My Dear Friends in Christ,

We are now in the heart of summer, and I hope everyone is enjoying this beautiful season and spending meaningful time with family and friends.

As the remaining days of summer unfold, take time to visit new places, marvel at the many wonders of God's creation, and, most importantly, remember to **RIP—Rest If Possible!**

Last Sunday, in my homily, I spoke about another kind of **RIP—Rest in Prayer!** Prayer has the power to transform our hearts. Through prayer, God can change the weeds within us into the wheat of His Kingdom, so that, in the end, we may grow together as true brothers and sisters in Christ.

In last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us the parable of the wheat and the weeds growing together until the harvest.

This parable is not only about the world around us, it is also about our own hearts. Within each of us grows wheat: faith, kindness, generosity, hope, joy, love, and forgiveness. But there are also weeds: pride, jealousy, resentment, selfishness, arrogance, and indifference. They grow side by side.

The surprising part of the parable is that God does not pull up the weeds immediately. Why? Because God is patient. He knows that conversion is a lifelong journey, not an instant event. At times, the weeds may seem stronger than the wheat, but God's grace is always at work. The weeds do not have the final word—God's grace does. Every confession, every prayer, every act of forgiveness, and every choice to love instead of hate allows God to transform the field of our hearts into a fruitful harvest.

On **July 21**, we gathered to celebrate Mass in loving memory of our beloved **Carol Lujan**, who served as our Faith Formation Director for nine years (2013–2022). Through prayer and song, we gave thanks for her faithful service to our parish community. Carol generously dedicated her life to the Church through many ministries, especially in her role as our Faith Formation Director. May the Lord continue to grant her eternal rest and everlasting peace.

It is with great sadness that I share the news that **Fr. Paul Schmidt**, our former pastor (2005–2014), passed away on **Friday, July 17, 2026**. In Fr. Paul, our Diocese has lost one of its gentle giants. He lived a life marked by humility, kindness, joy, gratitude, and unwavering faith. He served the Church with deep dedication, prayer, compassion, and missionary zeal. We thank God for the many blessings He bestowed upon the Diocese of Oakland through Fr. Paul's priestly ministry.

**** MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY (7th & 8th gr)**

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EX- PLAINED

The Giving of Treasure

Question:

Why are Catholics required to give money to the Church?

Answer:

Offering money and other goods to God and the Church is, before all else, a statement of gratitude. We see this when we look at how our spiritual ancestors showed their gratitude to God for the gifts they had received (e.g. Genesis 14:18-20 and Genesis 28:16-22). One of the ways they offered thanks to God was through a practice called “tithing,” in which 10 percent of a person’s goods (crops, livestock, money, etc.) were given back to God. Today, the practice of tithing — giving 10 percent — is still common in many Protestant communities, but it is not required for Catholics. Instead, the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us that, “The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to [their] own abilities” (no. 2043). This means that, although we are not bound to practice “tithing” in the traditional sense, we do share a responsibility to share our money or other resources with our parish communities. Like our spiritual ancestors, we give as a sign of our gratitude for the many gifts that God has given to us. Beyond this, we also share our resources with other Catholic organizations to help them finance their ministries, to continue and

grow their outreach to the poor and the needy, and to provide just wages for their employees. How much we give depends on our individual circumstances, but since we share a responsibility for the programs, outreach, and health of our parish communities and Catholic organizations, this question gives us a wonderful opportunity to ask some important questions about the quality of our giving and what our priorities are. Remember, we are only stewards of our time, talents, and treasures and as the First Letter of Peter reminds us, “As each one of you has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God’s varied graces” (4:10).

La Entrega del Tesoro

Pregunta: ¿Por qué se requiere que los católicos den dinero a la Iglesia?

Respuesta:

Ofrecer dinero y otros bienes a Dios y a la Iglesia es, ante todo, una declaración de gratitud. Vemos esto cuando observamos cómo nuestros antepasados espirituales mostraron su gratitud a Dios por los dones que habían recibido (por ejemplo, Génesis 14:18-20 y Génesis 28:16-22). Una de las formas en que ofrecieron gracias a Dios fue a través de una práctica llamada “diezmo,” en la que el 10 por ciento de los bienes de una persona (cosechas, ganado, dinero, etc.) se devolvían a Dios. Hoy en día, la práctica de diezmar (dar el 10 por ciento) sigue siendo común en muchas comunidades protestantes, pero no es un requisito para los católicos. En cambio, el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos enseña que “los fieles tienen también el deber de proveer a las necesidades materiales de la Iglesia, cada uno según [sus] propias capacidades” (n. 2043). Esto significa que, aunque no estamos obligados a practicar el “diezmo” en el sentido tradicional, compartimos la responsabilidad de compartir nuestro dinero u otros recursos con nuestras comunidades parroquiales. Al igual que nuestros antepasados espirituales, damos como muestra de nuestra gratitud por los muchos dones que Dios nos ha dado. Más allá de esto, también compartimos nuestros recursos con otras organizaciones católicas para ayudarlas a financiar sus ministerios, continuar y aumentar su alcance a los pobres y necesitados, y proporcionar salarios justos a sus empleados. Cuánto damos depende de nuestras circunstancias individuales, pero dado que compartimos la responsabilidad de los programas, el alcance y la salud de nuestras comunidades parroquiales y organizaciones católicas, esta pregunta nos brinda una maravillosa oportunidad para hacer algunas preguntas importantes sobre la calidad de nuestras donaciones y cuáles son nuestras prioridades. Recuerden, solo somos corresponsables de nuestro tiempo, talentos y tesoros y como nos recuerda la Primera Carta de Pedro: “Cada uno de ustedes ha recibido un don, úsenlo para servirse unos a otros como buenos administradores de las múltiples gracias de Dios” (4:10).
