My dear friends in Christ,

I hope you are enjoying the blessings of summer. The weather has certainly been unusual! It has been so windy and cold at times, yet on Sunday (July 12) and again last night (July 13) it was hot and very humid. It reminds us just how quickly things can change.

When I first came to serve as your pastor, one of the hopes I shared was that our parish would become known as a stewardship parish.

As I reflect on that today, I find myself asking: Have we accomplished that goal? I know I have spoken often about stewardship over the years, but I also wonder whether it has truly become part of the way we live our faith as a parish family.

Becoming a stewardship parish is not something that happens overnight. It is a journey that requires commitment, prayer, and a willingness to grow. For many years, the bishops of the United States have encouraged stewardship as a vital part of parish life through seminars, publications, and the pastoral letter *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*. As a result, many parishes have experienced renewed vitality and greater participation in their mission. Yet for many Catholics, the meaning of stewardship is still unfamiliar. As Fr. Dan Danielson humorously remarked when he visited our parish, "Catholics are more familiar with the word 'bingo' than 'stewardship.'"

I would like to revisit this important topic because I truly believe that unless stewardship becomes part of our way of life, we will never fully become the vibrant and engaged parish community God is calling us to be.

Through our Baptism, each of us is called to help build a community of faith. One of the most important ways we do this is by generously sharing our time, talent, and treasure. That is why each of us should prayerfully consider this question:

Am I a good steward—a joyful and faithful caretaker of the gifts God has entrusted to me?

This is more than simply asking whether we give. It invites us to examine our hearts. Do I recognize that everything I have comes from God? Do I live with gratitude and thanksgiving? Do I accept responsibility for helping build God's Kingdom through my parish and my daily life?

As I have shared before, stewardship is deeply personal and profoundly spiritual. It is not merely about financial support or volunteering. It is a way of life—a grateful response to God's abundant love and generosity. Stewardship becomes part of who we are and how we live each day.

Jesus reminds us, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." Living as faithful stewards often requires sacrifice, commitment, and perseverance. Yet it is through this faithful response that we grow as disciples of Christ.

In 1993, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops published the pastoral letter *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*. It beautifully explains:

Who is a Christian disciple? One who responds to Christ's call, follows Jesus, and shapes his or her life in imitation of Christ.

Who is a Christian steward? One who receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner, shares them in justice and love with others, and returns them with increase to the Lord.

The document also reminds us:

"Genesis tells us that God placed the first human beings in a garden to practice stewardship there—to cultivate and care for it" (Gn 2:15). The world remains a kind of garden entrusted to the care of men and women for God's glory and the service of humankind. In its simplest yet deepest sense, this is Christian stewardship."

My prayer is that these reflections will inspire all of us to continue growing as a faith-filled community marked by gratitude, generosity, and joyful service. Together, may we recognize the many blessings God has entrusted to us and faithfully share them for His glory and the good of others.

Finally, speaking of the spirit of stewardship, I want to express my sincere gratitude to all of our ministries, volunteers, and parishioners who generously share their time, talent, and treasure. Your faithful service is a beautiful witness to the Gospel and a blessing to our parish family. Thank you for all that you do.

May God continue to bless you and your loved ones.

**** MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY (7th & 8th gr)**

- This is the class for returning students rising to 7th or 8th grade OR for new 7th or 8th graders needing their first year for communion preparation. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. The Middle School Ministry class starts in September; registration closes when classes begin.

**** YOUTH FIRST COMMUNION (2nd yr, 7th to 12th gr)**

- This is the class for returning students in grades 7 to 12 needing their second year for communion preparation. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. The Youth First Communion class starts in September; registration closes when classes begin.

**** YOUTH MINISTRY (1st yr, 9th to 12th gr)**

This is the class for returning students rising to 9th grade from the classes: Middle School Ministry or Youth First Communion. This is also the class for new students rising to grades 9 to 12 needing their first year for the parish two-year Confirmation preparation process. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. Youth Ministry starts in September; enrollment closes when classes begin.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE **EXPLAINED**

The Most Holy Trinity

Question:

I accept on faith that God is a Trinity of Persons, and I know it's something we can't fully understand. Should I just accept that, or should I try to learn more?

Answer:

There's a legend from the life of St. Augustine. As the early Church grappled with the identity of Christ and his relation to the other Persons in the Trinity, the holy theologian wrote a book about the Trinity. The story goes that, while he worked on the piece, he took a break to walk along the seashore. He came upon a small boy who had dug a hole in the sand. He was carrying a bucket, which he'd fill up with seawater and pour into the hole. Back and forth he walked. St. Augustine gently

chided the young boy, "*You can't pour the whole ocean into that hole.*" The boy responded, "*And you cannot fit the whole Trinity into your mind.*" The Trinity is a mystery! Our finite mind can't comprehend the infinite God. Of course, the lesson isn't about giving up trying to understand God. St. Augustine did write that treatise, after all. The hunger to know more about God is good. We can read books about the Trinity or about the fatherly love of God, the life of Christ, and the movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives. More than that, we can deepen our life of prayer. The heart of our Trinitarian teaching is "God is love." The Three Persons are an infinite relation of love between one another. Real understanding of that comes less through our heads but through our hearts.

La Santísima Trinidad

Pregunta:

Acepto por fe que Dios es una Trinidad de Personas, y sé que es algo que no podemos comprender del todo. ¿Debería simplemente aceptarlo o debería intentar aprender más?

Respuesta:

Hay una leyenda de la vida de San Agustín. Mientras la Iglesia primitiva luchaba con la identidad de Cristo y su relación con las demás Personas de la Trinidad, el santo teólogo escribió un libro sobre la Trinidad. La historia cuenta que, mientras trabajaba en la obra, hizo una pausa para pasear por la orilla del mar. Se topó con un niño pequeño que había cavado un agujero en la arena. Llevaba una cubeta, que llenaba de agua de mar y vertía en el agujero. Caminaba de un lado a otro. San Agustín reprendió suavemente al joven niño: "*No puedes verter todo el océano en ese agujero.*" El niño respondió: "*Y tú no puedes hacer caber toda la Trinidad en tu mente.*"

¡La Trinidad es un misterio! Nuestra mente finita no puede comprender al Dios infinito. Por supuesto, la lección no trata de dejar de intentar entender a Dios. San Agustín sí escribió ese tratado, después de todo. El hambre de saber más sobre Dios es buena. Podemos leer libros sobre la Trinidad o sobre el amor paternal de Dios, la vida de Cristo y el movimiento del Espíritu Santo en nuestras vidas. Más que eso, podemos profundizar nuestra vida de oración. El corazón de nuestra enseñanza trinitaria es "Dios es amor." Las Tres Personas son una relación infinita de amor entre sí. La verdadera comprensión de eso viene menos de nuestra cabeza y más de nuestro corazón.

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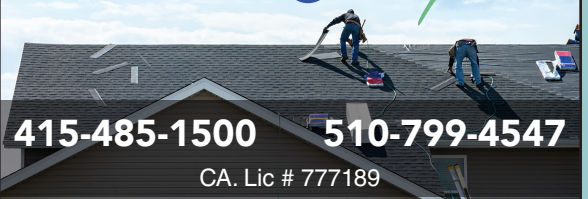
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
