Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

This is it.

Ron Rolheiser, OMI, once wrote: “There is a place inside us where each and every one of us is being touched and held unconditionally in love by God.”

Today, we enter the holiest time of our liturgical year: Holy Week. Its purpose is to lead us into the mystery of Christ’s Passion. Over the past five weeks, we have prepared our hearts and lives so that, when we arrive at Easter, we may proclaim with deep joy and conviction: He is risen!

On this Palm Sunday weekend, we commemorate Jesus’ Messianic entrance into Jerusalem—a moment of triumph and hope for many of His followers. Yet we know the story does not end there. It is only the beginning of a sacred journey that leads to the cross.

During this Holy Week, we are invited to slow down, to enter more deeply into prayer, and to immerse ourselves in the beauty and solemnity of these sacred days. It is a time for quiet reflection, for fasting, and for reconciliation—a grace-filled opportunity to say from the heart: “*Lord, forgive me. I am sorry.*”

On Holy Thursday, at the Mass of the Lord’s Supper, we begin the Easter Triduum, which reaches its summit in the Easter Vigil. These three days form one continuous celebration of the Paschal Mystery—Christ’s life, death, and resurrection. In fact, the Church teaches, as expressed in the 1969 General Norms for the Liturgical Calendar, that:
“Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life.”

As we enter this sacred Triduum, remember that these liturgies are not separate events, but one unfolding mystery. On Holy Thursday, we recall the Lord’s Supper and His command to love and serve one another with humility, symbolized in the washing of the feet. On Good Friday, we venerate the cross and remember the sacrifice of Christ, the true Paschal Lamb. I encourage you to make this day one of deep prayer and fasting, a spirit that continues into Holy Saturday day of quiet as we await the Easter Vigil, when we rejoice in the Resurrection of our Lord, the Savior of the world. It is also on this holy night that the Church joyfully baptizes and confirms the elect.

Therefore, let us strive to set aside other engagements and make these sacred celebrations our priority. It is in gathering together as the Body of Christ that we fully enter into the mystery of our redemption.

May we journey through this Holy Week with hearts filled with hope and peace, ready to sing our joyful *Alleluia* in praise of God’s unending love and mercy.

On behalf of Fr. Salvador, Fr. Francisco, Deacon Ben, our pastoral staff, Finance Council, and all our dedicated volunteers, I wish you and your loved ones a blessed and joyful Easter.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

This week, we see things that break our heart God betrayed. This week, we see things that shake our faith God bleeding on a cross. This week, this Holy Week, with all its difficult moments, can change us, if we let it. Are we ready?

VIVIR LA LITURGIA - INSPIRACIÓN DE LA SEMANA

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EX- PLAINED

Chastisement vs. Punishment

Question:

What is the difference between a chastisement and a punishment?

Answer:

The distinction between chastisement and punishment is, in many ways, a subtle one, but which is still relevant in our Catholic tradition.

First, chastisement is a concept that is grounded in Sacred Scripture. Here, we see chastisement as a response by God to people's actions that is intended to teach a lesson. As [St. John Paul II observed](#), "chastisement appears to be ... a kind of divine pedagogy, in which the last word is reserved to mercy: He scourges and then shows mercy, casts down to the depths of the nether world, and he brings up from the great abyss" (Tobit 13:2). The idea here is that in order to capture our attention or to highlight how we have not lived out our covenant-relationship with God as we should, there are times when God uses events in life to draw us back to the quality of relationship or faith that we should have.

The concept of punishment, however, has a different sense. The Catechism of the Church observes that punishment is the consequence of a damaging action that "has the primary aim

of redressing the disorder" and to protect the community and the common good from further damage or harm (see no. 2266). Although we always hope that someone who is being punished for a crime or some other harmful action will learn from their actions, punishment isn't necessarily intended to teach a lesson in the same way that a chastisement is.

Ultimately, how we make the distinction between chastisement and punishment is a matter of discernment. As with almost everything in life, our experiences can be an opportunity for grace — or for something less — depending on how open we are to recognizing the movement of God's Spirit within them.

POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Castigo vs. Escarmiento

Pregunta:

¿Cuál es la diferencia entre un castigo y un escarmiento?

Respuesta:

La distinción entre castigo y escarmiento es, en muchos sentidos, sutil, pero sigue siendo relevante en nuestra tradición católica.

En primer lugar, el castigo es un concepto que se basa en las Sagradas Escrituras. Aquí, vemos el castigo como una respuesta de Dios a las acciones de las personas que tiene la intención de enseñar una lección. Como [observó san Juan Pablo II](#), "el castigo parece ser... una especie de pedagogía divina, en la que la última palabra está reservada a la misericordia: azota y luego muestra misericordia, arroja a las profundidades del abismo y hace subir del gran abismo" (Tobías 13:2). La idea aquí es que con el fin de captar nuestra atención o resaltar cómo no hemos vivido nuestra relación de pacto con Dios como deberíamos, hay momentos en que Dios usa los eventos de la vida para llevarnos de vuelta a la calidad de relación o fe que deberíamos tener. El concepto de escarmiento, sin embargo, tiene un sentido diferente. El Catecismo de la Iglesia observa que el escarmiento es la consecuencia de una acción dañina que "tiene como objetivo principal reparar el desorden" y proteger a la comunidad y al bien común de nuevos daños o perjuicios (cf. n. 2266). Aunque siempre esperamos que alguien que está siendo escarmientado por un crimen o alguna otra acción dañina aprenda de sus acciones, el escarmiento no necesariamente tiene la intención de enseñar una lección de la misma manera que lo es un castigo. En última instancia, la forma en que hacemos la distinción entre el castigo y el escarmiento es una cuestión de discernimiento. Como con casi todo en la vida, nuestras experiencias pueden ser una oportunidad para la gracia, o para algo menos, dependiendo de cuán abiertos estemos a reconocer el movimiento del Espíritu de Dios dentro de ellas.


