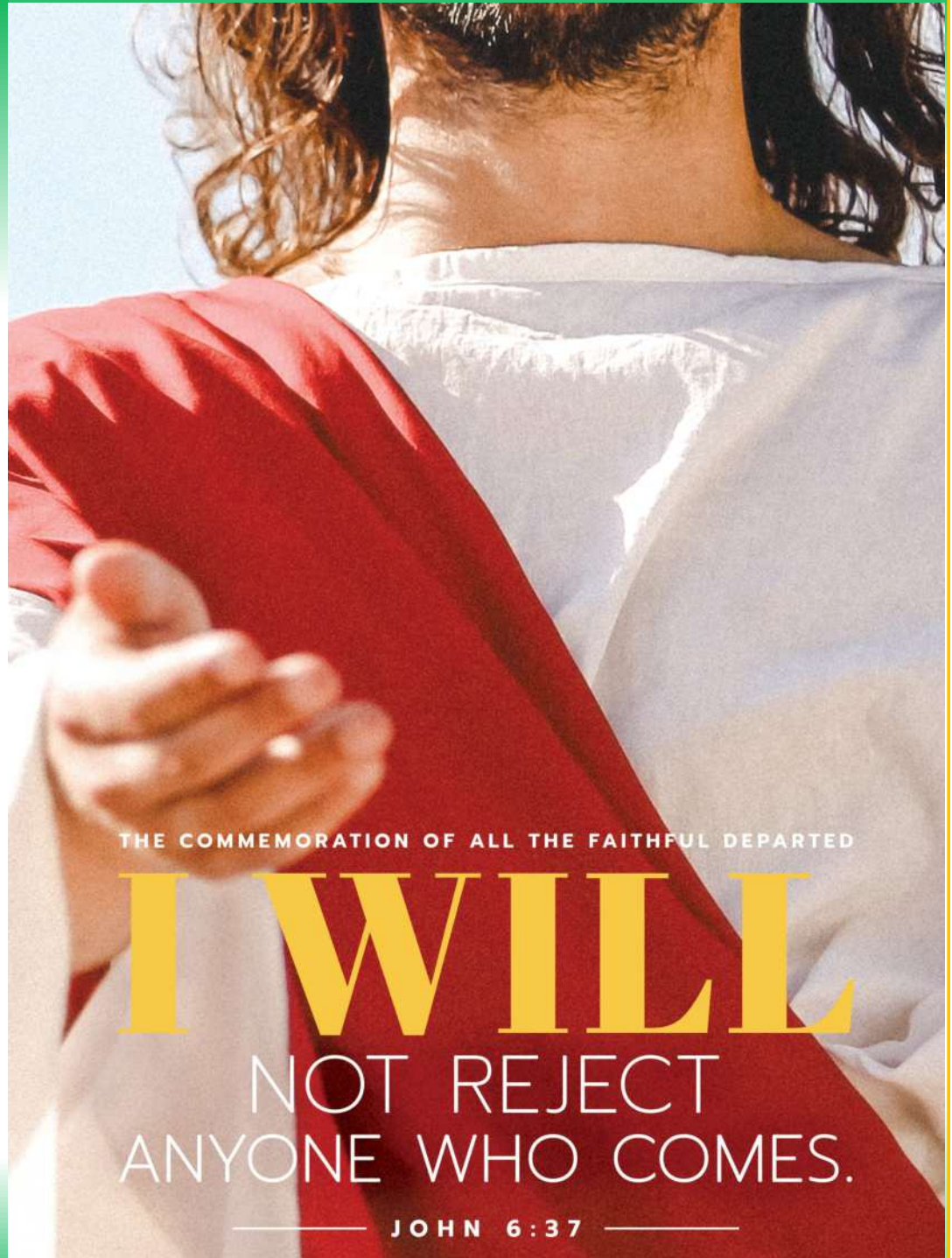

Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

Today we gather to celebrate the Solemnity of All Souls Day!

People die every day! This is part of our human condition. Death is part of life and not an opposite of it. Somehow, somewhere, sometime, death will come to us!

It may have only been a few weeks or months since you experienced a death of your loved one — perhaps your husband or wife, your parent, your child, or a close friend.

You get up from the sofa to go into the kitchen, and for just a moment, you think you see them. Then it comes back: *“No... Mom passed away two months ago.”* Or you visit Grandpa’s house, expecting Grandma to be there as always — but she’s gone. Yet, in a glance of memory, you feel her presence again.

Moments like these are tender reminders of love. Certain places or sounds awaken memories so strongly that it’s as if our loved ones are near. And in faith, we know they truly are — not in body, but in spirit, in the eternal life of Christ.

