Reflections



My Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope you are enjoying a peaceful and blessed summer!

Our parish is perhaps the largest Christian community in Western Contra Costa, and it stands as a shining light in the heart of downtown Pinole. As you drive down the freeway or along San Pablo Avenue, you cannot help but be welcomed by the beauty of our church. For 78 years, this parish community has been a beacon of hope, a place where God's love is alive and visible.

From its humble beginnings, our parish has grown into a vibrant community. Over the years, we have welcomed strangers, fed the hungry, clothed the naked, and visited the sick. Through the Ministry of St. Vincent de Paul, these acts of love continue to thrive. We have remained the visible Body of Christ, living out the gospel through service and compassion. In doing so, we bring the message of Christ to life in our hearts and in our community. Though summer often brings a time of rest and renewal, our work continues. We are here to ensure that the Word of God is proclaimed, bringing hope to a world that is often filled with uncertainty and darkness.

In today's Gospel, we hear the story of the Good Samaritan, who, moved by compassion, helped a man beaten by robbers. The Good Samaritan has become a powerful symbol of Christ's call to be agents of hope, peace, and healing in the world.

Jesus gave His apostles clear instructions when He sent them out: travel light, focus on the mission, and do not be discouraged by those who may reject you. These instructions are just as relevant to us today. In our discipleship, what distractions keep us from focusing on Christ's mission? Are we easily discouraged when our efforts to share the Gospel are not well received?

Jesus' call to the apostles is also a call to each of us: to proclaim repentance, to serve others with Christ-like love, and to reach out to those who are hurting. Through simple acts of forgiveness, understanding, and compassion, we can make a profound difference in the lives of those around us.

Christ is still in need of more "sales reps" today. To be a Christian is to be an ambassador for Christ, to represent His love and grace wherever we are. We have been entrusted with the greatest message and the greatest "product" the world has ever known, and we are empowered by the most understanding and loving "Big Boss" imaginable!

As we go out into the world as His representatives, may we find joy in our hearts and be filled with the courage and determination to share the love of Christ with everyone we meet.

**** CLASS for 7th and 8th graders -** Registration has opened. This class is for rising 7th & 8th graders who are continuing with their next grade for spiritual formation, their first year for sacrament preparation, or who have never had spiritual formation. This class begins in September 2025, meets on Wednesday evenings and ends in May 2026.

**** YOUTH FIRST COMMUNION (2nd year, 7th grade and older) -** Registration has opened. This is the second year class for rising 7th to 12th graders who just completed their first year in spiritual formation (2024-2025) and now would like to prepare for first communion. This class begins in September 2025, meets on Wednesday evenings and ends in May 2026. Students who complete the requirements for the second year may receive First Communion in the spring of 2026.

**** YOUTH MINISTRY (1st yr, 9th to 12th grade)** Registration has opened. The St. Joseph Parish Confirmation Program is a two year preparation process for teens in high school. The earliest that a teenager can begin the two year preparation process is 9th grade. This first year is called Youth Ministry. This class begins in September 2025, meets on Monday evenings and ends in May 2026. Students who complete the requirements for the first year are invited in May 2026 to enroll for the second year,

the Confirmation class. Students who complete the requirements for the second year may receive Confirmation in the spring of 2027.

**** CONFIRMATION (2nd yr, 10th to 12th grade) -**This is the second year class for teens rising to 10th to 12th grade who just completed their first year in Youth Ministry. The appointments for 2024-2025 Youth Ministry families to register for their second year will close this month, the end of July. Please prepare everything that needs to be turned in at your appointment. This class begins in September 2025 and meets on Sundays. Students who complete the requirements for the second year may receive Confirmation in the spring of 2026.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Everyone is our neighbor — those we love and those we can't stand, the people we agree with and the people whose opinions we hate. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that we must not only see ourselves in every person we meet — we must see him, too.

<u>VIVIR LA LITURGIA - INSPIRACIÓN DE LA</u> <u>SEMANA</u>

Todos son nuestro prójimo: aquellos a quienes amamos y aquellos a quienes no soportamos, las personas con las que estamos de acuerdo y las personas cuyas opiniones odiamos. En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos dice que no solo debemos vernos a nosotros mismos en cada persona que conocemos, sino que también debemos verlo a él.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

What Is Mammon? Question:

When Jesus says, "You cannot serve both God and mammon," what does he mean? What is mammon?

Answer:

When you hear Scripture proclaimed each Sunday, remember it wasn't originally written in English. Hebrew, Aramaic, Greek — these ancient tongues were the original language of our Old and New Testaments. Most of the time, all of the words are translated into our native language. Sometimes, a word or two is left in the original language. Such is the case in this Scripture passage. Mammon is an ancient Aramaic word referring to money, wealth, or profit. Earthly wealth isn't bad in

itself, nor does it automatically exclude us from being a disciple of Jesus. But what dominates our life? To serve money — that is, to seek accumulation of wealth for its own sake



and to structure our lives around it — is morally problematic. What good is our wealth if it isn't at the service of others? What good is our wealth if its pursuit leads us to selfishness, obsession, greed, envy, and comparison? There are many things that can be opposed to our service of God — power, prestige, popularity. Ultimately, something in our lives will be our master. But there is only one God worth serving.

<u>POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLI-</u> <u>CA EXPLICADA</u>

¿Qué es Mamón? Pregunta:

Cuando Jesús dice: "Ustedes no pueden servir al mismo tiempo a Dios y a mamón" ¿qué quiere decir? ¿Qué es mamón? Respuesta:

Cuando escuches la Escritura ser proclamada cada domingo, recuerda que no fue escrita originalmente en español. Hebreo, arameo, griego: estas lenguas antiguas fueron el idioma original de nuestro Antiguo y Nuevo Testamento. La mayoría de las veces, todas las palabras se traducen a nuestro idioma nativo. A veces, se dejan una o dos palabras en el idioma original. Tal es el caso de este pasaje de la Escritura.

Mamón es una antigua palabra aramea que se refiere al dinero, la riqueza o la ganancia. La riqueza terrenal no es mala en sí misma, ni nos excluye automáticamente de ser discípulos de Jesús. Pero ¿qué es lo que domina nuestra vida? Servir al dinero, es decir, buscar la acumulación de riqueza por sí misma y estructurar nuestras vidas en torno a ella, es moralmente problemático. ¿De qué sirve nuestra riqueza si no está al servicio de los demás? ¿De qué sirve nuestra riqueza si su búsqueda nos lleva al egoísmo, la obsesión, la codicia, la envidia y la comparación? Hay muchas cosas que pueden oponerse a nuestro servicio a Dios: el poder, el prestigio, la popularidad. En última instancia, algo en nuestras vidas será nuestro amo. Pero solo hay un Dios al que vale la pena servir.
