My Dear Friends in Christ,

“Church is not where you meet. Church is not a building. Church is what you do. Church is who you are. Church is the human outworking of the person of Jesus Christ. Let us not go to Church. Let us be the Church!”

I came across this quote not long ago, and it has stayed with me ever since. I remember sitting quietly in my room, reflecting on the power of those words.

“Let’s be Church!”

This weekend’s Gospel for the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle A) reminds us that discipleship is more than belonging to a building or attending an event. Do we recognize the value of belonging to this community? When we accept that we are part of something greater than ourselves, our presence gains deeper meaning and purpose. Acceptance also means looking beyond imperfections—our own and those of others—and embracing one another with Christ-like love.

I hope and pray that each of us will continue to invest our energy, gifts, and hearts in building up this parish community. Let us appreciate, allow, and accept. Let us receive one another as Christ asks us to do in the Gospel. In doing so, we become a living Church where Christ is present and active.

As a community, we will experience ups and downs, triumphs, and challenges. Yet our faith, conviction, and perseverance will carry us forward with hope and joy. I remain deeply grateful for the many parishioners who, year after year, continue to make a difference in the life of our community. Your generosity, faithfulness, and love are a constant source of inspiration and strength. Thank you for all that you do.

This Saturday, we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of our Independence Day. As we observe the Fourth of July, let us do so with gratitude and pride. Freedom is one of God’s greatest gifts to humanity. Let us give thanks for this blessing and use it responsibly—not for self-interest, but to promote the dignity of every person and the common good of our society.

Class starts in September; enrollment will close when classes begin.

**** YOUTH MINISTRY (1st yr, 9th to 12th gr)**

- This is the class for those who were in 8th grade, or from the classes, Middle School Ministry or Youth First Communion. This is also the class for new students in grades 9 to 12 needing their first year for Confirmation preparation. Registration for the 2026-2027 Youth Ministry class for high school students will open ON JULY 1st for returning and new students. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. Class starts in September; enrollment will close when classes begin.

**** CONFIRMATION (2nd yr, 10th to 12th gr)**

- For the 2026-2027 group of returning families: Please remember what you need for your family's appointment, bring everything that must be turned in, and arrive ON TIME. Scheduled appointments continue for June and into July. Enrollment is NOT automatic for returning students. Classes start in September.

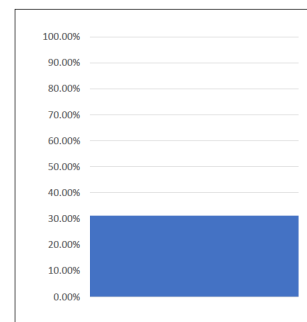

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Works of Mercy

Question:

I've heard of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. What are they, and what's the difference?

Answer:

As God has shown us mercy, so too are we called to show mercy to those we encounter. We see mercy throughout the Gospels, but the parable in Matthew 25 forms the foundation for the first set of Works of Mercy. This parable of the last judgment shows each person being asked how well they cared for those around them, and being reminded that this care for those in need is care for God Himself. Each person is asked if they have fed the hungry, given drink to the thirsty, clothed the naked, sheltered the stranger, cared for the sick, and

visited the imprisoned. These — along with burying the dead — are the Corporal Works of Mercy, as they primarily concern the physical life of a person.



The list of the Spiritual Works of Mercy developed later. These actions of love primarily concern the inner life of a person. They are instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, admonishing sinners, bearing wrongs patiently, forgiving offenses, comforting the afflicted, and praying for both the living and the dead. All of these actions are concrete ways of bringing the love of God into the world.

POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Obras de Misericordia

Pregunta:

He oído hablar de las Obras de Misericordia Corporales y Espirituales. ¿Qué son y cuál es la diferencia?

Respuesta:

Así como Dios nos ha mostrado misericordia, también nosotros estamos llamados a mostrar misericordia a aquellos con quienes nos encontramos. Vemos misericordia a lo largo de los Evangelios, pero la parábola en Mateo 25 forma la base para el primer conjunto de Obras de Misericordia. Esta parábola del juicio final muestra a cada persona a la que se le pregunta qué tan bien cuida a los que la rodean, y se le recuerda que este cuidado por los necesitados es el cuidado de Dios mismo. A cada persona se le pregunta si ha alimentado al hambriento, dado de beber al sediento, vestido al desnudo, protegido al extranjero, cuidado al enfermo y visitado al encarcelado. Estas, junto con enterrar a los muertos, son las Obras de Misericordia Corporales, ya que se refieren principalmente a la vida física de una persona.

La lista de las Obras de Misericordia Espirituales se desarrolló más tarde. Estas acciones de amor concierne principalmente a la vida interior de una persona. Estas son instruir a los ignorantes, aconsejar a los dudosos, amonestar a los pecadores, soportar los agravios con paciencia, perdonar las ofensas, consolar a los afligidos y orar tanto por los vivos como por los muertos. Todas estas acciones son formas concretas de llevar el amor de Dios al mundo.