Some might say, “They’re gone. We have to move on.” But as Christians, we believe something more beautiful. We believe that love does not end with death. These moments of remembrance are invitations to prayer to lift our loved ones into His mercy and peace.

That is why we pray for the dead, why we dedicate November to All Souls, and why we celebrate funeral Masses. We do these things because we believe in the power of prayer and in the permanence of love. Prayers connect us with those who have gone before us. It is love in action — love that continues to give, even across the veil of death.

True love, the love that comes from God, never asks for anything in return. It simply desires the good of the beloved. When we pray for the souls of our departed, we love as Jesus loved — selflessly and faithfully.

Some of those we love are already with God, perfectly united with Him in heaven. Others are still being purified — healed of the wounds and effects of sin. Just as an old injury can still ache even after it heals, so too a soul may need time to be fully restored in God’s light.

In His great mercy, God allows our prayers to help. Our love — expressed through prayer — can comfort, strengthen, and heal those souls still on their journey toward heaven.

The power of prayer is beyond measure. When we pray, we invite God to do what we cannot — to bring peace and completion to those we love.

Today, on the Commemoration of All Souls, we pray that every soul still waiting for God’s presence may be freed, healed, and embraced by His love.

We remember our parents, our spouses, our children, our relatives, and our friends. We know they were good, yet human — and out of love, we want them to be ready for the fullness of God’s glory. That is why we have Masses offered for them, light candles in their memory, and keep them in our daily prayers, especially in this month of November.

We are all united — the saints in heaven, the souls in purgatory, and we who remain here on earth. Together we form one communion in Christ, bound by love that even death cannot destroy.

Jesus said, *“I will reject no one who comes to me.”* (John 6:37)

With that promise, we entrust our loved ones — and ourselves — to His boundless mercy.

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

To live with Christ, we must die with him. But what does this mean? What does this look like in the ordinary life of a Christian? We must ask God for the wisdom to see our own crosses, so that we may carry them into the newness of life.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Resurrection of the Dead

Question:

What do Catholics believe about the resurrection of the dead?

Answer:

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be *our* body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with his disciples? We don't really know the answers to these

questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul!



¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Resurrección de los Muertos

Pregunta:

¿Qué creen los católicos sobre la resurrección de los muertos?

Respuesta:

Todos los domingos, proclamamos en el Credo que creemos "en la resurrección de la carne". ¿Significa eso la resurrección de Cristo o la nuestra? ¡Ambos! La resurrección de Jesús es parte de la obra de salvación, pero también es una señal de lo que está por venir. Si bien la muerte separa nuestros cuerpos y nuestras almas, esta no era la intención de Dios cuando nos creó por primera vez. Es un efecto del pecado original. Al final de los tiempos, nuestros cuerpos y nuestras almas se reunirán.

Científicamente, podemos tener preguntas sobre esto, ya que los cuerpos se descomponen a lo largo de los siglos. ¿O qué hay de los santos, cuyas reliquias están esparcidas por toda la tierra? Cómo sucederá la resurrección es un misterio. Pero sabemos que nuestro cuerpo resucitado será *nuestro* cuerpo. Si estamos en el cielo, nuestro cuerpo estará en un estado glorificado. Algunos teólogos especulan cómo será esta glorificación basándose en el cuerpo resucitado de Jesús. ¿Seremos capaces de caminar a través de las paredes? ¿Comeremos, ya que Jesús partió el pan con sus discípulos? Realmente no sabemos las respuestas a estas preguntas. Sí sabemos, sin embargo, que estaremos libres de los efectos de la caída (como la enfermedad y el dolor) y de los defectos físicos que ocurrieron en la vida. ¡Cristo nos redime como personas completas, en cuerpo y alma!

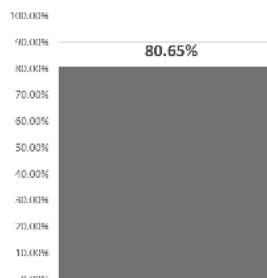

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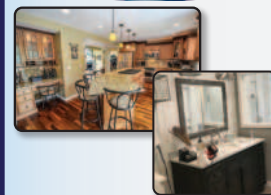


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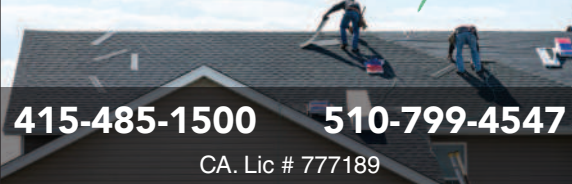
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
