My dear friends in Christ,
Tomorrow, September 7, is Labor Day! On this day, we pause to honor the laborers of the world for their hard work, dedication, and contributions. They are truly the pillars of our society. I am grateful that in this country we recognize the dignity of labor and appreciate the many ways workers contribute to the common good. I hope you will have a restful, joyful, and blessed Labor Day holiday!

The weather has been quite unpredictable over the last few days. During our Hot Summer Night on Friday, it was windy and cold—certainly not what we expected!

On Monday, as I was driving through the Pinole and Hercules area, I noticed that the leaves had already begun to change, displaying the first colors of autumn. What a beautiful gift from God! Right in the midst of our daily routines, nature quietly reminds us that change is coming. With the arrival of autumn just around the corner, we begin to notice changes all around us: shorter days, cooler evenings, and leaves slowly turning from green to gold, red, and brown. It is also a fitting time to reflect on the changes we hope to see within ourselves, especially in our spiritual lives.

Last Saturday, after Mass, a parishioner shared something quite powerful with me. He said, “Father, I’ve realized that I haven’t taken my faith seriously. I’ve been arrogant and ungrateful. These past couple of weeks—your messages on humility, reverence in sacred space, sacrifice, participation, and giving with meaning—have really struck me.” Then he added, “Please, remind us always, Father.” His words stayed with me. So, as we begin a new season, I would like to offer two gentle reminders—what I like to call “spiritual housekeeping.”

1. Our Church Is a Sacred Place

Last weekend, I was saddened to see several people wearing baseball caps during Mass. I chose not to say anything publicly at the time, out of respect, but I do want to address it now.

Please remember that our church is a sacred space, a house of God. We come here to worship, to pray, and to encounter Christ truly present in the Eucharist. Wearing a cap in church, especially during Mass, is not appropriate. It may seem like a small thing, but it speaks about the reverence and respect we bring into this holy place.

Let us also be mindful of the example we set, especially for our children. When we treat the church with reverence and respect, we teach them to do the same. Our actions often teach more powerfully than our words.

2. The Meaning of Our Weekly Offering

Some months ago, I shared my thoughts with you about our weekly offertory, and I feel that it is time to revisit this important practice.

“Stewardship” is much more than simply making a donation. It is a way of life. It means returning to God a portion of the blessings He has entrusted to us, offered in gratitude, love, and trust. Our offering becomes even more meaningful when it is intentional—when we prepare it at home, perhaps as a family, with prayer and reflection. Too often, I still see people hurriedly reaching into their wallets or purses when the collection basket arrives. While I am deeply grateful for your generosity, I encourage you to make your offering a prayerful part of your weekly routine. Don’t give impulsively; give with purpose and from the heart.

I also recommend writing a check for your offering whenever possible. It can help make the act of giving more intentional, and it also provides a record of your contributions for tax purposes at the end of the year.

Let us welcome this new season with renewed hearts—hearts open to growth, open to change, and open to the quiet voice of God speaking to each of us. In today’s Responsorial Psalm, we are reminded: **“If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts!”**

May God bless you and your families with peace, love, and spiritual renewal. May He help us to grow in humility, reverence, gratitude, and generosity as we continue our journey of faith together. In Christ’s service,

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Miraculous Medal

Question:

What is the "Miraculous Medal" and why is it called that?

Answer:

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the "Miraculous Medal" dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee," surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital "M" with a cross above it and below two

hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal. Saint Catherine's "Miraculous Medal" is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, "Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy," observes that the medal "recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life."



POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLICA EXPLICADA

Medalla Milagrosa

Pregunta:

¿Qué es la "Medalla Milagrosa" y por qué se llama así?

Respuesta:

La medalla de la Inmaculada Concepción, que ha llegado a llamarse simplemente la "Medalla Milagrosa", se remonta a una aparición de María a Santa Catalina Laboure, que entonces era novicia con las Hijas de la Caridad. El 27 de noviembre de 1830, Nuestra Señora se le apareció de pie sobre un globo, con rayos de luz brotando de sus manos y las palabras: «Oh María, concebida sin pecado, ruega por nosotros que recurrimos a ti», rodeando la imagen. En la misma visión, Catalina vio una "M" mayúscula con una cruz encima y debajo dos corazones. Catalina pareció oír una voz que le decía que hiciera que lo que veía fuera una medalla y una promesa de que quienes la llevaran tendrían la protección e intercesión de la Madre de Dios. Las primeras 1,500 medallas se distribuyeron en 1832. Se atribuyeron muchos favores milagrosos al uso de la medalla. La "Medalla Milagrosa" de Santa Catalina es uno de los símbolos reconocibles y populares del catolicismo moderno. Reflexionando sobre su uso generalizado, el documento vaticano de 2001, "Directorio sobre la Piedad y la Liturgia Popular", observa que la medalla "recuerda el misterio de la Redención, el amor del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús y del Corazón Doloroso de María. Significa el papel mediador de la Santísima Virgen María, el misterio de la Iglesia, la relación entre el Cielo y la tierra, esta vida y la vida eterna."
