The prophet Isaiah reminds us that God's Word never returns empty but always accomplishes the purpose for which He sends it. What a beautiful promise! Every time we live our faith, share our hope, and extend Christ's love to another person, God is at work bringing forth a rich harvest.

As we prepare for our parish celebrations and our Oktoberfest, may we continue to sow seeds of welcome, hospitality, generosity, and joy. May everyone who comes to our parish experience the love of Christ through the witness of our community.

May St. Joseph continue to guide and inspire us as faithful disciples. And may each of us become rich soil, receiving God's Word with open hearts and bearing fruit that will last.

**** YOUTH FIRST COMMUNION (2nd yr, 7th to 12th gr) -** This is the class for returning students in grades 7 to 12 needing their second year for communion preparation. Registration packets are NOW available from the Parish Center office and in PDF format at <https://campsite.bio/ymsjcpinole>. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. Youth First Communion starts in September; enrollment will close when classes begin.

**** YOUTH MINISTRY (1st yr, 9th to 12th gr) -** This is the class for returning students rising to 9th grade from the classes, Middle School Ministry or Youth First Communion. This is also the class for new students rising to grades 9 to 12

needing their first year for the parish two-year Confirmation preparation process. Registration packets are NOW available from the Parish Center office and in PDF format at <https://campsite.bio/ymsjcpinole>. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. Youth Ministry starts in September; enrollment will close when classes begin.

**** CONFIRMATION (2nd yr, 10th to 12th gr) -** For the 2026-2027 group of returning families: Please bring everything that must be turned in at your family appointment, and arrive ON TIME. Scheduled appointments continue for July. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. Classes start in September.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE **EXPLAINED**

Sharing Your Faith

Question:

My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

Answer:

There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns.

Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you!

Pregunta:

Respuesta:

Hay muchas maneras de sacar a relucir el tema de la religión, sin juzgar ni presionar. Comienza preguntándole cuáles son sus pensamientos sobre la religión o cuál fue su experiencia al crecer. Encontrar puntos en común suele ser más fácil de lo que piensas, porque las preguntas y los problemas que tenemos sobre Dios, la presencia del mal, nuestro propósito en la vida y nuestra relación con Dios son preocupaciones universales.

¿Por qué tienes miedo? Si no quieres insultar u ofender a alguien, no seas insistente ni crítico. Si no estás seguro de cómo explicar tu propia fe, lee un poco o practica con un amigo. Si mides el éxito solo por la conversión de esta persona, concentra tu atención más en comenzar la conversación, ¡no en llevarla a un cierre perfecto! La fe es un viaje de muchos actos de fe, muchas discusiones acerca de Dios y muchas elecciones acerca de cómo practicamos lo que predicamos. En algunos tendremos gran éxito; en otros necesitaremos perdón y perseverancia. Lo más importante para tener en cuenta es que el Espíritu Santo siempre está obrando y nuestros más humildes esfuerzos pueden dar grandes frutos. ¡Ten fe en Dios porque él tiene fe en ti!

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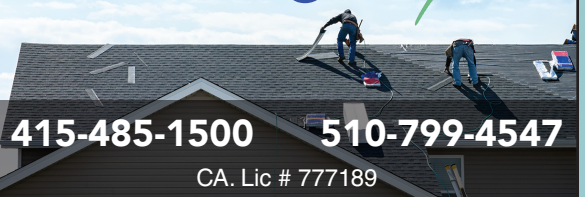


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
