

Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

Is there hope for the world?

As the days grow warmer and summer approaches, many of us look forward to the beauty and joy this season brings. But as we reflect on the world around us, we can't ignore the turmoil we see daily. The reality is that our world is troubled. Violence, conflict, and suffering continue to claim lives, and so many are left wondering: Why? Why does so much hatred and anger exist? What drives these forces of destruction, and what can we, as followers of Christ, do to change it?

We are not mere bystanders in this world; we are called to action. We are reminded daily of the profound responsibility we bear to proclaim peace to the world. There is no question that we all long for a world where peace prevails—a world where harmony, love, and freedom reign. Sadly, for many around the globe, this hope remains distant, as countless communities are denied the opportunity to live in peace.

I often find myself asking: Why is there so much inhumanity? Why do people hurt one another so deeply? Why does despair, anger, and darkness seem so pervasive in our world? But amid these questions, I hold onto one truth: **There is hope. There is always hope. And that hope is found in love.**

In last week's Gospel, Jesus gives us the simple yet profound command: "Love one another." After His resurrection, He asked Peter, "Do you love me?" And He charged him, "Feed my sheep." In this exchange, Jesus was not just reaffirming His love for Peter, but commissioning him—and through him, all of us—to carry forward His mission: to spread peace through love.

So, I ask again: Are we not tired of the violence, the division, and the ignorance that so often define our world? Is there hope for us? **Yes. I believe there is hope**—because love transforms. Love is the key.

At the beginning of his papacy, Pope Leo XIV stood on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica and greeted the world with these words: "Peace be with you!" In this moment, I believe Pope Leo expressed the very heart of his mission: to work tirelessly for peace through dialogue, compassion, and love. **Love transforms.** I am confident that God chose him for this purpose.

As Christians, our calling is clear: to love, and to live in that love every day, in every moment. **Love begets love**—amor con amor se paga—love gives rise to more love. **Love can heal.** It is love, not violence or hatred, which has the power to transform the world. The world needs love in order to find peace. The world needs God's word to transform hearts—especially those who have lost their way, who have abandoned responsibility, and who have allowed injustice to take root in our societies.

But let us be honest: **to love is a privilege, but also a responsibility.** And, as Christians, we must admit that we have not always lived up to that responsibility. In many ways, we have been part of the problem. We have not always been true to our Christian identity. I am reminded of Mahatma Gandhi's famous words when he was asked about Christianity by a Christian reporter: "I like your Christ, but I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike your Christ."

My dear friends, **peace will come** when we choose to live in love—when we make love the foundation of everything we do. Let us never forget who we are. We are made in God's image, and we are capable of great love because we were created by Love itself. Let us be instruments of peace by loving one another, starting right here in our own community.



<u>LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE</u> <u>WEEK</u>

God makes His dwelling with those who love Him and keep His word. We must all make our lives places where God feels welcome to dwell. Our actions, our words, our decisions must all say in one voice: "Come, Holy Spirit!"

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Sunday Mass

Question: Why do Catholics need to go to Mass every Sunday?

Answer:

The heart of the Church's instruction that we are to attend Mass on Sundays goes back to the Third Commandment: "Take care to keep holy the sabbath day as the LORD, your God, has commanded you" (Deuteronomy 5:12). Although the Jewish People celebrate the Sabbath on Saturday, the first generations of Christians began to observe the sabbath on Sunday, recognizing how important it is for Christians to celebrate the day that Jesus rose from the dead. As the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults observes, "Sunday extends the celebration of Easter throughout the year ... It makes present the new creation brought about by Christ" (364). The focus of our Sunday should be the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass. This is our time to be formed by God's Word and nourished at the table of the Lord, becoming prepared to live out and share our faith in the week that follows. In his encyclical, Dies Domini, Pope Saint

John Paul II reminded us that Christians "cannot live their faith or share fully in the life of the Christian community unless they take part regularly in the Sunday Eucharistic assembly" (no. 81). This is why the Church teaches us that Sunday Mass is a non-negotiable part of being a Christian (see *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2192). Beyond being a time of worship, we should also remember that Sunday is intended to be a day of rest, when we make time for recreation, for sharing meals, and enjoying the company of friends and family. Sunday is given to as a day to take stock of and enjoy the blessings that God has given us (see *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2187). Pope Francis reminds us, "The day of rest, centered on the Eucharist, sheds its light on the whole week, and motivates us to greater concern for nature and the poor" (*Laudato Si*', no. 237).

¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EX-PLICADA

La Misa Dominical

Pregunta: ¿Por qué es necesario que los católicos vayan a Misa cada Domingo?

Respuesta:

La esencia de la instrucción de la Iglesia de que debemos participar en Misa los domingos se remonta al Tercer Mandamiento: "Guardarás el día del sábado santificándolo, como te lo ha mandado Yahvé tu Dios" (Deuteronomio 5:12). Aunque el Pueblo Judío celebra el día sabático los sábados, las primeras generaciones de cristianos comenzaron a guardar el día sabático los domingos, reconociendo la importancia que tiene para nosotros los cristianos el celebrar el día que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos. Según el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica para Adultos, "El día Domingo prolonga la celebración de la Pascua a través del año...Hace presente la nueva creación que Cristo instauró" (364). El enfoque de nuestro domingo debería ser la celebración de la Eucaristía en la Misa. Este es el tiempo en que la Palabra de Dios nos forma y nos alimenta en la mesa del Señor y nos prepara para vivir y compartir nuestra fe durante la semana a la que da inicio. El Papa San Juan Pablo II en su encíclica Dies Domini nos recordó que los cristianos "no pueden vivir su fe o participar plenamente en la vida de la comunidad cristiana, a menos que participen regularmente en la asamblea eucarística dominical" (No. 81). Es por eso que la Iglesia nos enseña, que la Misa dominical es una parte no-negociable de ser cristiano (ver el numeral 2192 del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica).

Nosotros deberíamos de recordar que el domingo, además de ser un tiempo para dar culto a Dios, debe ser un día de descanso del trabajo, en el cual hacemos tiempo para recreación, compartir los alimentos y disfrutar de la compañía de amigos y familiares. Se nos ha dado el domingo para reconocer y disfrutar las bendiciones que Dios nos ha dado (Ver el numeral 2187 del *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica*). El Papa Francisco nos recuerda que "El día de descanso, centrado en la Eucaristía, ilumina toda la semana y nos motiva a ocuparnos del cuido de la naturaleza y de los pobres" (*Laudato Si*, numeral 237).




