts "from afar" at the prompting of their astronomical calculations.



¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA **EXPLICADA**

Los Reyes Magos

Pregunta:

Los Magos, Los Tres Reyes, Los Tres Reyes Magos...

¿Quiénes eran?

Respuesta:

Cantamos canciones, damos regalos y llevamos a tres hombres misteriosos a nuestras escenas de pesebre. Hay una rica herencia en la Iglesia Católica de celebrar a los Reyes Magos, pero sus orígenes están llenos de misterio. El griego original llama a estos hombres *magoi*. La palabra se traduce en otras partes de las Escrituras para significar "mago", pero una palabra similar se usó en la historia antigua para describir a un grupo completamente diferente de personas. En lo que hoy es Irán, el imperio gobernante tenía una rica casta sacerdotal conocida como los Reyes Magos. En la época de Cristo, los Reyes Magos formaron uno de los consejos gobernantes del Imperio Parto. Estos sacerdotes interpretaban los sueños y leían las estrellas para anticipar acontecimientos importantes que podrían afectar la fortuna del imperio. No estamos exactamente seguros de dónde viajaron los magos de los Evangelios. Mateo simplemente dice "el oriente". La historia nos dice que las antiguas regiones de Persia, Asiria y Babilonia tenían un sacerdocio de magos en la época de Cristo. Independientemente de la región de la que provinieran, probablemente viajaron más de mil millas en el transcurso de varios meses para llegar a la Sagrada Familia. Desafortunadamente para la canción clásica, no hay evidencia concreta de que estos hombres fueran reyes, aunque sí trajeron regalos "desde lejos" a instancias de sus cálculos astronómicos.
