



Reflections



My dear friends in Christ,

On Thursday, September 11, 2025, we gathered as a nation in prayer to remember and honor those who tragically lost their lives in the horrific attacks on America 24 years ago.

Life, as we know, is a journey of both high and low moments. Without a doubt, what occurred twenty-four years ago remains one of the darkest chapters in our nation's history. But the question we must ask is, why did it happen?

On that fateful day, the world watched in disbelief as the United States was struck by terror and violence. Yet, during that great tragedy, we saw something extraordinary unfold—the unshakeable spirit of America. We witnessed a nation rise, united in grief, to touch the heavens and honor the souls of those lost. We felt an outpouring of love and strength, as we stood together in the face of evil.

Yes, we mourned the loss of many Americans from all walks of life. Despair, anger, and a thirst for revenge filled our hearts. The very fabric of our nation and the global community seemed torn apart. But again, we must ask: *Why did it happen?*

It happened because of those who were filled with hatred, ignorance, and a complete disregard for the sanctity of human life. They chose destruction over compassion. They chose division over unity. We must resolve that such violence will never happen again. We are children of God, born to create beauty, not destruction.

As St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Colossians:

"Bear with one another and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord has forgiven you. Let Christ's peace rule in your hearts."

These words are as true today as they were when they were first written. We are called to forgive, to reconcile, and to let peace reign in our hearts.

The great civil rights leader, Martin Luther King Jr., once said:

"The ones who have been hurt must be the first to seek reconciliation."

Despite enduring great suffering, he chose the path of peace, refusing to be consumed by hatred or a desire for violent revenge.

We must follow his example. We must recognize that, regardless of our differences—our race, nationality, culture, or beliefs—we are all children of the same God. We are all part of the same human family. We must view one another through eyes of love, not suspicion, or hate. My friends, no one's age, race, nationality, abilities, or beliefs should ever be a reason for hatred or violence. We cannot allow ourselves to destroy one another. If we do, we dishonor the memory and the sacrifice of those who perished that day. We must stand united. We must reject hate, division, and ignorance. We must resist the temptation to be enslaved by prejudice or arrogance.

While the foreign terrorists who attacked us may no longer be around, we face a new challenge—domestic extremists who threaten to tear us apart from within. These individuals—driven by false ideologies—stoke division, creating tension among communities, families, and even friends. These are the "cross-givers" those who bring pain and suffering into the lives of others. They steal from us our freedom, our joy, and our hope.

Have we learned from the past as a nation? Perhaps not fully.

I see the signs of division and prejudice all around me. I see people hurting one another with words and actions—insulting, harassing, and even turning their backs on each other. The very spirit of unity that once defined this great nation seems to be slipping away. This should not be. The America I know, the America I believe in, is a nation of hope, of welcome, of tolerance. It is a nation that rises above its differences and finds strength in its diversity.

Friends, open your eyes and look around. There is a problem in our midst. We cannot afford to ignore it any longer. We must act now. Reject prejudice. Denounce bigotry. Do not remain silent. Do not empower those who seek to destroy our way of life. Do not let what happened 24 years ago happen again. Let us honor those who died by ensuring that their sacrifice is not in vain. Let us pledge to create a world of peace, of love, and of reconciliation. May the cross of Christ be a sign not of defeat, but of Divine victory—victory over hate, over division, and over fear. On this Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, let us commit ourselves to peace on earth.

This class is for 7th & 8th graders who have never had spiritual formation, who are continuing with their next grade for spiritual formation, or need to enroll for their first year for communion preparation. ** YOUTH FIRST COMMUNION (2nd yr, 7th to 12th grade) - The MANDATORY first meeting for students and parents in THIS CLASS is Wednesday September 24, in the church during a shortened time from 6:45 to 7:30 PM. The REQUIREMENT for families to go to second Sunday 5:00 PM Mass each month starts in November. This is the second year class for 7th to 12th graders who completed their first year in spiritual formation (2024 -2025), who would like to prepare for first communion. Students in grades 9 to 12th must additionally commit to attending the required class for their grade. Students who

complete the requirements for the second year may receive First Communion in the spring of 2026. Specific information is available from the youth ministry director.

** YOUTH MINISTRY (1st yr, 9th to 12th grade) -

The MANDATORY first meeting for students and parents in THIS CLASS is THIS Monday September 15, in the church from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. The REQUIREMENT for families to go to second Sunday 5:00 PM Mass each month starts in November. The St. Joseph Parish Confirmation Program is a two year preparation process. The earliest that a teenager can begin this process is 9th grade. His/her first year is called Youth Ministry. Daily Prayer Versus Mass?

Question:

I have a friend who says she doesn't need to attend Mass because she prays to God every day. What are your thoughts on this justification?

Answer:

If the only reason for going to church were to talk to God, your friend might be right. Prayer is not something limited to a physical place or even a holy place. If the sole purpose of the Church were prayer, it would be a narrow purpose indeed. The Church is a community

of believers, formed by "one Lord, one faith, one Baptism." It is an outward sign of our faith in God instituted by Christ, and the purpose of the Church is to give us grace, that is, a share in God's life.

Coming to Mass is not really for God's sake, but for ours. If we believe that Jesus is truly present in the holy Eucharist, then we will want to be in his presence. We will want to be fed by him. Our daily prayer and good works are strengthened by our authentic encounter with our Lord. For Catholics, it is at Mass that we celebrate the source and summit of our faith. If this is true, why would we ever stay away?
