Serving Students PreK 3-year-old to Grade 8

SMA offers a fun and active PreK program offering Part-time and Full-time for both our 3 and 4-year-old students. Our elementary school serves students Kindergarten to Grade 5. Our JR High consist of students in Grade 6, 7 and 8. With a challenging, fun and enriching curriculum student's at SMA are well rounded and fully prepared for their educational, spiritual and moral journey past their years at SMA.

Three-Year Old Program:

- Must be three on or before September 1st and independent (no diapers or pull ups)
- This program offers 2 choices-THREE (M/W/F) **OR** FIVE full days.
- Before school care is available (fee is not included in tuition)
- Drop off and pick up follow our regular school schedule (8:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.)
- In addition to class time students will enjoy music class, gym class and library time
- Students will enjoy private playground space with age appropriate playground equipment
- Priority registration to one of the four-year old programs
- One lead teacher and one assistant per class, class size limited
- Students that arrive prior to 8:15 may have breakfast free of charge
- All students have the option of hot lunch during their lunch time free of charge

Four-Year Old Program:

- Must be four on or before September 1st and independent (no diapers or pull ups)
- This program offers THREE (M/W/F) **OR** FIVE full days.
- Drop off and pick up follow our regular school schedule (8:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.)
- Before school and after school available (fee is not included in tuition)
- In addition to class time students enjoy music class, gym class and library time
- Students will enjoy private playground space with age appropriate playground equipment
- One lead teacher and 1 assistant per class, class size limited
- Students that arrive prior to 8:15 may have breakfast free of charge
- All students have the option of hot lunch during their lunch time free of charge

SMA Grade School and JR High Information KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE 8

Kindergarten thru Grade 5:

- Drop off and pick up follow our regular school schedule (8:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.)
- Before school and after school available (please see insert in folder for fee)
- Outdoor play daily (weather permitting)
- Attend Monthly Mass
- Music, gym, art, health, Spanish, computers and library with our specials teachers
- Field trips, school wide activities, school enrichment programs
- Kindergarten and Grade 1 may wear polo all year. Grade 2-5 full uniform required
- Kindergarten students must be 5 on or before September 1st to enter Kindergarten
- Grade 1 students must have completed a Kindergarten program

Jr. High Students (Grades 6 to Grade 8):

- Drop off and pick up follow our regular school schedule (8:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.)
- Before school and after school help available with Jr. High teachers daily (no fee)
- Opportunity to get outside daily (weather permitting)
- Attend Monthly Mass
- Grades 6 & 7 -music, gym, art, health, Spanish, computers and library with our specials teachers
- Grade 8- music, gym, art, health, and Spanish 3x per week with our specials teachers
- Field trips, school wide activities, school enrichment programs
- Drama Club
- Students help at events to set up, breakdown, run games, and assist where needed
- Full uniform required
- Students have access to teachers for help before and after school each day
- Grade 8 students receive fleece with graduating class embroidered on sleeve

Saint Mary's Academy strives to develop the not only the intellectual potential of each student but the moral, spiritual, and cultural potential of each as well. What we ask of each family each year to achieve this goal:

- Full Time families (student attends full time) to serve 30 volunteer hours in the school year.
- Part Time families (student attends MWF only) to serve 15 volunteer hours in the school year.
- If you have children in both full and part time classes you will be considered a full- time family.
- **You will be billed in May for the hours not served if any at the rate of \$10.00 per hour.**
- *You are responsible for documenting the hours in the FACTS Portal under the tab – Service Hours. This must be done WITHIN the same month of hours served. If you do not document the hours in the same month you served them you will lose the hours and will be billed as if hours were not worked.*

Dress Code at a Glance

The Dress Code in its entirety is found in your student handbook issued at the start of the school year, please read it through.

Dress Code Winter Option

Boys and Girls Pre-K: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo

Boys K-1: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo, navy blue uniform pants, white or navy socks **Girls K-1:** Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo. Uniform jumper must be at or below the knee. Navy blue uniform pants, white or navy socks.

Girls 2-3: Uniform jumper must be at or below the knee. Navy blue uniform pants, white peter pan collar blouse, navy blue or white tights or socks.

Girls 4-5: Plaid uniform skirt, which must be at or below knee. Navy blue uniform pants; white peter pan collared blouse, navy blue or white tights or socks.

Boys 2-8: Navy blue uniform pants, light blue, oxford shirt, navy blue tie, white or navy socks

Dress Code Summer Option

Boys and Girls Pre-K: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo

Boys K-1: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo, navy blue uniform shorts or pants, white or navy socks

Girls K-1: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo. Uniform jumper must be at or below the knee. Navy blue uniform shorts, white or navy socks

Girls 2-3: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo, navy blue uniform shorts or uniform jumper, white or navy socks

Girls 4-5: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo, navy blue uniform shorts or plaid uniform skirt, white or navy socks

Boys 2-8: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo, navy blue uniform shorts or pants, white or navy socks

Girls 6-8: Polo shirt with Saint Mary's logo, navy blue uniform (from Blake's or Donnelly's) skirt, or navy shorts, white or navy socks

Gym Uniforms:

Winter Option: All students are to wear the navy blue gym shirt and the solid navy blue gym pants, both with logo, (either sweatpants or wind pants no stripes down the leg) and navy blue sweatshirt, which can be purchased from Blakes or Donnelly's Uniforms, white socks, and a good athletic shoe.

Summer Option: All students are to wear the navy blue gym shirt, the navy blue gym shorts, both with the logo, white socks, and a good athletic shoe.

- **ALL GRADES: Polo shirt colors-** light blue, white, yellow and red
- **K-8:** All black sneakers (or with a minimum of gray or white), or black dress shoe with no more than a one-inch heel is required.
- **All students:** hair should be neat with bangs above the eyebrows.
- **Boy's hair:** should be trimmed and neat around the ears, not touching the shirt collar.
- **Girls hair:** neatly kept and if long tied back or up in a secure clip or hair tie.
- School socks may be knee, crew, or ankle lengths. Socks should not include any type logo (brand logo is ok when applicable) or writing, or be trimmed in colors.
- A navy blue sweater/fleece with the SMA logo may also be worn. School sweatshirts may only be worn.
- **Grade 8** will be issued grey fleece to be worn with graduation year embroidered on the sleeve.
- **ALL uniforms** should be clean and pressed with all buttons/zippers attached and hem intact. without holes or stains.
- A good running shoe is required for gym class. Any design or color is fine for gym class as long as they are a running sneaker.
- No artificial nails may be worn.
- No tattoos of any kind including Henna.
- No Hologram contact lenses.
- Unnatural hair coloring is not permitted.
- No body piercing except pierced ears is permitted.
- Girls may wear **one** pair of earrings not larger than a dime and without hoops.
- Boys may not wear earrings of any type.
- Pajama style pants may not be worn at any time.
- Crocs, boots, high heeled shoes, high heeled sneakers are not permitted

St. Mary's Academy Uniform Closet

St. Mary's Academy also has a uniform closet where families donate gently used uniforms that their children have grown out of; including pants, jumpers, tops, and ties. Current St. Mary's families are welcome to come in anytime to see if any of the clothing works for their family. Before and After School Program

St. Mary's Academy offers parents flexibility in their day by offering care for students before and after school. St. Mary's faculty and staff manage the program. Students may attend the program daily, or on an as needed basis. No advance notice is required. Parents can call the day they wish their student to participate. Students can choose to read, study, or play in a safe, supervised environment. When signing up for this program, parents can request that their student begin their homework assignments before participating in other activities.
