Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

Our Lenten journey continues—**40 Days in the desert, discovering the grace found in holy quietness.**

As we enter the Third Sunday of Lent, I invite you to pause and reflect: *How is your journey unfolding?* Are you still walking this path of renewal and transformation with intention and hope? In this Sunday's Gospel from Gospel of John, we encounter the moving story of the Samaritan woman at the well. In her sincere and humble meeting with Jesus, we witness the power of a true encounter with the Lord—an encounter that brings healing, dignity, and new beginnings. Though burdened by her past, she is not defined by it. God offers her living water—grace, mercy, and a second chance.

And He offers the same to us.

How often do we extend second chances—to others, and to ourselves?

Some years ago, I spoke with a man whose life had unraveled through gambling addiction and abusive behavior. His family had left, and he had lost nearly everything dear to him. "Father," he told me, "It was just bad luck." I gently but firmly replied, "It wasn't bad luck—it was poor judgment."

I remember that moment not only because I felt compassion for him, but because truth was necessary for healing. Love sometimes requires honest confrontation. He needed to take responsibility for his choices. Only then could grace begin its work.

Our God is a God of second chances—a God whose mercy never tires.

Even when we fall, God does not abandon us. He calls us back. Lent is a sacred season to examine our hearts, to recognize where selfishness or sin has wounded others, and to return to the One who restores us. Through Christ, we see how deeply we are loved and how earnestly God desires our reconciliation.

We are all imperfect. We are all in need of forgiveness.

The Gospel challenges us to be patient and compassionate—toward others and toward ourselves. If we seek mercy, we must also be willing to give it.

I am grateful to share that the man I once counseled experienced true conversion. God's mercy touched his heart. He accepted responsibility, embraced change, and sought forgiveness. In time, his family chose reconciliation over resentment. Healing replaced anger. Love prevailed.

Forgiveness is powerful.

Love is transformative.

Resentment imprisons the heart, but forgiveness sets it free. Repentance is not weakness, it is courage. It is the doorway to new life.

Thank you for your continued generosity and faithful stewardship. Last Sunday, I spoke about consistent, prayerful giving. Your sacrificial gifts strengthen our parish and allow us to be a living witness of Christ's love in the world. Through you, our church becomes a place where mercy is experienced, hope is renewed, and hearts are restored.

Thank you for walking this Lenten path with faith and perseverance. May we continue toward Easter with hearts open to grace, ready to receive—and to share—the gift of forgiveness.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Jesus did not convert the Samaritan woman with miracles. He converted her with presence. He was not afraid of her sins or her failures. He listened to her. He sat with her. Let us learn from this: when we are present to others, we can show them the face of God.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Church Division

Question:

If we are all meant to be united in Christ, why is there so much division in the Church?

Answer:

Each Sunday, we profess that we believe in “one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.” The Church is indeed one because her source is the Trinity, and she is founded by Christ. The Church also exists in the fallen world and is made up of fallen people. Sometimes, there are tensions over what we believe as Catholics. Who is Jesus really? Are we affected by original sin? How do our traditional sexual ethics play out amidst medical and technological developments? Doctrinal disagreements are rarely just about ideas ... they occur within a context. Tensions are influenced by various social and political factors of the time period. For example, Martin Luther’s attempts at reform gained followers, in part, as a reaction against poor moral practices within the Catholic Church. When the schism between the Eastern Ortho-

dox Church and the Catholic Church occurred in 1028, tensions between the two culturally different regions had been brewing for centuries.



Division still occurs within the bounds of the Church today. Oftentimes, this is about pastoral or practical matters. These Questions can vary. Should we incorporate Latin back into the liturgy? What is the best way to reach the youth in our parish? These may not be articles of faith, but people have strong opinions about what ought to be done. We can remember the prayer of Christ — “*that all might be one*” — and do what we can to grow in understanding and respectful dialogue.

¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

División Eclesiástica

Pregunta:

Si todos estamos destinados a estar unidos en Cristo, ¿por qué hay tanta división en la Iglesia?

Respuesta:

Cada domingo, profesamos que creemos en “una Iglesia santa, católica y apostólica”. La Iglesia es, en efecto, una porque su fuente es la Trinidad, y ha sido fundada por Cristo. La Iglesia también existe en el mundo caído y está formada por personas caídas. A veces, hay tensiones sobre lo que creemos como católicos. ¿Quién es Jesús realmente? ¿Nos afecta el pecado original? ¿Cómo se desarrolla nuestra ética sexual tradicional en medio de los desarrollos médicos y tecnológicos? Los desacuerdos doctrinales rara vez se refieren solo a ideas... ocurren dentro de un contexto.

Las tensiones están influenciadas por diversos factores sociales y políticos de la época. Por ejemplo, los intentos de reforma de Martín Lutero ganaron seguidores, en parte, como reacción contra las malas prácticas morales dentro de la Iglesia Católica. Cuando se produjo el cisma entre la Iglesia Ortodoxa Oriental y la Iglesia Católica en 1028, las tensiones entre las dos regiones culturalmente diferentes se habían estado gestando durante siglos.

La división todavía ocurre dentro de los límites de la Iglesia hoy en día. A menudo, se trata de asuntos pastorales o prácticos. Estas preguntas pueden variar. ¿Deberíamos volver a incorporar el latín a la liturgia? ¿Cuál es la mejor manera de llegar a los jóvenes de nuestra parroquia? Puede que estos no sean artículos de fe, pero las personas tienen opiniones firmes sobre lo que se debe hacer. Podemos recordar la oración de Cristo — “*que todos sean uno*” — y hacer lo que podamos para crecer en la comprensión y el diálogo respetuoso.

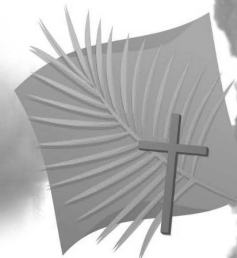
