A Day I Will Never Forget: My Ordination to the Priesthood

It was a beautiful, sunny day—**June 14, 1997**—the day of my ordination to the priesthood.

I woke up early that morning and took a walk around Marina Park. I do not remember whether I was more excited or nervous, but I do remember listening to religious music that helped me pray and focus on the day ahead. My family and relatives had arrived days earlier to celebrate this very special moment in my life. My brother, Francisco, III, was there, and my dear friend, Fr. René, had also arrived to share in the joy of the occasion.

As I walked, I reflected on the words of the prophet Jeremiah: *“Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you”* (Jeremiah 1:5). Looking back now, I realize that God had been preparing me for this day long before I could ever imagine.

When I returned to our home on Pacific Avenue in San Leandro, everyone was getting ready. I remember seeing my mother, filled with happiness and emotion. Her love, sacrifices, and prayers had always been my inspiration. Like Mary, the Mother of Jesus, she treasured God’s blessings in her heart. Her faith helped lead me to this sacred moment.

At 9:00 a.m., we left for St. Felicitas Church in San Leandro, the church where the ordination would take place. When we arrived, the parking lot was nearly full. People were coming and going, searching for seats, greeting old friends, and sharing in the excitement of the day. There was a joyful spirit everywhere.

That morning, three men were to be ordained to the priesthood: Hy Nguyen, Scott Chavez, and myself. Family members, friends, relatives, classmates, seminarians, neighbors, and religious sisters filled the church. Hundreds of priests from the Diocese, the seminary, and throughout the Bay Area had gathered to witness this sacred celebration.

As I entered St. Felicitas, I became emotional. Before going to the clergy vesting room, I first accompanied my parents, Francisco and Imelda, and my siblings, my brothers, Francisco, III, and Jerome, my sisters Epie and Rowena, and my family to their assigned seats. I hugged them and then walked away to prepare for the ordination. It was a moment filled with gratitude and love.

Soon, the liturgy began. Beautiful music accompanied the entrance procession. The three of us walked forward with smiles on our faces, though our hearts were undoubtedly filled with anticipation. As I looked around the church, I saw many familiar faces who had been part of my journey of faith.

One of the most moving moments came during Communion when *Pescador de Hombres* (“Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore”) was sung. The words touched my heart deeply as I remembered Jesus’ invitation to His disciples: *“Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men”* (Matthew 4:19). I felt once again the gentle yet powerful call of Christ: “Follow me.”

After nearly two hours, the moment finally arrived. Through the laying on of hands and the prayer of ordination, we were ordained priests of Jesus Christ. Our lives were forever changed. We became Fr. Hy, Fr. Scott, and Fr. Geoffrey.

I was reminded of the words of Jesus: *“You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain”* (John 15:16). On that day, I felt profoundly humbled and grateful for the gift of God’s call. Following the Mass, there were countless photographs, embraces, congratulations, and joyful celebrations. It truly was a beautiful day. Among all the memories I cherish, one remains especially close to my heart. My mother came to me and said, “Congratulations, my son. You are now a priest. Be true to your vocation.”

Those words have stayed with me throughout my priesthood.

Now, twenty-nine years later, I continue to thank God every day for calling me to serve His people. The years have passed quickly, and they have been filled with countless blessings. I have had the privilege of serving many wonderful parish communities and meeting extraordinary people who have enriched my life and strengthened my faith.

Like St. Paul, I can say with gratitude: *“I thank my God every time I remember you”* (Philippians 1:3).

To all who have been part of this journey—through your prayers, encouragement, friendship, and love—thank you. You have helped shape my vocation and sustain my ministry.

As I celebrate this anniversary of my ordination, my prayer remains the same as it was on that sunny day in June 1997: that I may continue to be a faithful servant of Christ and His Church.

“Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will” (Psalm 40:8).

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Sin

Question:

A member of my parish was recently arrested for a white-collar crime. I don't approve of what he did, but he is a great neighbor and a nice person. How should I treat someone like him?

Answer:

There is a litany of expressions that fit this situation: Everyone makes mistakes. Hate the sin, love the sinner. Judge not, lest you be judged. All of these proverbs and sayings highlight the fact that we are here to help each other on the way to salvation. Our hope and goal is that everyone grows in grace, drawing closer to God and to the promise of eternal life. Part of that process is our struggle, collectively and individually, with sin. And that is the ugly part. Sin is not nice, pretty, or inviting when

laid out for all to see. Nor is it easy for the person caught in the spotlight.

Kindness and support are not the same thing as approval. We recognize that good people can do bad things and in their struggle, they need the help of others. Our kindness is often the flicker of hope that allows someone to face the consequences of sin while focusing on the promise of redemption. Your desire to help and support your neighbor is the response of grace to sin, and the same response of Jesus to us.

Pregunta:

Un miembro de mi parroquia fue arrestado recientemente por un delito de cuello blanco. No apruebo lo que hizo, pero es un gran vecino y una buena persona. ¿Cómo debo tratar a alguien como él?

Respuesta:

Hay una letanía de expresiones que encajan en esta situación: Todo el mundo comete errores. Odia el pecado, ama al pecador. No juzguéis, para que no seáis juzgados. Todos estos proverbios y dichos resaltan el hecho de que estamos aquí para ayudarnos unos a otros en el camino a la salvación. Nuestra esperanza y meta es que todos crezcan en gracia, acercándose a Dios y a la promesa de la vida eterna. Parte de ese proceso es nuestra lucha, colectiva e individualmente, con el pecado. Y esa es la parte fea. El pecado no es agradable, bonito o acogedor cuando se presenta para que todos lo vean. Tampoco es fácil para la persona atrapada en el centro de atención.

La amabilidad y el apoyo no son lo mismo que la aprobación. Reconocemos que las personas buenas pueden hacer cosas malas y en su lucha, necesitan la ayuda de los demás. Nuestra bondad es a menudo el destello de esperanza que permite a alguien enfrentar las consecuencias del pecado mientras se enfoca en la promesa de la redención. Tu deseo de ayudar y apoyar a tu prójimo es la respuesta de la gracia al pecado, y la misma respuesta de Jesús a nosotros.



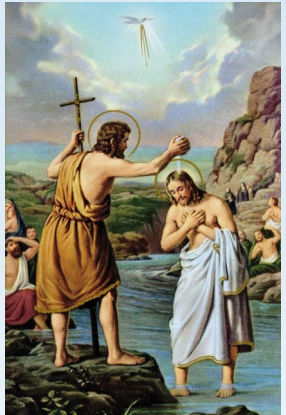
