My dear friends in Christ,

I hope you are enjoying this beautiful early autumn month of October! It is a gentle reminder that change is coming. The days are getting shorter, the nights longer, and the world around us is painted in the most beautiful colors. I believe this is God's way of reminding us how much He loves beauty and creativity—how much He loves us. This is my favorite season of the year. God knows what brings us joy, and He has a plan for each one of us.

This weekend, of course, we celebrate Oktoberfest—a time of joy, gratitude, and community. I am so excited for all of us! Once again, I want to congratulate you on your deep appreciation of our community, our history, and our diversity. Oktoberfest has brought challenges, yes—but also many joyful and lasting memories. From your HOME to our HOME here, we come together to celebrate. IN CHRIST, WE ARE ONE!!

The Gospel this weekend reminds us of the power of thanksgiving. God has certainly blessed our community with wonderful, generous, and dedicated people. For this, we give thanks.

Let me share with you an experience from when I was still at St. Ignatius in Antioch—one that reminded me clearly that our plans are not always God's plans.

It was one of those long, exhausting days, filled with back-to-back meetings. My final stop was a Diocesan Pastoral Council meeting at the chancery. On the way home, stuck in traffic on Highway 4, all I could think about was my bed. I was drained and focused on just one goal: getting home and taking a nap. Nothing, I thought, could stop me.

After nearly two hours in traffic, I finally saw the exit to my home. "Finally!" I said with relief. But as I pulled into the driveway, I noticed a man and his three children waiting for me. My heart sank. I was so tired. I had not expected anyone.

Still, I got out of the car and greeted them. The man immediately apologized. I assured him it was okay. But I could see the pain in his eyes—he was struggling to speak, holding back tears. I gently put my hand on his shoulder, encouraging him to share.

He told me that his young wife had just been diagnosed with cancer. He was overwhelmed, afraid, and needed someone to talk to. I asked him where she was, and he told me she was in the hospital nearby. I told him I wanted to go with him to see her and pray with her. So, we went together, and I administered the Anointing of the Sick.

I had planned to rest, to sleep, that was my big plan. But God had something more important in store: a call to respond to a human need. And when it was all done, instead of feeling tired, I felt refreshed. I felt fulfilled. Because our plan is not always God's plan.

My dear friends, you are part of God's plan, and I thank you for your faithful commitment and for always saying "yes" when He calls.



# WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

# Vicar General and Chancellor Question:

I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

#### Answer:

A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese, despite the many jokes priests may tell at their expense! A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a



bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.

#### ¿POR QUÉ HACEMOS ESO? - VIDA CATÓLI-CA EXPLICADA

# Vicario General y Canciller Pregunta:

He visto el título de Vicario General y Canciller usado en nuestro periódico católico. ¿Quiénes son y qué hacen?

#### Respuesta:

Un obispo está a cargo de una diócesis y nombra a personas para ayudar con su administración. Dos de esos cargos son el Vicario General y el Canciller. Ambos juegan un papel en la vida de una diócesis, a pesar de los muchos chistes que los sacerdotes pueden contar a su costa. Un canciller es el archivista de una diócesis, encargado de mantener los registros de la diócesis. A menudo, un obispo puede agregar otras responsabilidades y el canciller puede terminar siendo como el director ejecutivo de la oficina diocesana. El canciller no necesita ser sacerdote.

El vicario general es un sacerdote, nombrado por el obispo y actúa en nombre del obispo en la administración de la diócesis. Tiene un título superior en derecho canónico o teología. También tiene autoridad ejecutiva dentro de la diócesis. Esto significa que está implicado en la gestión pastoral y temporal cotidiana de la diócesis. El derecho canónico no permite que un obispo nombre a un pariente para el cargo, ni al sacerdote a cargo del sacramento de la penitencia. En ambos casos, el propósito de la ley es evitar conflictos de intereses.


